# 1. Purpose of report:

To consider relevant representations that have been made in respect of an application to vary the Premises Licence which seeks to extend the hours for the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption on the premises), to operate from 11:00am until 01:00am (Sunday to Thursday) and 11:00am until 02:00am (Friday and Saturday).

The application also seeks to extend the provision of Regulated Entertainment consisting of live music and recorded music, to operate indoors only, from 11:00am until 01:00am (Sunday to Thursday) and 11:00am until 02:00am (Friday and Saturday).

To extend the provision of Late Night Refreshment to operate from 11:00pm until 01:00am (Sunday to Thursday) and 11:00pm until 02:00am (Friday and Saturday).

Premises to be open to the public from 11:00am until 01:00am (Sunday to Thursday) and 11:00am until 02:00am (Friday and Saturday).

Other dates and times as specified in the application form.

# 3. Brief Summary of Report:

Variation application received on 24<sup>th</sup> February 2017 in respect of Ana Rocha, Rear of 48 Frederick Street, Hockley, Birmingham.

Representations have been received from Environmental Health, as a responsible authority, and from other persons.

I'm writing to object to the proposal to extend the licensing hours of Ana Rocha Bar & Gallery Ltd.

Crime and disorder: Whilst the venue is proposing CCTV to cover the entrance and 'other areas' this will not protect the surrounding streets from the increase in late night visitors, to what is a semi-residential area. We are already beginning to suffer (fights, broken glass, vomit, noise) from the increase in drinking establishments in the area. Extending the licensing hours of this venue, in the heart of the Jewellery Quarter conservation area will mean these issues continue later into the night/early morning and will also lead to an increase in their frequency.

Noise: The venue is already clearly audible in neighbouring properties up to and sometimes beyond its current licensing hours. The notion that local residents will have to put up with this noise into the early hours of the morning is of real concern. From my location at the rear of venue my primary concern is not the arrival and departure of guests - this is more likely to affect residents on Albion and Frederick Streets - but the playing of music, singing and the emptying of bottles into the bins at the rear of the venue.

As a general point I feel that this venue is a good addition to the increasingly vibrant and cosmopolitan community that is the Jewellery Quarter. However, I'm concerned that an extension of licensing hours would affect the harmonious relationship between residents, businesses and venues/drinking establishments, by prolonging the issues we currently tolerate (noise pollution, drunken and disorderly behaviour) late in to the night.

Please could you acknowledge receipt of my objection and update me in relation to the progress of the application.

#### NOISE.

I understand that bars make noise. I live in a vibrant part of the city and I expect that during normal licensing hours. However, I must

state that this bar regularly plays very loud music beyond standard hours and at times has driven myself and neighbours to distraction. So much so

we have had to contact the owners and make complaints about the noise. Not only music, bur the emptying of bottles into bins at the rear of

the property. I live within

of the property and I must object to the extension of the license to this

business. The noise even cuts through

my secondary glazing that I have had fitted, which demonstrates the volume it can reach.

### CRIME & DISORDER.

The Jewellery Quarter is a vibrant spot for revelry. As I stated previously, I expect this activity within normal licensing hours (Not past 11pm at night)

However, I am very concerned that if the area continues to extend the licensing hours, we will see an increase in none social behaviour that we see on a regular basis.

It is quite common to see fights break out, drunken behaviour, vomit, fast food strewn over the streets, urine running across pavements and broken glass.

I am concerned that extending the Ana Rocha Bar's license will contribute to this.

I would like to state that the Ana Rocha Bar and gallery is an excellent addition to the places to eat and drink within this area. I have frequented the bar on a few occasions.

However, I feel that if the licensing hours are extended, it will create friction between the local residences who live within audible distance of the bar. I for one would prefer to keep a harmonious relationship with our neighbours.

I would appreciate a confirmation of this objection and an update on the progress of the application.



### Context:

Ana Rocha Bar & Gallery (Rear of 48 Frederick Street) was given planning to transform the use of a building, approximately meters ( feet) away from my home and moved in, in early 2016. My home is located in a semi-residential part of the Jewellery Quarter, which also includes homes, some light industry, offices and jewellery workshops. (see Map 2) There is within the block, circumnavigated by Tenby Street, Tenby Street North, Warstone Lane, Frederick Street and Albion Street, one bar called Fredericks which closes at 10pm each night. Other bars exist, but at the opposite side of Frederick Street. At the time that Ana Rocha Bar & Gallery applied for planning, I was one of the residents who objected to the development of the site for a bar, because of my concern with regard to Nuisance and in particular noise, primarily because of the locations proximity to my home. But that the function of the space was as a bar and gallery, (not just a bar) initially alleviated mine and my neighbors' concerns (a gallery suggesting a much quieter environment).

