### **1.** Purpose of report:

To consider relevant representations that have been made in respect of an application for a Premises Licence which seeks to permit the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption on the premises only) to operate from 12:00midday until 01:00am (Monday to Sunday).

To permit the provision of Late Night Refreshment to operate from 11:00pm until 01:00am (Monday to Sunday).

Premises to remain open to the public from 12:00midday until 01:30am (Monday to Sunday).

Other dates and times as specified in the application form.

### 2. Recommendation:

To consider the representations that have been made and to determine the application.

### 3. Brief Summary of Report:

An application for a Premises Licence was received on 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2017 in respect of Bodega Cantina, 26 Birmingham Road, Sutton Coldfield, B72 1QG.

Application Reference 102473- Bodega Cantina at 26 Birmingham Road, Sutton Trinity

- Reference the above application I understand the application is for sales and consumption
  on the premises only. Generally, I do not have an issue with this so long as all drinks sold are
  consumed on the premises. I do not think any drinking should be permitted in the alcohol
  free area of Birmingham Road. In particular on the footpath outside the operation which is
  the public space not the premises property. I interpret retail premises licence to have this
  restriction.
- I do feel that the opening hours for the serving of alcohol and refreshments on the New Year's Eve is excessive.
  - The proposal is until 5 a.m. each year, or possibly continuation through to noon the 2<sup>nd</sup> January, in effect 24 hour opening for drink, if I have understood correctly re alcohol.
  - I would not have an issue with an extension of the hours for sale until 2.00 a.m. on New Year's Eve and this is more in keeping with other businesses in the proximity.
  - I feel the implication of this current proposal has the potential to turn what is already a very hectic and noisy evening in the location, and adjacent residential areas, which is my prime concern, into something which, if badly managed and controlled, could cause anti-social issues within the local area well into the morning.
  - I believe the premises being open to all throughout this period for the sale of refreshments is also likely to cause disruption and a close time of 2 a.m. feels prudent to minimise the potential for anti-social issues.

#### Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the following documents (which do not need to be certified).

#### Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A full birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of the holder's
  parents or adoptive parents, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's
  permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A
   (2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK
  with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or
  reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration
  decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in the UK including:-
  - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
  - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
  - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one
    of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
    - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
    - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
    - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
    - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an \$1, \$2 or \$3 form.

**Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities.** If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

(i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;

(ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;

- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and

(v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:


- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to self alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.

In considering the application submitted the Licensing Enforcement Team has applied the tests of necessity and reasonableness in order to promote the four licensing objectives and I have there attached a list of conditions which the Licensing Enforcement Team will require the applicant to accept as conditions attached to the premises licence.

Subject to the applicant or you as their authorised agent confirming in writing they agree to accept the attached conditions there will be no need to the Licensing Enforcement Team to make a representation regarding the application submitted.

So could you please consider that for the above premises the following:

#### **General**

All members of staff will receive training regarding the:-

- four licensing principles contained in the Licensing Act 2003;
- · responsible retailing of alcohol, and law regarding sales of alcohol;
- protection of children from harm and this must include how to competently check customers' identification where necessary;
- permitted hours during which licensable activities can take place, and the conditions attached to the premises licence.

The training provided to staff will be recorded and each member of staff will sign and date the training records to confirm they have received and understood the training provided.

The staff training records will be kept at the premises and made available to any Responsible Authority upon request.

#### Prevention of Public Nuisance

A notice must be prominently displayed in the premises requesting that customers respect the needs of local residents and other businesses in the vicinity and to leave the premises quietly.

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#### Protection of Children from Harm

The premises licence holder will implement and operate a challenge 25 age verification policy to prevent the sale or supply of alcohol to persons under 18 years of age.

A copy of the written age verification policy must be signed by all members of staff to confirm they have read and understand the policy and this signed copy must be maintained at the premises and available for inspection by any Responsible Authority on request.

A notice will be displayed at the premises and clearly visible to customers informing them that a challenge 25 policy is in operation at the premises.

#### Crime

Please can the following be amended: The Premises Licence holder shall ensure CCTV will be installed to meet the requirements of West Midlands Police. Images will be retained for a period of 31 days for inspection
