1 Summary

- 1.1 In July 2020 the Department for Transport published their long-awaited Statutory Taxi and Private Hire Vehicle Standards document.
- 1.2 The statutory guidance was issued by the Secretary of State for Transport under powers conferred by the Policing and Crime Act 2017.
- 1.3 The guidance seeks to provide common core minimum standards to better regulate the taxi and private hire sector.
- 1.4 This report provides an update on the current position in Birmingham City Council, as well as any remaining actions required in order to bring us into alignment with the statutory guidance, specifically, the delegation of urgent matters of public safety.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 The report be noted.
- 2.2 The proposal in Paragraph 7.8 to delegate consideration of immediate suspension or revocation of licences in the interests of public safety be agreed to ensure compliance with paragraph 5.11 of the Statutory Guidance.
- 2.3 In accordance with Paragraph 1.3 of the Statutory Guidance, should the proposal in Paragraph 7.8 not be agreed, a compelling reason must be recorded by committee.

3. Background

- 3.1 The legislation providing for the licensing of the hackney carriage and private hire trade is very old, including the Town Police Clauses Act 1874 and Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976.
- 3.2 At the time the legislation was drafted, things were very different, not just in the world of passenger transport. One Act was passed before the introduction of the internet, and one before the introduction of mains electricity or the motor car.
- 3.3 The antiquated legislation, coupled with the variety of local policies and conditions introduced across the country has led to inconsistency of approach which, in turn, led to an exploitation of loopholes or weaknesses in the system. It is this inconsistency the Department for Transport have sought to address in their guidance.
- 3.4 There have been many calls for root and branch review of the legislation, the most recent of which resulted in a commitment from Government to produce this guidance document. Save for the Deregulation Act 2015, which legalised the practice of 'cross border' hire, the legislation itself remains essentially unchanged since its enactment,

4. The Guidance

- 4.1 The Guidance sets out certain standards which Licensing Authorities are expected to comply with. These standards have been drawn up as a result of discussions with the trade, regulators and safety campaign groups. They focus on protecting children and vulnerable adults.
- 4.2 Paragraph 1.3 of the document clearly states: **"The Department...expects these recommendations to be implemented unless there is a compelling reason not to do so."** (emphasis added)
- 4.3 Compelling Reason?
An example of a compelling reason not to comply with the recommendations would be if existing requirements are more stringent than those in the guidance. We would not be expected to lower our standards to achieve compliance.

5. Implementation of the Guidance

- 5.1 In 2020 a report was brought to your committee explaining the detail of this Statutory Guidance, and setting out those areas which already met the requirements and those which required change.

5.2 Some proposals did require a change in policy. In fact, one of the main recommendations was the implementation of a standalone policy document which can be subject to regular review. Some required a change in internal processes within the licensing service and others will require an amendment to licence conditions.

5.3 Appendix 1 demonstrates the progress which has been made since the introduction of the Guidance and sets out the work which is still ongoing.

6. The Policy

6.1 The Policies Procedures and Delegations Report is usually presented annually to the Licensing and Public Protection Committee which includes all of the Licensing Policies.

6.2 The new separate policy document gives greater detail of the processes and procedures applicable to Hackney Carriage and Private Hire licensing, in a much more accessible and user-friendly format.

6.3 The Guidance introduces the need for vehicle proprietors and operators to provide basic criminal records disclosures regularly (unless they are also licensed drivers, in which case the enhanced check will suffice).

6.4 The Policy was approved by City Council in April 2023.

7 Ongoing work

7.1 Some of the actions outlined in Appendix 1 are awaiting the completion of the new licensing software system. The full integration of the online system will enable the final changes to be included within the application process.

7.2 Progress with the full initialisation of the licensing system was significantly hampered by the COVID-19 pandemic crisis which impacted on all aspects of development, including process mapping, design and training aspects. The teams had to prioritise continuing to deliver the licensing service using the old systems which were not designed for remote applications as the new system was yet to be finished. There have also been ongoing issues with the finance integration aspects.

