<p>1069 pupils are in school this week. This is a reduction of 61 pupils due to year 11 leavers and because one school has closed following positive Covid 19 tests across bubbles. This school received immediate support from Public Health and the LA to manage the situation.</p> <p>Return in September:</p> <p>Planning for full return in September is well underway. Representatives from Travel Assist joined the weekly meetings to discuss individual school requirements in detail and focus upon solutions. Follow-up meetings with the SEND links and Travel Assist have been offered to all schools in the last week of the school holiday to ensure plans are up-to-date and robust.</p> <p>Schools are planning a phased approach to pupil return in the first three weeks of the new term, with 98% of schools working to a full return by the end of September. There are plans for class, Key Stage and corridor bubbles with staggered lunch and break times. A small number of schools plan to work as one entire bubble.</p> <p>Some parent/carers are still anxious about their child returning to school in September, especially if their child has complex care needs. In order to develop confidence, schools continue to work with families on individual pupil risk assessments focused on the return to school.</p> <p>Concerns remain around physical space for medical/ nursing teams in schools because of the need for social distancing. LA representatives are meeting urgently with health commissioners and head of special school nursing to find creative solutions.</p>		<p>There was a total of 527 CYP with a EHCP in attendance this week, an increase of 47 pupils from the previous week. Of these, only 4 are red rated; however, the total number of red rated children has reduced this week from 64 to 48.</p> <p>As part of the settings reasonable endeavours settings have differing attendance options/ patterns, staggered start times and virtual support.</p> <p>Settings continue to engage weekly with parents with ongoing support available to those not wishing for their children to return to setting currently.</p> <p>Feedback regarding weekly meetings has been positive as they have allowed for the SENCo and families to gain further understanding and clarity.</p> <p>Individual RA's have been reviewed – of those seen to date the overall quality has been good and feedback provided to setting from link worker which has been welcomed.</p> <p>Return to school in September:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Whilst Some parents have chosen for their children not to return currently, schools have been developing their plans for a full return in September ensuring support is in place for families.</li> <li>Ongoing dialogue in respect of whether some children may still not return in September – feedback indicates some parents may continue to 'shield' due to the children or family member medical needs. One school has reported parents have stated their children will return if it is compulsory</li> <li>There are some concerns with respect to the approach schools will be able to take in supporting those shielding as all staff will have returned to usual timetable</li> <li>Health are providing some advice for LA teams to distribute to schools to support in the return.</li> </ul> <p>School reopening plans include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Whole classes</li> <li>Keeping playtimes and lunchtimes separate</li> <li>Start and end of day staggered</li> <li>All of children have own resources in table trays</li> <li>Any 1:1 and small group interventions to continue within the class bubble</li> <li>No whole school assemblies or singing</li> <li>Some settings are arranging tuition through the government scheme in September.</li> <li>Breakfast club will continue to run for vulnerable children in classroom bubbles.</li> <li>Pastoral support examples; start of every day PHSE lesson for 30 mins for nurture, discussion and class assemblies</li> <li>Transition support; meet your teacher virtually, posting videos on setting websites, setting visits, booklets...</li> <li>Phased transition for reception classes in September</li> </ul>

<p>The total number of CYP attending their setting have decreased as providers close for the summer break. There were 103 in attendance, of which 17 are red rated. There has been a decrease in the overall number of red rated CYP with a EHCP - 53 now identified in comparison to 68 the previous week.</p> <p>There has been ongoing evidence of good practice being adopted. Settings have continued to support families and have been in some instances liaising with other professionals regarding the support offer over the summer break. Some schools have advised they will be continuing door stop visits or inviting CYP into school for end of term events to ensure they have seen CYP's prior to the summer break.</p> <p>Return in September:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Settings are working to ensure a full return in September and will communicate plans with families.</li> <li>Email contact will be made with settings by LA prior to the new academic year to support with problem solving and to ensure maximum number of CYP returning in Sept.</li> <li>Settings are currently developing their timetables, options regarding 'bubbles' and a remote learning offer should this be required.</li> <li>Providers are progressing how to share information and handover files for young people who are leaving settings.</li> <li>Plans are underway for the transition back into settings with a focus on new starters where required.</li> </ul>		<p>A 3 further EHCP's have been finalised this week. There are now 91 children with a EHCP across 67 settings. Of these 67 settings 14 of them are currently closed.</p> <p>42 children with a EHCP were in attendance this week, which 40 based in their usual setting. 2 children have had places brokered for them at different settings. 2 children do not attend a setting and have been at home during their Reception year.</p> <p>The Area SENCO Team have completed 24 risk assessments this week in line with a fortnightly cycle for all children that are rated 'green'.</p> <p>There are still 5 children with an 'amber' rating; the AST and family support workers continue to liaise regarding these. 1 of these children is a reception age child and remains at home. 1 is currently attending a different setting.</p> <p>Where children have settled back into their setting the AST remain in contact with the setting to offer any necessary support.</p> <p>Return in September:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Area SENCO's have been in contact with all settings where children have a final EHCP to discuss their plans for September.</li> <li>Area SENCO's will be contacting all families in the first week of September to establish where the child is attending or plans for when they will be starting at their allocated school.</li> <li>Where children are due to attend a mainstream school in September the AST have supported settings with transition information and liaised with the relevant school-based professionals.</li> <li>Area SENCO's will be running a duty line throughout the summer holidays so that parents are able to contact the team during this time</li> </ul>
