XXII COMMONWEALTH GAMES



- A secure site with limited access to non Games related visitors
- Residential accommodation for around 6500 athletes and officials during the period of the Games
- Provision for a number of temporary facilities required in Games-time including; a dining hall, transport mall, medical and storage space, social and leisure facilities, retail spaces, ceremonial space, and operational/back of house facilities
- Handed over to the Organising Committee in early 2022
- Significant Capital Project... Usually with a 7 year lead-in time


Athletes' Village

To create an exemplar residential neighbourhood which offers a high quality living environment for all ages, which is vibrant, well connected, sustainable and encourages health and well-being.

Our Vision

- Phase 1 (Athletes' Village) c1400 New Homes across a mixture of tenures
- Phase 2 up to 500 further homes
- Infrastructure works and transport connectivity to facilitate the delivery of a further c3000 homes in nearby locations and along A34 corridor
- Contributes towards the projected growth within the city of 156,000 people by 2031
- Aspiration to deliver around 10% of the 51,500 homes identified in the Birmingham Development Plan as a direct impact of the Games

The Village: Legacy




- An area of growth identified in the Birmingham Development Plan
- Part of an aspiration to create up to
 5000 new homes in this part of the city
- Opportunity to create a legacy neighbourhood
- Significant investment into transport infrastructure and connectivity proposed already proposed, some of which will be accelerated to help deliver the Games and will provide a sustainable legacy




Perry Barr: Existing Context




Athletes' Village: In Games Time




- Mixed Tenure Residential Scheme

Athletes' Village (Games Mode)

- Continues key principles from phase 1
- Connectivity between the site
- Continuation of Green
 Spaces
- Retaining Doug Ellis Sports Facilities
- Incorporates new school proposed to open in 2021
- Provides a framework within which to deliver the 'Games Time Village'



Phase 2: Masterplan

- Further homes, building on from phase 1
- Headline proposals for 400-500 Homes
- Predominantly 3,4 and 5 Bed Houses
- Key walking, and cycling routes into and around the site – including to the school
- Planning application submitted



Phase 2: Beyond the Games

In Summary

Key Inputs

- Significant investment into the Perry Barr area, c£0.5bn - including funding secured from Government
- An experienced internal and external delivery team driving the project forward including – main contractor and sub contractors
- Support from key stakeholders including, Government, WMCA, TFWM, Homes England and the Commonwealth Games Federation

Key Outputs

- An exemplar residential scheme with excellent connectivity
- Will be used as the Athletes' Village during 2022
- Over 5000 New Homes delivered by 2031
- Will see over 100 apprenticeship opportunities created
- More than 3,000 jobs on site during the construction of the Village
- Commercial units on site creating up to 400 jobs in legacy
- Will provide a legacy Village for Perry Barr and Birmingham to be proud of