7.3 Immediate Action in the interests of Public Safety.
Section 52 of the Road Safety Act empowers a licensing authority to suspend or revoke a hackney carriage or private hire driver's licence with immediate effect – meaning that the suspension or revocation takes effect immediately once notice of the authority's decision has been given to the driver – where this decision is considered necessary in the interests of public safety.

- 7.4 Unlike other decisions to suspend or revoke, which are deferred for the duration of any appeal period, or until such appeal is finalised, decisions made in this way are immediate, and continue to apply even if the subject should appeal. These decisions can only be made where it is believed, on the balance of probability, that allowing the driver to continue to be licensed would present an immediate risk to the public. There is no requirement for the subject to have been charged with a criminal offence, nor for any arrest to have been made. The power is not used lightly, and any determinations made are in accordance with the relevant legislation, policies and statutory guidance.
- 7.5 Paragraph 5.11 of the Statutory Guidance states:
“All licensing authorities should consider arrangements for dealing with serious matters that may require the immediate revocation of a licence. It is recommended that this role is delegated to a senior officer/manager with responsibility for the licensing service”.
- 7.6 Where information is received which calls into question the fitness of a driver to such an extent that they are believed to present an immediate risk to the public, officers currently contact the Chair of Licensing and Public Protection for a determination as to whether the circumstances would warrant the immediate suspension or revocation of the driver’s licence.
- 7.7 Since January 2022 there have been fewer than ten drivers dealt with in this way for matters such as drink driving, drug offences, sexual assault, child sexual offences and actual bodily harm. These matters are reported routinely to your Committee.
- 7.8 In order to achieve compliance with the Guidance, your Committee is asked to consider the proposal that matters of this nature be delegated to Officers at the level of Principal Licensing Officer or above. Principal Licensing Officers already have this power delegated to them in relation to drivers who are medically unfit.
- 7.9 In the current process, where information of serious concern is identified/received, the Principal Officer and/or Licensing Manager will then contact the Chair of Licensing with the information, to request a decision.
- 7.10 This proposal would not only achieve compliance with the Statutory Guidance but would also bring these matters in line with the other determinations of immediate fitness to hold a licence and enable such decisions to be taken by more people; providing appropriate cover for periods of leave, absence or outside of office hours where required. Any decisions of this nature would still be reported to your Committee in accordance with the existing process.

8 Remaining concerns

8.1 Whilst the DfT Guidance does contain some welcome clarity on dealing with licence applications for drivers, vehicle proprietors and operators, there are still some disappointing omissions in the document. These remain unchanged since the guidance was first published,

8.2 Vehicle standards

Contrary to what the title would suggest, there are no standards within the guidance which relate to the actual vehicles. No mention of emissions standards, age policies or signage.

8.3 These issues are amongst the most contentious of all in terms of local variances in standards.

8.4 Vehicle Standards are to be addressed in the revised DfT Best Practice Guidance. This is still awaiting publication.

9. Consultation

9.1 This report is essentially a position statement comparing the current policies and processes against the requirements of the statutory guidance.

10. Implications for Resources

10.1 This report is for noting, there is no financial decision or implication as a result of the report recommendation. Following issuance of a S114 notice the Council is prevented, without explicit agreement of the Section 151 Officer, from entering into any new agreement or commitment for expenditure at this stage. All future expenditure decisions must follow the spend control process as per S114 arrangements.

10.2 The cost of administering the licensing service is recovered in full, from licence fees.

11. Implications for Policy Priorities

11.1 The issues addressed in this report relate to the City Council priorities associated with creating a cleaner, greener and safer city and providing excellent services.

12. Public Sector Equality Duty

12.1 Under the Duty we must have regard to the need to:

- Eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment, and victimisation and other conduct prohibited by the Act.
- Advance equality of opportunity between people who share a protected characteristic and those who do not.
- Foster good relations between people who share a protected characteristic and those who do not.

12.2 The recommendations contained in this report will not have any effect on any of our duties under the Equality Act 2010. Any future changes to policy as a result of this report will be subject to separate consideration of this duty.

