1. Purpose of report:

To consider relevant representations that have been made in respect of an application to vary the Premises Licence which seeks to extend the hours for the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption both on and off the premises), to operate from 9:00am until 11:00pm (Sunday to Thursday), and 9:00am until 12:00midnight (Friday and Saturday).

The provision of Regulated Entertainment consisting recorded music, to operate indoors only, from 9:00am until 11:00pm (Sunday to Thursday), and 9:00am until 12:00midnight (Friday and Saturday).

To permit the provision of Late Night Refreshment, to operate indoors only, from 11:00pm until 12:00midnight (Friday and Saturday).

Premises to remain open to the public from 9:00am until 11:00pm (Sunday to Thursday), and 9:00am until 12:00midnight (Friday and Saturday).

The application also seeks to remove the first 2 mandatory conditions on the current premises licence and to change the internal layout of the premises. An updated plan is attached to this report at Appendix 7.

Variation application received on 17th July 2020 in respect of Hardy's at 50, 50 Dads Lane, Moseley, Birmingham, B13 8PQ.

Variation to the licensing activities

Dear Sir / Madam

My wife and I have been informed that the above has made an application for a **proposed** variation to the licensing activities.

We object to these changes and we wish to make representation on this matter by giving you notice, in writing, stating the nature and grounds for making such representations.

You may wish to link this objection to our objections to a change of use application namely **Planning Application 2019/090209 PA, 50 Dads Lane, Moseley, B13 8PQ.** That objection was made as far back as December 2019 and we have been in communication with Mr James Nerd, Case officer for that application.

We are still awaiting confirmation from Mr Nerd on the outcome of that application but we have our suspicions that planning application has already been granted. If that is so why were we, not informed?

We gather there are 7 proposed **variations to the licensing activities** and we wish to register our objections to all of them, particularly 2,3,4,5,6 and 7.

Variation number 2.

As practising Christians we **strongly object** to removing any seasonal restrictions for **Christmas Day** and **Good Friday. Precisely what are those restrictions?**

Variation Number 3.

We strongly object to to the **Sunday** – **Thursday** late open hour of **23:00 hrs.** on the grounds of intrusive noise. Apart from some road traffic, evenings here after 9:0 pm, particularly Sunday evenings, are serene and quiet and we **DO NOT** want that serenity disturbed.

Variation Number 4.

We object even stronger to the **Friday and Saturday** extension from 23:00 - 24:00 on the grounds of even more intrusive noise. Other than some road traffic, the noise levels here in the evenings are very low indeed. We **DO NOT** want that noise level increased.

We already suffer some intrusive noise from **The Highbury Inn** 100 yards away and we **DO NOT** want any increase in noise levels on our doorstep.

Variation Number 5.

What are the two mandatory conditions on the premises licence?

Variation Number 6.

We object strongly to the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises. And as regards (alcohol sales for consumption **OFF** the premises already in force) might I point out that, as far as we are aware, the consumption of alcohol in the streets is **NOT** permitted.

Variation Number 7.

Just what are the changes to the internal layout which 'update' the plan - what plan - attached to the premises licence?

We, along with many of our neighbours **OBJECT STRONGLY** to **ALL** these proposals **PARTICULARLY** with regards to **FRIDAY AND SATURDAY LATE OPENING HOURS.**

There is a large pub, **The Highbury Inn**, which serves hot foods and drinks, just 100 yards down Dads Lane and we **OBJECT STRONGLY** to yet another alcohol and eatery, with the inevitable increase in noise from car doors slamming and noisy revellers **JUST DOORS** away from us.

More importantly there are flats above and around 50 Dads Lane where very young children live. My immediate next door neighbour has a child 6 months old; there is another young child in the flat above Dads Lane and another child in the flat above Dads Lane. We are all deeply concerned that evening sleep times will be disturbed by noisy revellers.

Subject: Application to vary a premises Licence at 50 Dads Lane, B13 8PQ

As Chair of Moor Green Residents Association (West) I am responding to a notice that has been affixed to a telegraph pole outside the premises at 50 Dad's Lane. Please advise me of the outcome via email.

Moor Green Residents Association (West) notes that the planning application for this premises 2019/09209/PA for 'Change of use from retail (Use Class A1) to mixed use retail and drinking establishment (Use Class A1/ A4)' is still not decided. The comments below therefore relate to both the planning aspects and the licensing aspects.

- 1. There is no need for an off licence given that the Co-op already sells alcohol...as does the Highbury. This premises used to be an off licence and closed due to lack of sales; this was before the Coop began selling alcohol suggesting poor sales could still be an issue.
- 2. There are no details about the design of the proposed frontage or signage. We would expect this to form part of the planning application.
- 3. Parking in the area will be greatly affected. It is already difficult to park by the shops and this will be exacerbated by customers staying for drinks. Safety of those using any outside tables would need to be considered as cars currently park on the forecourt. Having outside tables will reduce the number of off road parking slots available but could also greatly enhance the look of the area.
- 4. We would request that suitable facilities for locking bikes were included so as to encourage the use of travel to this premises other than by car.
- 5. Deliveries to the premises could be difficult due to the current parking arrangements. It is important that deliveries do not impede the traffic flow.
- 6. Concerns were expressed regarding late night noise especially if customers are seated outside or music is to be permitted. There are residential flats above the shops which would be in very close proximity to the proposed development.
- 7. Litter is already a significant problem in this area and the frontage of all the shops is very untidy. The paved and tarmac surfaces are dangerous in parts (one resident was badly injured from a fall). We would hope that repaving the area and planters might be included. Potentially the change of use could lead to a smartening up of the parade but great vigilance would be required to ensure hours were adhered to and antisocial behaviour prevented.
- 8. We would request a bin store so that residents from the flats could have proper bins rather than having to leave black bags on the forecourt. This would improve the area of the proposed out door seating.
- 9. Residents would like the parade to be improved but are concerned that a wine bar does not fit in with the character of this particular site. There is a greater need for another local shop e.g. a chemist or a cafe.

