Statement of Ian WHITEHOUSE

The area of Soho road, Holyhead Road, Villa road and Rookery road have become priority locations and need a robust policing response on a daily basis. Failure to ensure the locations are effectively patrolled would lead to a significant increase in crime.

I have reviewed all of the crime across the Soho Ward and can confirm that a large number occur around licensed premises. This is often fuelled by alcohol or drugs and is concentrated in and around convenience stores, betting shops, Public Houses and late night refreshment houses. The large number of licensed premises selling cheap alcohol is a draw for those seeking those items, and has the effect of making the area a less desirable place to attend, live and work.

The Soho Ward has been identified as one of the 'priority areas' together with Birmingham City Centre, with crime levels on the Soho/Holyhead Road being generally quite high.

We have sought to address these problems in a number of different ways, and this has been possible by working with our partners. Some examples of partnership activity include the setting up of a streetwatch group that is made up of local residents, and provides weekly patrols in tackling the prostitution, litter and begging issues.

Soho BID are also a key partner and we have been working jointly with them to conduct patrols to try and help tackle the increase in aggressive begging, street drinking and people using mamba and passing out in shop doorways.

The Soho Road Team have also had heavy involvement in licensed premises on the Soho/ Holyhead Road who have been involved in allowing street drinking and drug dealing to take place in and around their premises.

Officers are conducting regular patrols within the Soho/Holyhead Road area, however, I have come to the conclusion that despite the best efforts of West Midlands police and our key partners we are not seeking the reductions in offending we had hoped for.

We are still experiencing a disproportionate amount of crime, ASB, street drinking in the area despite there being a current PSPO in place. With the constraints re Covid 19 also starting to be relaxed we are also now seeing an upsurge in sex workers along Soho Road/Holyhead Road.

We are working with our partners to try and offer diversion and support work around these issues, however having another location in this area selling alcohol will only hinder these activities and help fuel the difficulties the area is suffering from.

As I have already mentioned, there is already a significant amount of licensed premises along the

We would definitely oppose this from a LWW/PB Sector point of view. The rationale behind this would be that we are currently seeing a disproportionate amount of crime, ASB, Begging and Street Drinking in the Soho Road area despite the fact that there is currently a PSPO present at this location. Further to this we are also experiencing an upsurge in Sex Workers along the Hollyhead/Soho Road area. The sale of liquor will only intensify this situation. We are currently working in conjunction with the Soho BID particularly around the rough sleepers/beggers who are drinking and falling asleep in the shop doorways. We are trying to do diversion and support work around these individuals and having a further location selling alcohol will only serve to hinder and prevent these activities.

Dear Colleagues,

Pls can I add an objection to the new licence application for 205 Holyhead Road for an off licence to trade 0700 – 2300.

I echo everything that PS Snyman has said and must add that we are seeing increasing numbers of beggars (who are aggressive) and persons who are drunk, in our area. These numbers appear to be increasing as they appear to be pushed out of the city centre by recent events and have told our officers that it's just as good around Soho Road ie that they can make just as much money and get drink easily here in Soho Road as they can in the City Centre.

Our local Neighbourhood teams are struggling to deal with the demand caused by these greater numbers of beggars and drunken persons and traders and local members of the public have told us that they are afraid to go shopping and that they have never seen "Soho Road so bad." This is terrible to hear as a local police officer but we are simply struggling to deal with more and more beggars, drinkers, especially when they often congregate in big groups or work on what seems to be a shift rota of some coming in to beg, drink, before handing over to others. Indeed, only last week were our teams called out to persons collapsed through drink (two times) and reports from the local BID about aggressive drinking beggars who will actively follow and pester people for money. Coupled with that are reports that some are now also taking the drug "Mamba" which causes further concern for a shopping area based near to residential premises and where women, children, the elderly go to shop locally.

There are already several licensed premises in this area and many street drinkers who congregate around them. A further one selling alcohol from 7am (!) would contribute to these issues.

I hope that this information assists you but should you need anything further, please let me know.