12.3 For the reasons set out in paragraph 12.2, it is considered an initial Equality Analysis is not deemed appropriate or necessary.

**UPDATE REPORT ON THE PRIVATE SECTOR HIGH-RISE
CLADDING PROJECT WORK**

1 Summary

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to update the Committee on progress of the Council's response to the remediation of private sector high-rise buildings.
- 1.2 The report provides background on the work achieved to date, and the plans for the project moving forward, including the new responsibilities for medium rise buildings.

3 Background

- 3.1 Birmingham City Council (BCC) have been collating data on fire risk within private sector high rise properties in Birmingham since 2018. This original data collection was at the request of the Department of Levelling Up, Housing and Communities (DLUHC) following the tragic fire at Grenfell Tower in London in 2017.
- 3.2 The responsibility for this work was then passed to Private Rented Services (PRS) in April 2022 as part of internal restructuring and the use of enforcement powers under the Housing Act 2004, with other legislation falling to West Midlands Fire Service (WMFS), The Health & Safety Executive, and the new Building Safety Regulator (BSR).
- 3.3 There are relevant powers, including powers of entry, to inspect individual premises under the Housing Act 2004 and at the end of November 2018 the government issued an addendum to the operating guidance to the Housing, Health and Safety Ratings System to provide more specific advice relating to cladding. Under section 9(2) of the Housing Act 2004, a local housing authority must have regard to any guidance.
- 3.4 Officers from the authority initially met with DLUHC in April 2022 where it was clarified that the City Operation's Private Rented Sector Team's Environmental Health Officers (EHOs) have enforcement powers relating to hazards (including external cladding) in such accommodation. Whilst we had not previously used our powers under the Housing Act 2004 for the purpose of inspection or enforcement in this area of work, we have subsequently developed a plan to address this issue.
- 3.5 Birmingham city has a proportionate number of high-rise buildings that require remediation for the size of the city. Owners and duty holders of these high-rise buildings are being encouraged to access [Building Safety Funding \(BSF\)](#) to help fund cladding remediation to meet new building safety standards. If remediation works are delayed, PRS and the West Midlands Fire Service (WMFS) are working together to bring responsible persons to account, including the use of appropriate enforcement powers if necessary. In the meantime, WMFS are continuing to liaise with managing agents to implement new interim measures, to ensure occupants can escape safely, until all buildings are fully remediated.

4 Progress to date

- 4.1 The PRS team has been working on its list of "identified at risk" buildings and has continued to engage with who it believes to be the relevant contacts for the companies holding the freehold interest in those buildings.

- 4.2 Inspections to assess cladding have been completed and all Aluminium Composite Cladding (ACM) and/or High-Pressure Laminate (HPL) buildings over 18m have been identified, and DLUHC notified. There are 14 “higher priority” buildings on the list and a further estimated 65 that may require intervention to ensure compliance.
- 4.3 Desktop intelligence gathering and initial requests for information to confirm remediation were made to the responsible persons of these companies in July 2022 and were followed up at the start of February 2023. In March 2023 the list was cross referenced with information held by other partners (West Midlands Fire Service, DLUHC and Homes England), and in advance of the commencement of an inspection programme.
- 4.4 The PRS team has been supported by the Joint Inspection Team (JIT) hosted by the Local Government Association. The JIT’s role has been to support PRS by providing specialist expertise and legal advice on inspecting and enforcing fire safety in high rise buildings. The JIT consists of 3 EHO’s who specialise in fire safety, a Building Surveyor and Fire Engineer.
- 4.5 The first block to be inspected by the JIT and PRS was located in the city centre and was carried out on 13 and 14 June 2023. This building comprises of 3 interconnected blocks, the residential parts of which were considered and assessed as one building, with a total of just under 400 residential apartments. This block was chosen due to the size and complexity of the building and the presence of ACM above the tenth floor, this allowed greater learning and use of the JITs expertise, benefitting our future work.
- 4.6 The JIT and PRS carried out an external examination of the cladding systems and panels, an assessment of all of the communal spaces, the configuration of the buildings and accessed approximately 10% of the apartments across the 3 interlinked blocks.
- 4.7 The JIT provided a comprehensive report in July with recommendations which are being followed up with the appropriate parties. Further discussions remain ongoing with WMFS with regards to ensuring compliance where they are identified as the lead authority, and PRS are the lead authority for following up actions to ensure compliance where we have the appropriate powers and jurisdiction.
- 4.8 As a result officers served a comprehensive Section 12 Improvement Notice under Part 1 of the Housing Act 2004 scheduling 30 Category 2 Hazards to be remedied between 3 October 2023 and 3 April 2024 on the freehold owners and managers. All the affected residents received copies of the notice and contact information for enquires. PRS will continue to work with the building’s owners and managers and will monitor the situation for compliance.