Dear Sir/Madam

We are making representations in response to licensing application reference **115846** (50 Dads Lane). We object to the application on the following grounds:

1. We consider the application doesn't meet the objective of 'The prevention of crime and disorder'. This is because of the proposed hours of opening and the proposed hours to sell alcohol on and off the premises. The proposal is for the premises to be open and to sell alcohol between 9am – 11pm Sunday – Thursday, and 9am – 12am Friday – Saturday. This premises is located on a very small row of shops in the heart of a residential area primarily occupied by families and elderly people, it is directly opposite a row of homes. The Co-op shop next door closes at 10pm, the area after this time is quiet, apart from the occasional car driving down the road and very little footfall.

We are concerned about the proposed late opening hours (until 11pm Sunday – Thursday and until 12am Friday & Saturday) as we believe it will cause suffering and annoyance to the community due to noise nuisance. What is currently a peaceful residential area after 10pm will experience new regular disturbances from clientele leaving the premises. It is inevitable that customers will leave talking loudly, cars and taxis parked outside of homes will leave their engine running whilst waiting for passengers, cars may pull up playing loud music, doors will be slammed and customers who are inebriated will leave shouting and laughing, or potentially having altercations. We are concerned that it is highly likely customers will leave the premises displaying rowdy behaviour, with little consideration of the community residing in their homes nearby. We consider that the proposed notices requesting clientele to be quiet as they leave will be ineffective and unenforceable.

The impacts of the noise from customers and cars/ taxis will have a significant impact on local residents' quality of life, and effect the wellbeing of the community. Experiences these types of issues every night of the week will have extremely negative effects in the long term, affecting individual wellbeing and mental health.

2. We consider the application doesn't meet the objective for 'The Prevention of public nuisance'. As mentioned above we are concerned about the proposal for the premises to be open after 10pm, we note they have applied for a licence for recorded music between the hours of 10pm – 11pm Sunday –Thursday, and 10pm – 12am Friday & Saturday. Even if the owners/ managers of the premises ask clientele to be considerate of the local residents when entering and leaving the premises, due to the low levels of noise in this residential area after 10pm local residents will likely experience noise disturbances from the music playing in the shop / bar.

We are also concerned about the mess and rubbish that will be caused by these proposals, we already experience high levels of litter on the road and our drive caused by customers of the Coop, we haven't seen any evidence of how this premises intend to ensure their customers do not litter in the same way. We would be particularly concerned about customers leaving empty bottles lying around.

3. Finally we consider that this application does not meet the objective of 'child protection'. The reason for this is that, as previously mentioned, this premises is directly adjacent to the local Co-op. This Co-op shop is effectively the areas local corner shop, children from the local community will regularly pop to the shop on their own, potentially unsupervised. At the moment the only other shops next to the Co-op are a hairdressers and pet grooming shop, these do not pose a threat to the wellbeing and safety of young people / children.

However, we believe that having a premises that is selling alcohol for consumption on the premises with clientele drinking and smoking in a seated area outside the front of it will cause risks to child protection. For examples young teenagers may attempt to buy and consume alcohol and then become vulnerable because their judgement is impaired. This could put them in danger from getting involved in fights, from drink driving or from sexual harm. If customers are smoking and drinking outside of the shop / bar children from the local area are more likely to be exposed to the effects of a smoking environment and so are at risk of serious harm to their health. No one will always be supervising children visiting the Co-op who may be outside when adults temporarily exit the premises to smoke; this is particularly relevant at the moment whilst we are required to queue until it is safe to enter shops and so children are more likely to be waiting outside.

In regards to the above matters we would welcome someone to visit the area after 10pm to see how quiet it is, and to visit during the daytime to see the current levels of litter we deal with and the local community, including children, visiting their local Coop.



- There will no food or drink allowed in the outside area from 21.30hrs Sunday & Thursday and 22.00hrs Friday & Saturday.
- CCTV will display the correct time and date stamp.
- Any off sales for consumption outside the licensable area shown on the premises plan will be sold in sealed containers only.
- The Refusals & Incident Logs will be sign off weekly by the premises licence holder or their nominated person.
- A copy of the training records regarding the staff responsibility around the licensing act will be kept on site. All staff, with the exception of personal licence holders, will have this documented training prior to their first shift on duty while the premises is carrying out licensable activity.
- No children under the age of 18 allowed on the premises without a responsible adult.
- Challenge 25 signage will be display prominently on the entrance door and bar service area.
- The premises will risk assess the need to deploy door staff on an on-going basis.
- If door staff are deployed at the premises then they will sign on and off duty. The premises will keep a profile of all door staff which will include a copy of their SIA badge and photographic ID. If photographic ID in not available then a utility bill no less than 3 months old will be acceptable. This profile will be kept for 3 months and made available to any of the responsible authorities on request.
- If the premises is hired out in its entirety by a third party or an outside promoter is used then the premises will notify West Midlands Police central licensing team, by email, a minimum of 21 days prior to the event. This notification will be supplied with a full written risk assessment for that event. The risk assessment is to be agreed with West Midlands Police central licensing team who will retain the power of veto over that event if they believe and of the licensing objectives will compromised.
