1. Purpose of report:

To consider a representation that has been made in respect of an application for a Premises Licence which seeks to permit the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption both on and off the premises) to operate from 09:00am until 04:00am (Monday to Sunday).

The provision of Regulated Entertainment, which initially consisted of films, indoor sporting events, live music, recorded music, performance of dance, and anything of a similar description, to operate both indoors and outdoors, from 09:00am until 04:00am (Monday to Sunday).

However, after discussions with West Midlands Police the applicant has agreed that Regulated Entertainment to take place indoors only.

To permit the provision of Late Night Refreshment, to operate both indoors and outdoors, from 11:00pm until 04:00am (Monday to Sunday).

Premises to remain open to the public from 09:00am until 04:00am (Monday to Sunday).

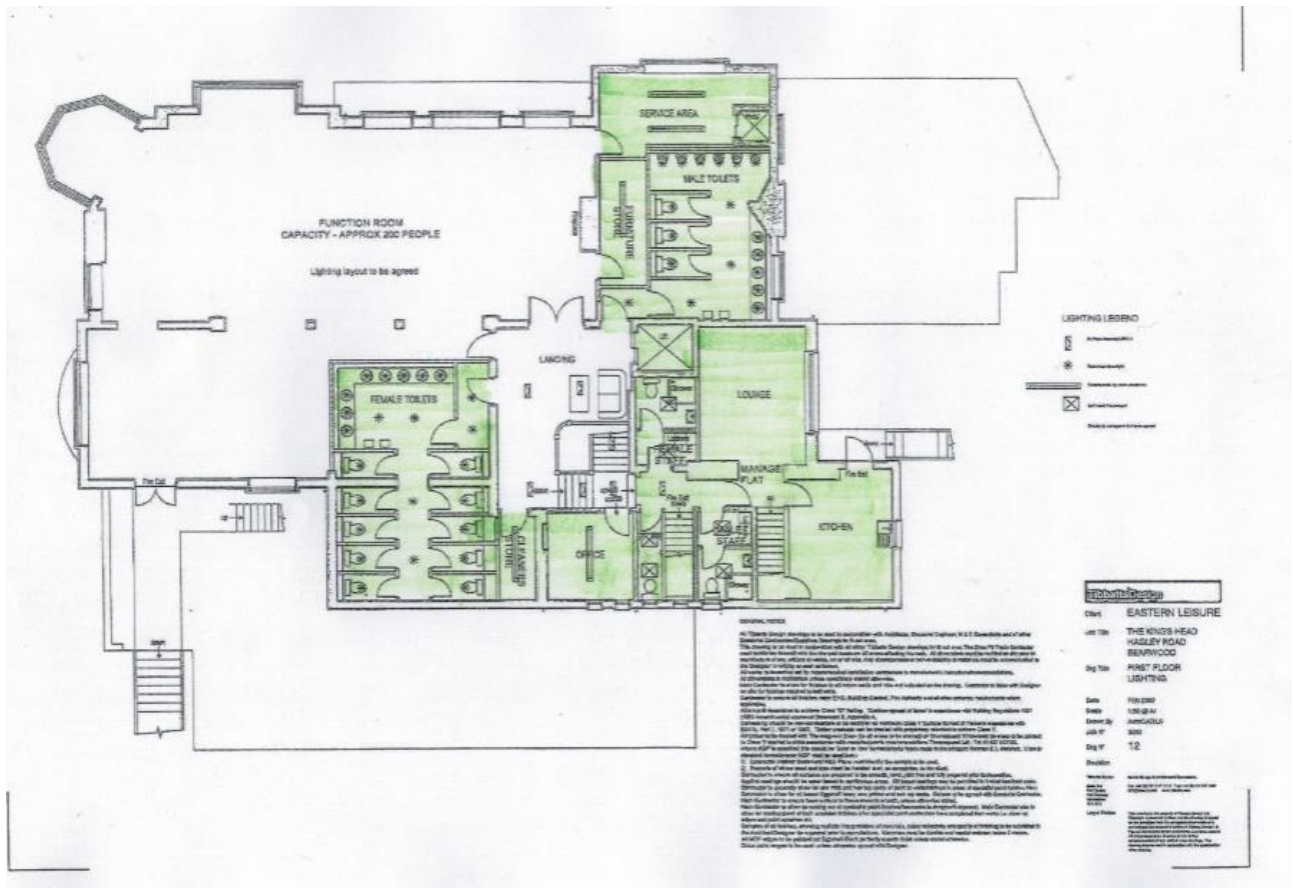
PROPOSED GROUND FLOOR PLAN

1. Staff involved in the sale of alcohol are to be trained under the Licensing Act 2003 prior to being allowed to sell/ supply alcohol. All training is to be documented and signed by the Premises License Holder and the trainee. All training records are to be made available to any of the responsible authorities on request. Staff involved in the sale/ supply of alcohol are to receive documented refresher training every six months.
2. The company will operate the Challenge 25 Policy.
3. Alcohol will not form any part of deliveries made by the premises,
4. Regulated entertainment will take place indoors only. Doors and windows will remain closed whilst regulated entertainment is taking place after 2000 hours except for ingress and egress or cases of emergency.
5. While regulated entertainment is taking place the premises will ensure that regular noise assessments two checks one at 2100 and one at 0100 hours are carried out at the nearest residential property to ensure noise or vibration from the premises does not cause a public nuisance. These checks are to be documented, dated, timed and signed by the person who has made the check. This documentation to be made immediately available to any of the responsible authorities on request and held on the premises for a minimum of 3 months.
6. The volume of all entertainment/music will be controlled by the DPS, premises licence holder or their nominated representative and not the DJ, artist or persons hiring the venue.
7. The premises will risk assess the need for door staff when trading and deploy door staff accordingly. Door staff will sign on and off duty. The premises will keep a profile of all door staff which will include a copy of their SIA licence and photographic ID. (If photographic ID is not available then a utility bill no older than 3 months will be acceptable.) The signing in & out sheets and profiles will be kept on the premises for a minimum of 3 months and made immediately available to any of the responsible authorities on request. Door staff will wear a fluorescent coat, jacket or waistcoat while on duty at the premises. Door staff will remain on duty until all the customers have dispersed and this will form part of the premises dispersal plan. The risk assessment and profiles will be made available to any of the responsible authorities immediately on request.

15. The premises will operate a search policy. This will be made available to any of the responsible authorities on request.
16. The premises will operate a drugs policy. This will be made available to any of the responsible authorities on request.
17. CCTV that is approved by West Midlands police will be fitted in the premises. Images will be retained for a period of at least 31 days and will be made available to any of the responsible authorities to view or copies produced on request. If for any reason the CCTV hard drive needs to be replaced the previous / old hard drive will be kept on site for a minimum of 31 days and made immediately available to any of the responsible authorities on request. The CCTV will be checked to ensure that it is working each day prior to licensable activity taking place. The time of the check, the identity of the person carrying this out and the result of it will be recorded in the incident log.
18. An incident/ refusals log will be maintained at the premises. The DPS or nominated member of management will audit these logs weekly and sign to show this action has been completed. The log will be made immediately available to members of the responsible authorities on request.