5 Future planning

- 5.1 The Council continues to work with DLUHC with progress updates through monthly reporting on the DELTA portal.
- 5.2 We have agreed to develop a regional Working Party Group (replicating best practice set up across the London Boroughs) that will aim to meet quarterly to progress issues, share intelligence and adopt best practice. This will help all agencies to develop its response to the remediation of private residential high-rise buildings and avoid overlap and supplication of resources across other statutory services.
- 5.3 The next inspection with the JIT has been set for 10 and 11 October 2023 and we are working with partners to determine which property to inspect based on intelligence, progress to date and identified risk.
- 5.4 PRS are in the process of recruiting a Compliance Officer and an Environmental Health Officer (Fire Safety) to carry out its inspections without the support of the JIT going forwards. Our intention is that the team is in place by mid-September and that inspections of the 14 highest priority building are completed by the end of March 2024.

6. Consultation

- 6.1 No public consultation has taken place, as this is an information report.

7. Implications for Resources

- 7.1 This report is for noting, there is no financial decision or implication as a result of the report recommendation. Following issuance of a S114 notice the Council is prevented, without explicit agreement of the Section 151 Officer, from entering into any new agreement or commitment for expenditure at this stage. All future expenditure decisions must follow the spend control process as per S114 arrangements.
- 7.2 DLUHC has provided funding to Birmingham City Council of £93,978 for 2022/23 (notified December 2022) and £235,246 for 2023/24. In addition, the PRS team holds a budget of £60,000 for a dedicated specialist EHO to support this work. The intention is that these resources will support the authority to set up a specific project team to enable compliance and enforcement in 2023/24, subject to the Section 114 spend control arrangements. Full details will be agreed following discussions with other partners around roles and responsibilities for Fire Risk Assessment and Building Control roles. Funding for this work has been secured up to March 2024.

8. Implications for Policy Priorities

- 8.1 This project aligns with The City Council's priority, 'A Bold Safe Birmingham' with specific focus on the availability of safe housing in the city. The PRS team will develop a medium to long term plan for the inspection and remediation of all 18m PHR buildings across the city. In addition, DLUHC and the BSR have advised of further duties to be placed on local housing authorities for the remediation of medium rise buildings (11m-18m in height), this duty is expected from April 2024.

8. Public Sector Equality Duty

- 8.1 Equality issues are accounted for during housing inspection activities carried out by officers.

UPDATE REPORT ON UNAUTHORISED ENCAMPMENTS

1. Summary
 - 1.1 This report provides Committee with an update on work being undertaken to further manage unauthorised encampments in the city since the last report on the 28 June 2023.
2. Recommendations
 - 2.1 That the report is noted.

