1. Purpose of report:

To consider an application to review a Premises Licence.

Review application received on 23rd March 2020 from the Chief Inspector of Weights & Measures in respect of Brooklyn News, 3 Birdbrook Road, Birmingham, B44 8RA.

A representation has been received from West Midlands Police as a responsible authority.

The Chief Inspector of Weights & Measures applied on 23rd March 2020 for a review of the Premises Licence under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 for Brooklyn News, 3 Birdbrook Road, Birmingham, B44 8RA

A representation has been received from West Midlands Police, as a responsible authority, which is attached at Appendix 1.

West Midlands Police wish to support this application and join in with the review application. The grounds for the review application appear serious in there nature. The sale of alcohol to minors is a serious issue, especially to the health and wellbeing of the child.

There are numerous reports from acclaimed charities and professionals into the effects of alcohol on children. The importance of not selling to underage persons cannot be expressed enough, and there are no excuses for selling to underage persons.

It is noted in this case that the person that conducted the sale was in fact both the DPS and the Premise licence holder. This is especially concerning as being both the DPS and PLH this person has ultimate control over the premises both in terms of the sale of alcohol and how it is run.

The Trading Standards Service conducted an underage test purchase exercise with two female volunteers who were 14 and 15 on Thursday 20 February 2020.

The volunteers went into Brooklyn News at approximately 14.50hrs and the 15-yearold volunteer was sold 2 bottles of 4.0% alcohol; namely blue WKD for £5.98. The sale was observed by Trading Standards Enforcement Officer Dawn BUNSIE.

They were not asked their age or for any identification at all during the sale process.

After the sale was made and the young persons had left the premises Officer BUNSIE and Enforcement Officer Geary WARMINGTON went back into the shop; Officer BUNSIE identified the seller who gave his name as Mr Paramjit SINGH. The officers advised that he had been observed selling alcohol to a person under the age of 18 and that it was an offence under The Licensing Act 2003 and that the facts would be reported.

Mr SINGH was the Premises Licence Holder and the Designated Premises Supervisor.

This was confirmed in written form in a trader notice No. 12287 which Mr SINGH signed and was given a copy.

There had been previous advisory to the Premises by the Trading Standards Service:

- 22 September 2011 Trading Standards carried out a joint advisory visit for alcohol & tobacco with Licensing to the premise.
- 24 May 2013 Trading Standards visited the premise and provided an advisory pack for tobacco and alcohol on age restricted products.

Although there had been no recent complaints the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18 is a serious offence under The Licensing Act 2003. It can have serious consequences when it gets into the hands of young people. It can make them vulnerable and put them in compromising situations as well as causing serious health issues if taken in excess.

There is no excuse at all for making the sale to the volunteer; this was done by Mr Paramjit SINGH.

As the Premises Licence Holder and the Designated Premises Supervisor he should have known better.

The current licence for this premises was a conversion granted on 28 July 2005; therefore, no specific conditions are made in relation to preventing age restricted sales.

Recommendations.

The Premises has previously been advised in the past; albeit a while ago. However, the person in charge and who made the sale was the person who received that advice. There is a greater responsibility on the Premises Licence Holder/Designated Premises Supervisor to comply with the law.

I would ask that the Committee consider all outcomes at their disposal; this could include more robust conditions as currently there are none other than the mandatory conditions that exist. These could include reference to a Challenge 25 proof of age scheme, Staff Training and record keeping, the use of a refusals register and CCTV.

Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours. In this condition, permitted hours means: a. On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, 8 am. to 11 pm. b. On Sundays, other than Christmas Day, 10 am. to 10.30 pm. c. On Christmas Day, 12 noon to 3 pm. and 7 pm. to 10.30 pm. d. On Good Friday, 8 am. to 10.30 p.m. The above restrictions do not prohibit: (a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises, unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel; (b) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered; (c) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club; (d) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces.

Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises.
