The Chairman introduced the Members and officers present then explained the hearing procedure prior to inviting the Licensing Officer, Bhapinder Nandhra to outline the report.

Afterwards, the Chairman invited the applicant's representative to make their submission. At which stage Mijanur Rahman, made the following points on behalf of the applicant: -

- a) That the application was for a convenience store and off licence.
- b) The representation received in email format highlighted the hours of trading as the main issue, due to noise nuisance. They had responded to the email and tried to outline steps they could take to ensure noise was controlled and also pointed out the conditions agreed with Licensing Enforcement (LE) and West Midlands Police (WMP). Unfortunately, the objector did not withdraw their objection.
- c) The shop was positioned within a 'ring' of shops, some of which were food premises; pizza shop, café, and a fish and chip shop. Some of those premises had licences until midnight and the community centre had a licence until 0100 hours everyday. There was also a late-night Pharmacy within the ring of shops.
- d) That the application was in keeping with the other shops in the area.

- e) The applicant had another 24-hour licence and had never had any issues or complaints.
- f) The store was marketed as a mini market a convenience type store.
- g) People would be purchasing eggs, milk, bread and alcohol.
- h) They had agreed the conditions with LE and WMP.

In summing up Mr Rahman, on behalf of the applicant made the following points:

- That his client was an experienced licence holder who currently held a 24-hour licence. He was also family man and it would be a family run business.
- ➤ They had considered reducing the hours, but they were in keeping with the area and therefore felt the hours were necessary.

At this stage the meeting was adjourned in order for the Sub Committee to make a decision and all parties left the meeting. The Members, Committee Lawyer and Committee Manager conducted the deliberations in private and decision of the Sub-Committee was sent out to all parties as follows: -

5/150720 **RESOLVED**:-

That the application by Tesfit Meles for a premises licence in respect of Mini Supermarket, 121 Witton Lodge Road, Perry Common, Birmingham, B23 5JD be granted.

Those matters detailed in the operating schedule, and the relevant mandatory conditions under the Licensing Act 2003, will form part of the licence issued, together with those additional conditions which were agreed by email in advance of the meeting (and reproduced in the Report) following discussions between the applicant, West Midlands Police and Licensing Enforcement, namely:

- If for any reason the CCTV hard drive needs to be replaced or repaired the previous/ old hard drive will be kept on site for a minimum of 28 days and made immediately available to any of the responsible authorities on request
- Cameras outside the premises are required to be able to still function in conditions of reduced lighting in order to be able to provide recordings of an evidential quality
- All staff with the exception or personal licence holders will receive training in their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing objectives and the Challenge 25 policy
- A record of training will be maintained and this will be signed by both the trainer and trainee. The training will be documented, kept on site and produced upon request to an authorised person. It will be

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- refreshed every 6 months. No staff will be permitted to work in the premises if they have not completed this training
- A sales refusals book will be kept on site and completed by the member of staff each time they refuse a sale of an age restricted product. The refusals book will be signed off by the DPS every month
- Single cans or bottles of less than 75 ml of beers, ciders and alcopops, and plastic cups to accompany purchases of alcohol, are not to be sold
- A notice will be displayed at the exit of the premises requesting customers to leave quietly and respect the local neighbourhood

The Sub Committee deliberated the operating schedule put forward by the applicant and the likely impact of the application, including the agreed conditions, and concluded that by granting this application, the four licensing objectives contained in the Act will be properly promoted.

Members carefully considered the representations made by another person, who submitted a written objection, but were not convinced that there was an evidential and causal link between the issues raised and the effect on the licensing objectives. Other licensed premises in the area already operated to similar, or even later, hours. The applicant was an experienced person who currently held a 24 hour licence elsewhere, and had been operating at that premises without problems. It would be a family-run convenience store with 'off' sales of alcohol. All in all, the Sub-Committee was satisfied that the applicant had sufficient experience to manage such a shop in the Witton Lodge Road area responsibly.

The Sub-Committee considers the conditions agreed between the applicant, West Midlands Police and Licensing Enforcement to be appropriate, reasonable and proportionate to address concerns raised by the objector.

In reaching this decision, the Sub-Committee has given due consideration to the City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, the Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 by the Secretary of State, the information in the application, the written representations received and the submissions made at the hearing by the applicant via his representative.

All parties are reminded that under the provisions contained within Schedule 5 to the Licensing Act 2003, there is the right of appeal against the decision of the Licensing Authority to the Magistrates' Court, such an appeal to be made within twenty-one days of the date of notification of the decision.

1. Purpose of report:

To consider a representation that has been made in respect of an application for a Premises Licence which seeks to permit the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption off the premises only) to operate from 12:00midday until 4:00am (Monday to Sunday).

The sale of alcohol will be an online delivery service only with hot food orders.

To permit the provision of Late Night Refreshment, to operate outdoors only, from 11:00pm until 4:00am (Monday to Sunday).