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3. Background

- 3.1 This report is an update on activities since the last report to your Committee on 28 June 2023.
- 3.2 An unauthorised encampment is one which is established on land without the express permission of the landowner. The groups responsible generally comprise elements of Gypsy, Romany, Traveller or other ethnic groupings and are collectively known colloquially as “travellers” or more correctly GRT.
- 3.3 The strategy employed by the City Council to manage unauthorised encampments is contained within a Memorandum of Understanding between the City Council and West Midlands Police (WMP) and is entitled a “Joint Protocol on the Management of Unauthorised Encampments” and is currently at edition 9 dated March 2020. This edition incorporates the presence of the transit sites.
- 3.4 A transit site is an authorised site where members of the travelling community can be directed when in the city area. A transit site typically provides a hard standing for holding caravans, a secure boundary and basic sanitary provision including potable water, often at a communal level. Most sites will have some measure of lighting and some will have provision for electricity.
- 3.5 Birmingham City Council presently has one functional site at Proctor Street (currently closed for repairs) affording space for 15 caravans, planning consent granted for a second site at Aston Brook Street East affording space for 4 caravans, and a further site at Tameside Drive which has space for around 11 caravans.
- 3.6 It has been clarified that the identification and approval for the allocation of transit sites lies with colleagues within Planning Policy. The details of the GRT need for both settled and transit site provision is contained within the Birmingham Development Plan and the GRT needs assessment within that. The operational provision of site(s) and the day-to-day services/operations is a housing function and is to be delivered by the Housing Department. This will leave your officers from with Environmental Health to focus on recovery of land.

4. Site Provision Update

- 4.1. As previously stated, colleagues in Planning are working on delivering the outputs specified in the most recent Gypsy and Traveller Accommodation Assessment (GTAA) from February 2019 which sought to identify need for the community in terms of permanent and transit pitch provision.
- 4.2. The existing GTAA (2019) identified the need for 19 additional permanent pitches up to 2033 with the spread by year show in the table below.

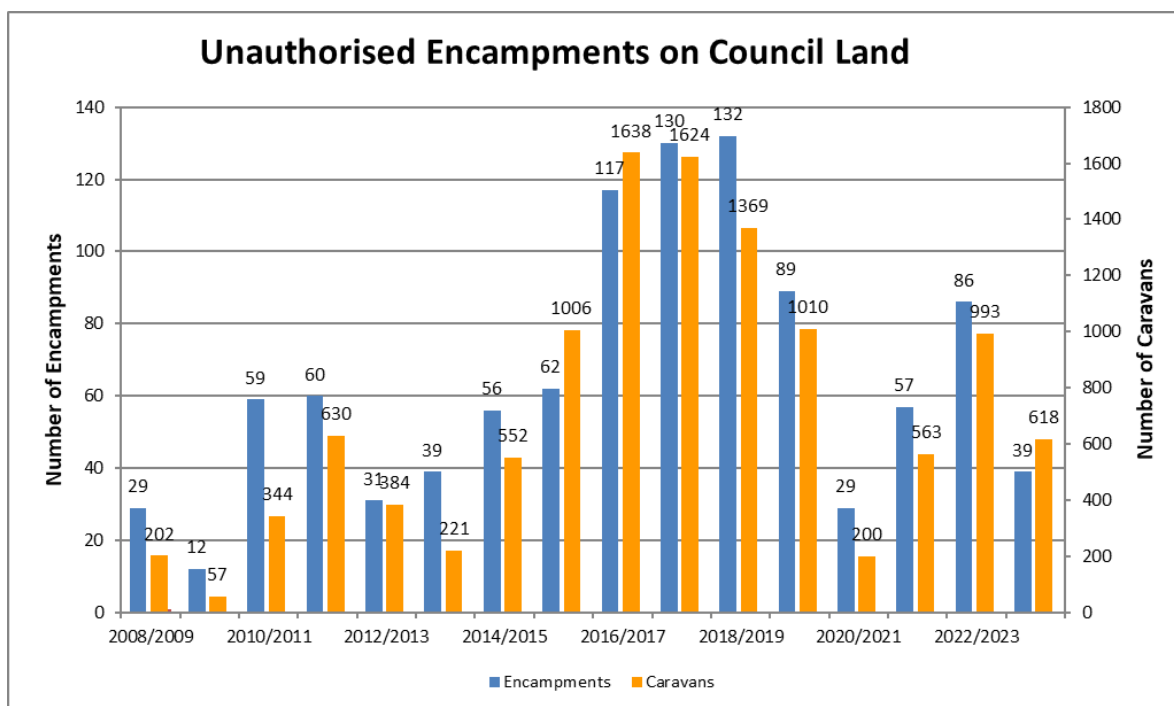
- 4.3. With regards to transit pitches the GTAA identified that the proposed provision of sites (Proctor Street, Aston Brook Street and Tameside Drive) “should be sufficient to either deal with smaller groups of Travellers stopping off in Birmingham or as a means of requiring households to leave Birmingham.” Furthermore, the GTAA recommended that for larger groups that “the Council consider establishing a larger overspill transit site(s)” that can be used in a similar vein to the smaller sites for smaller groups.
- 4.4. A coordinated site search is continuing as part of the new Local Plan for Birmingham to identify and allocate potential sites. The latest search has considered a shortlist of 18 possible sites which are currently vacant from an original longer list of 37 sites. Following consultation with Birmingham Property Services, only 4 of the 18 sites shortlisted were not already earmarked, and / or in the process of disposal, for other uses. Further detailed work is now being carried out to establish the suitability of these four sites and an update will be given once this detailed assessment has been concluded.
- 4.5. As well as the site search, an updated GTAA is also being carried out during 2023 as part of the evidence for the new Local Plan. Work on the new GTAA is already underway by RRR Consultancy, who are experienced and respected consultants amongst local authorities and GRT communities alike. The new GTTA will assess current need (2023-2028) and future need (2028-2042) and is due to be completed in September 2023. It will therefore give us a fully up-to-date picture of what the Council will need to provide over the coming years in both transit and permanent GRT provision.