Map 1 of area and the proximity of Ana Rocha Bar to my home




Green Outline – My Home No. Tenby Street

**Green Outline** Current residents/ Yellow Outline Resident and offices in development/ not occupied as yet.



Ana Rocha Bar & Gallery, is not what might be considered a gallery, in the sense of say RBSA (Royal Birmingham Society of Artists), or the much more recent arrival of the Argentea Gallery, both on St. Paul's Square, B3. The Art and Objects (furniture, Watches and Fine art) are for sale, and offer a certain ambience to the venue, which underpin what in my opinion is the primary function of the venue, which offers as well as tapas etc., events composing of Live music, Jazz nights, Ibiza nights and Brazilian nights. (as advertised to the front of the premises)

Since the business moved into Frederick Street in April 2016 the bar noise has altered my life negatively.

I initiated communications with Edgar Vera Rueda, the owner of the business even before the business officially opened, because of the loudness of the music being played. I had hoped that once advised of a neighbor, whose home overlooks their new business, that that would resolve it and that it was just a case of turning the volume down.



Unfortunately, since then, there have been many text communications with the owner and more recently the Manager, in an attempt to negotiate the turning down of music, turning off early of extraction and so on.

### IMPACT:

The impact on my home has been profoundly negative and the issue of nuisance is weekly in relation to the following:

- Live music
- DJ's on microphone
- Amplified music
- Mechanical extraction

- Groups of people shouting talking singing / from inside the building
- Bottles been emptied through the side door
- Music bleeding from the side door and skylight windows (particularly in the summer months)



The noise can be clearly heard in my home and in my outdoor space - front courtyard.

The above noise continues often beyond the licensed hours, and into the early hours of the morning 1-2 AM. This demonstrates a history of disregard for the monitoring of noise nuisance. This can be assessed against Appendix 1, 2 and 3, pg. 9/10/11.

### The Impact is:

I have often been unable to get to sleep (not exclusively, but particularly at weekends) or to go to bed and sleep, when I choose. This decision has been taken away from me, because my upstairs space is unusable due to the noise.

The situation is stressful and anxiety ridden because I am never sure when the bar sounds are going to stop.

I have often had to sleep on my sofa downstairs, as its less impacted upon.

I am often tired as a result and it impacts on my day to day life.

More recently I have considered selling and moving, from a beloved home of nearly 4 years.

Over the last 10 months, this situation has taken up considerable amounts of time, in terms of regularly requesting the turning down of music, off of extraction by text and by phone call – only to have to repeat the request again and again.

This reality was expressed again recently in a meeting I had on Sat. 11<sup>th</sup> Feb. 2017 with Edgar and his manager Andre Festa, in an attempt to communicate the impact the noise pollution produced by his business was having on my life. Also, to impress on them the urgency of resolving the issue, but to no avail – that night the problem continued regardless (See Texts dated Sunday 12th Feb. 01.50/ and 02.01) and an application for variation of license was posted shortly afterwards.


#### Conclusion

Very recently after nearly 10 months of dealing with the impact on my life of A&R bar, I make the decision to contact Birmingham City Council's, Environmental Health and Licensing Departments. I understand that Licensing are already investigating breaches of the existing license.

This was not a light decision to make, predominantly because I truly had hoped that Ana Rocha Bar & Gallery would, if given time, put measures in place to resolve the issue. This has not been the case. The constant repetition of the nuisance since opening, and the type of business they are running, unfortunately is more like a music venue/club and less like a gallery with bar.

I include a list of dates and times regarding texts send to the owner and more recently the Manager – which pertain to asking the business to turn the volume down, turn extraction off, including reasonable enquiries as to why crowd activity is still audible, beyond the hours of license. Also included are more recent notes taken by me (date & time stamped on mobile phone) recording the ongoing nuisance.

Note: These are the times of the texts, I sent. (They are not the times at which the business closed) All of these texts are available to be seen.

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#### Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) Dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person must ensure that—

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint; (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."
- (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- (2) In this condition:— (a) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula  $P = D + (D \times V)$ , where— (i) P is the permitted price, (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable

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in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; (b) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979; (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence— (i) the holder of the premises licence, (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence; (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

- (3) Where the permitted price would not be a whole number of pennies, the permitted price shall be taken to be the price rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (4) Where the permitted price on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax, the permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.


