Our key question:	How can the Council reduce fly-tipping in the city?
1. How is O&S adding value through this work?	There is a persistent problem of fly-tipping in some parts of the city which is blighting streets and public areas.
2. What needs to be done?	<ul> <li>Key lines of inquiry are:</li> <li>What is the extent of fly-tipping in the city? Where are the hotspots?</li> <li>What is the current policy on fly-tipping, locally and nationally?</li> <li>How does the Council respond to fly-tipping, including the legal position and responses used?</li> <li>How is rubbish from flats above shops collected and what impact does this have on fly-tipping?</li> <li>What do other councils do? What is best practice? What other enforcement and prevention options are available? Are there innovative ideas that Birmingham could adopt?</li> <li>How can the city improve its response to fly-tipping, and encourage citizens to be part of the solution?</li> </ul>
3. What timescale do we propose to do this in?	The outline timetable is:  Research: January 2020;  Evidence gathering session: January/February 2020  The date a draft report is discussed by the Committee: April 2020  The date of the City Council meeting: June 2020
4. What outcomes are we looking to achieve?	A report with recommendations to improve the City Council response to fly-tipping.