5. Transit Site Update

- 5.1. As previously reported, colleagues in Housing and the Place, Prosperity and Sustainability Directorate have applied for capital funding to develop the two transit sites identified in the Birmingham Development Plan (BDP). The funding applications to Homes England and DLUHC were both rejected.
- 5.2. Proctor Street transit site has been operational since 1st November 2020 and has seen almost constant use, excepting when closed pending repairs. The report taken to your Committee last November explained how that use had evolved from normalised use pre-lockdowns through to the challenges brought about by the lockdowns and persisting through to the date of the report. There has been no change in the behaviour of the travelling community in Birmingham since November ultimately leading to the site having been repossessed and closed pending repairs since mid-January.
- 5.3. Housing colleagues have provided a briefing note explaining the current position with regards to the transit sites and this is appended to this report (Appendix 1).

6. Unauthorised Encampments

- 6.1. The number of incursions and associated caravans on council land is displayed in the graph below. This shows the trend data for total encampments per financial year since 2008/2009 with the final column showing data for 2023/2024 up to the end of July.



- 6.2. Although the number of encampments on Council land has dropped in the years after the transit site opened in 2019 it should be borne in mind that this also covers the period encapsulated by the pandemic and as such the actual benefit arising from the transit site cannot be clearly realized as the circumstances have not been 'normal'.
- 6.3. The numbers of unauthorised encampments in 2022/23 is now almost level with the numbers seen in the pre-Covid year of 2019/20 up to when the first lockdown commenced. During 2022/23 the transit site was occupied in seven instances.
- 6.4. This unauthorised use of the Proctor Street Transit Site has led to increased pressure on that neighbourhood and both EH and WM Police have come under pressure to deal with the behaviour of occupants of the site. Having additional Transit sites with effective management would alleviate some of the pressures being experienced in and around Proctor Street.
- 6.5. At present, during 2023/2024 the numbers of UE appear to be slightly down on previous years, although numbers of caravans appears on par suggesting that the average size of encampments has increased.

7. Strategic Management of Unauthorised Encampments

- 7.1. As noted in the background the strategic approach to managing unauthorised encampments is contained within a joint protocol between BCC and WMP. This protocol presently relies on the use by WMP of powers under the Criminal Justice and Public Order Act 1994 to direct groups to the transit site where their stay in the city can be 'managed'.

7.2. The current version of the protocol is edition 9 and incorporates the use of transit sites. Discussions are ongoing between BCC and WMP on effective management of the transit site in the event of a UE being established and the outcome from those meetings will likely give rise to an update to the protocol.

7.3. An action plan is also in development covering the management of the transit site with contribution from relevant stakeholders.

