1. Purpose:

1.1 The report updates the group on the work of Environmental Health to try and control the spread of coronavirus and to encourage others to comply with national advice.

2. Recommendation

2.1 That the report be noted.

3. Report Body

- 3.1 The appendix to this report is an update on the enforcement activity undertaken by Environmental Health.
- 3.2 Environmental Health continues to work with West Midlands Police both in joint visits and separately to increase coverage and efficiency of the enforcement work. In general, the Police powers tackle the individual whereas the Council powers tackle the business and or the business operator.
- 3.3 Since the last report at the beginning of October the Police and the Council have been advised that Government will fund increased enforcement activity. The Police have now got a budget to sustain Operation Reliant patrols and the Council is proposing to employ Covid Wardens and more enforcement officers funded from the Local Authority Compliance and Enforcement Grant. Nationally there is £30m set aside and Birmingham City Council can draw down on £889k in next 4 months.
- 3.4 The following is the total actions
 - 1 unlicensed premises has been closed due to operating in the early hours with 37 people in it.
 - 2 statements were compiled supporting the expedited reviews of for 2 licensing premises by the Police.

- 3x £1,000 FPNs have been issued to business operators trading after 10pm found during operation reliant visits (Police).
- 126 inspections were carried out requiring steps to be taken to meet legislative requirements or national advice. This also includes checks on risk assessments and identifying weaknesses and recommending improvements.
- 161 visits and phone calls were made giving advice and helping people to be covid compliant.
- We have monitored and advised on 65 outbreaks but due to good compliance with mitigating steps, have not been required to use enforcement powers.


Dashboard of Complaints from the whistleblowing Line 16/10/20


