





Formed according to national guidance and local principles PCCC confirmation 16th May, live from 1st July


- 10 PCNs Sandwell, 5 PCNs in West Birmingham (Ladywood & Perry Barr)

- PCNs delivering network-level services, beginning with Extended Access













































Network Contract DES

Funding for additional roles as an integral part of an expanded multidisciplinary team and to deliver PCN services (including Extended Hours Access from Jul-19):

- CD Role (required)
- Additional Roles to deliver Service Specifications (not mandatory):
 - Clinical Pharmacists
 - Social Prescribing Link Workers
 - Physician Associates
 - First Contact Physiotherapists
 - First Contact Paramedics
 - Occupational therapists
 - Dieticians
 - Podiatrists
 - Health and wellbeing coaches
 - Care coordinators
 - Mental health practitioners (incl. IAPT)





SWBCCG Support for PCNs

- Mar-18; investment to support formation and Workforce Strategy development;
- Monthly CDs and PCN leads meetings;
- PCN leadership development (summer 2018);
- Two legal advice sessions;
- Support to release time for practices to work as PCN-based Action Learning Sets under the NHS England Releasing Time for Care Programme;
- PCN-focused Protected Learning Time event (April 2019);
- Bespoke organisational development sessions for individual PCNs;
- 50p per patient invested in 2019-20 into a PCN Maturity Local Improvement Scheme (LIS);
- Investment made available to free up additional clinical or non-clinical leadership capacity and to support networks to implement PCN-specific schemes to increase collaborative working.



PCNs - Next

- New investment over the next 5 years, further investments outlined in Update to contract agreement (Feb-20)
- Primary Care Networks will provide flexible options for GPs and wider primary care teams
- Expanded neighbourhood teams will comprise a range of staff such as GPs, pharmacists, district nurses, community geriatricians, dementia workers and AHPs such as physiotherapists and podiatrists/chiropodists, joined by social care and the voluntary sector
- Service Specifications (Apr-20 onwards)
- Extended Hours (by Apr-21)