8. Consultation

8.1. The report is for information and, therefore, no consultation has been undertaken.

8.2. Information continues to be made available to MPs and elected members to offer support in reducing the impact on communities that unauthorised encampments have and to reduce the burden on land owning departments.

9. Implications for Resources

9.1. This report is for noting, there is no financial decision or implication as a result of the report recommendation. Following issuance of a S114 notice the Council is prevented, without explicit agreement of the Section 151 Officer, from entering into any new agreement or commitment for expenditure at this stage. All future expenditure decisions must follow the spend control process as per S114 arrangements.

10. Implications for Policy Priorities

10.1. The work to provide a good quality transit site provision meets with the statutory duties the council has for all residents of Birmingham, which includes the travelling community. It also means that Birmingham is an entrepreneurial city to learn, work and invest in.

10.2. This work supports the Regulation and Enforcement Division's mission statement to provide 'locally accountable and responsive fair regulation for all - achieving a safe, healthy, clean, green and fair trading city for residents, business and visitors'.

11. Public Sector Equality Duty

11.1. The management of unauthorised encampments is a process that affects groups and individuals who are (mostly) from specific and defined ethnic minorities e.g. Romany Gypsies, Irish Travelers.

Purpose of the Report

To provide an update in relation to Traveller site provision for the informal LPPC meeting taking place via Teams on 26th July 2023. An action plan has been previously submitted for review/discussion.

Background

The City does not currently have adequate transit site provision, which is needed to assist the Environmental Health team in 'moving on' unauthorised encampments. Although there are suitable numbers of sites allocated for this provision, the current condition and overall management of these sites needs to be addressed to ensure that processes are identified and formalised so entry is regulated, rental payments obtained, length of stay standardised and agreements signed. Discussions will need to take place between Housing and Environmental Health to ensure we are clear on where responsibilities lie.

Proctor Street

The site at Proctor Street has not been in operation since December 2022 and has experienced regular unauthorised access leading to extensive damage to the site, in particular the welfare block and significant fire damage to the electric feeder box.

Initial quotations for works have been received and a pre-meeting has taken place on site. Due to the extent of the damage to the electric feeder box, National Grid will need to attend site to install a new feed with cut out and meter. The repairs are programmed to start in September. National Grid are due on site 22/08/23 to quote for works and they will not action works until they have received payment – it is likely, once payment is received, that works won't take place until end of October / early November due to their own timeframes.

A quote has been received in relation to repairs to the automated vehicular gate, however, a further quote has been requested for more basic swing gates without automation as an alternative option. We are also pending a quotation for a gate lock with padlock protection for the pedestrian access gate.

Further discussions are taking place with the Housing Management Director in relation to the management of the site going forward. There is a need to ensure suitable management is in place once Proctor Street becomes operational to help deter further unauthorised access and damage.

There also needs to be a clear process in place setting out roles and responsibilities between housing service areas and enforcement.

In relation to rental payments for those wishing to use Proctor Street, an agreement has been approved for the provision of RingGo on site; this will allow payments of rent to be taken on a weekly basis with text reminders for any follow up payments for those wishing to stay for longer periods. Signage will also be provided and will set out minimum requirements and terms of stay so expectations are clear. There is a current tenancy agreement in place, but this is being reviewed by legal to see if improvements can be made.

Tameside Drive

The family that has been occupying this site since 1991 remain in occupation, however, progress has been made and the family have expressed a desire to sign a tenancy agreement. This is currently with legal. The site capacity is 14 pitches. A grant funding application was rejected by DLUHC in January 2023.

Aston Brook Street East

This site is not in operation. Planning was approved for 4 pitches with the erection of a single storey welfare building, installation of palisade fencing and gated access, however, a grant funding application was rejected in June 2022 and concerns have since been raised in relation to the feasibility of the site given the size and layout.

Strategic Project Plan

As part of a longer-term solution, a strategic project plan is being developed, which will require a cross-directorate approach, and includes developing a GRT strategy. The GRT strategy will support the management of sites but also the health, wellbeing and safeguarding responsibilities we hold for this community. It is a larger piece of work that will require writing of policies/procedures, engaging with key stakeholders, consultation and governance process.

