This Sub-Committee has considered both the representations made on behalf of Bad Lady Limited, the premises licence holder for Bar 28, 28 Birmingham Road, Sutton Coldfield, West Midlands, B72 1QG and also those representations submitted by the representative for the Police in respect of the interim steps imposed on the 27 March 2024 pending a review of the license as a whole.

On hearing that both the representative for premises license holder and the police have come to an agreement over a modification of the interim steps imposed, and the Sub-Committee having carefully considered their duty to uphold the licensing objectives, they determined that the interim steps imposed on the 27<sup>th</sup> of March 2024 should be modified as follows:

- Licensable activities to be permitted until 10pm with everyone to be gone by 11.30pm, provided all other modifications below are complied with
- There will be a variation of DPS to Mr James Wilson.
- There is to be no less than 1 SIA door person per 50 patrons on duty from 20:00 hours (the details of the door supervisor company will be provided to the police service in advance).
- A dispersal policy will be prepared, agreed with the police service and implemented at the premises.
- The premises licence holder director James Wilson is to undertake the personal licence holder course.

The Sub-Committee therefore considers that the imposition of the modified terms as set out above are necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives and will exist until determination of the review hearing.

In reaching this decision, the Sub-Committee has given due consideration to the guidance issued by the Home Office in relation to expedited and summary licence

reviews, the certificate issued by West Midlands Police under Section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003 and the application for review.

All parties are advised that there is no right of appeal to a magistrates' court against the decision of the Licensing Authority at this stage.