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3. Results

3.1 During the months of April, May and June 2023, the following cases were heard at Birmingham Magistrates' Court, unless otherwise stated:

- 324 Environmental Health cases were finalised resulting in fines of £146,826. Prosecution costs of £54,937 were awarded.
- Four Licensing cases were finalised resulting in fines of £4,611. Six penalty points were awarded. Prosecution costs of £3,516 were awarded.
- Six Trading Standards cases were finalised resulting in fines of £1,825, a 35 month prison sentence, a Criminal Behaviour Order, a four month suspended sentence and 120 hours unpaid work. Prosecution costs of £2,947 were awarded.
- Five Waste Enforcement cases were finalised resulting in fines of £3,739. Prosecution costs of £3,562 were awarded.
- Appendix 1 details all prosecutions finalised during April 2023 by ward.
- Appendix 2 details all prosecutions finalised during May 2023 by ward.
- Appendix 3 details all prosecutions finalised during June 2023 by ward.
- Appendix 4 details all cautions administered during April, May and June 2023.
- Appendix 5 lists the enforcement activity undertaken by the Waste Enforcement Team from April 2023 to March 2024.
- Appendix 6 lists Penalty Charge Notices issued by Parking Enforcement specifically for individuals parking on Taxi Ranks across the City from April 2023 to March 2024. Please note this does not include other parking tickets issued anywhere else in the City.

- 5.5 This will not directly correlate to the values awarded in the same time period as individual cases are often cleared in instalments with the associated fines and court costs taking precedence over the settling of BCC legal costs. & PUBLIC PROTECTION COMMITTEE:**

1. Summary
 - 1.1 This report advises your committee of action taken by the Chair between meetings, under authority delegated by the Licensing & Public Protection Committee, with an explanation as to why in each case, this authority was used.

3. Background Information

- 3.1 On 16 March 2007 Section 52 of the Road Safety Act 2006 came into force. This has had the effect of enabling a licensing authority to suspend or revoke a hackney carriage or private hire driver's licence with immediate effect – meaning that the suspension or revocation takes effect immediately once notice of the authority's decision has been given to the driver – where this decision is considered necessary in the interests of public safety.

4. Summary of Action Taken for May 2023

- 4.1 On 28 April 2023 officers contacted the Chair with respect to driver J, following receipt of information from West midlands Police, indicating the driver had pleaded guilty and was awaiting sentence for child sex offences.
- 4.2 Having considered the seriousness of the offences, on 2 May 2023 the Chair authorised immediate revocation of driver J's private hire driver's licence in accordance with Section 52 of the Road Safety Act 2006 and Section 61(2B) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976.

5. Summary of Action Taken for June 2023

- 5.1 On 13 June 2023 officers contacted the Chair in connection with driver K, as a result of information which had been released on the driver's Disclosure and Barring Service return.
- 5.2 The information disclosed, concerned an ongoing investigation into allegations of offences relating to money laundering and conspiracy to supply a Class A controlled drug, it was reported the driver had admitted to using his taxi to transport bags of cash on behalf of another individual on regular occasions. The matter was awaiting a Crown prosecution Service (CPS) charging decision.
- 5.3 Having considered the circumstances and the seriousness of the allegation, the Chair agreed driver K's private hire driver's licence should be refused renewal, with immediate effect, in accordance with Section 52 of the Road Safety Act 2006 and Section 61(2B) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976.

6. Implications for Resources

- 6.1 This report is for noting, there is no financial decision or implication as a result of the report recommendation. Following issuance of a S114 notice the Council is prevented, without explicit agreement of the Section 151 Officer, from entering into any new agreement or commitment for expenditure at this stage. All future expenditure decisions must follow the spend control process as per S114 arrangements.

7. Implications for Policy Priorities

- 7.1 The contents of the report contribute to the City Council's published policy priority of improving the standards of licensed vehicles, people and premises in the City.