Due to the nature of the application hot food will be available for takeaway or delivery until 12:00midnight (Sunday to Thursday) and until 2:00am (Friday and Saturday), with an online delivery service available until 4:00am (Monday to Sunday).

The premises is to remain open to the public from 12:00midday until 12:00midnight (Sunday to Thursday) and 12:00midday until 2:00am (Friday and Saturday).

2. Recommendation:

To consider the representation that has been made and to determine the application.

3. Brief Summary of Report:

An application for a Premises Licence was received on 6th July 2020 in respect of Circle Fish Bar, 9 Kettlehouse Road, Kingstanding, Birmingham, B44 9JH.

A representation has been received from West Midlands Police as a responsible authority.

Good Afternoon Licensing,

With reference to the above application this is an application made by a fish bar wishing to trade from the shop selling food till midnight Sunday to Thursday and till 0200 on Friday and Saturday. The business is also wishes to commence an on line delivery service from Monday till Sunday between the times of 1200 hours and 0400 hours.

The control of alcohol is difficult to maintain. This is particularly true in a situation where the order takes place online and therefore there is no face to face contact between vendor and purchaser at the time of the order. The only physical contact takes place at the point of delivery and this can be both short and uninformative. This contact is further devalued when it takes place later in the night due to adverse lighting conditions.


The lateness of the time that the applicant seeks for this application means that the problems above are an issue with this application. There is an increased potential for persons already under the influence of drink being served further alcohol and due to identities being more difficult to establish that vulnerable persons will obtain alcohol.


I have attempted to resolve this issue by agreeing a time with the applicant that would nullify these issues. This has not been possible to achieve. I would therefore wish to object to the application on the grounds that the licensing objectives are not being promoted in particular:

- (1) The prevention of crime and disorder,
- (2) The protection of children from harm.



Alcohol will only be sold with on line food orders

Deliveries of Alcohol will be made by direct employees only

Where alcohol sales take place, the delivery driver must ensure that the recipient of the order is the same as the person who authorised the sale and purchased the food. No deliveries of alcohol will be made to persons under 18.

No alcohol will be delivered to any customer who is intoxicated.

- Drivers will ask the recipient of an order to produce their acceptable ID on delivery.
- Acceptable ID will be either a valid passport, photo card driving licence or recognised proof of age.
 Drivers delivering alcohol will be fitted with body cams and the recordings kept for 28 days.

No alcohol or tobacco will ever be purchased from sellers calling at the premise. Exceptions to the condition would be purchases made from authorised representatives who have made prior appointments to visit the store.

All alcohol and tobacco products sold at the premises shall have the relevant UK duty paid.

☑ Foreign tobacco, which does not comply with relevant UK legislation, shall not be stored and/or sold at the premise.
☑ Invoices, or copies of invoices, for all alcohol and tobacco purchases for the sale at the premises, will be retained and kept at the premises, and made available to officers from ALL RA UPON REQUEST.

If any tobacco products purchased for or on behalf of the business does not have UK Duty Paid fiscal mark or are otherwise suspicious, the licensee and/or designated premises supervisor shall notify the supplier to Birmingham City Council Trading Standards and HMRC as soon as possible.

Protecting Children from Harm

All persons involved in the sale of alcohol, who are not presonal licence holders, will receive initial and subsequent 6 monthly refresher training by the Designated Premises Supervisor or an appropriately accredited training provider with regards to the law in relation to the sale of alcohol. This will be recorded in a staff training register and will include, signature of the member of staff, the DPS or an appropriately accredited training provider together with the date. TRAINING RECORDS WILL BE MAINTAINED AT THE PREMISES AND MADE AVAILABLE TO ALL RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITIES ON REQUEST

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- The CCTV system must be installed and operate internally to cover all areas that licensable activities take place and where alcohol is displayed within any public area.
- The CCTV unit shall be positioned in a secure part of the licensed premise. Access to the system should be allowed immediately to ALL RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITIES upon request.
- A competent trained person in the use of and operation of the CCTV will be in attendance at the premises at all times
 that licensable activities take place and be able to fully operate the CCTV system to be able to down load in a recognised
 format any information requested ALL RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITIES
- The CCTV system clock should be set correctly and maintained (taking account of GMT and BST).
- A facility will be available for the Police to remove from the CCTV system a copy of any material relevant to any ongoing Police investigation.

- 6. All CCTV images will be retained for a period of not less than 31 day
- An incident register of all occurrences and ejections from the premises will be maintained at the premises and all details of public order offences will be recorded and MADE AVAILABLE TO ALL REPONSIBLE AUTHORITIES ON REQUEST
- 9. At any time when there is no Personal License holder on the premises there must be at least one member of staff on duty inside the premise who has been authorised by the DPS. Any such person should have seen, read and be fully aware of the conditions of the premise licence and take all steps to ensure that such conditions are adhered to whilst they have responsibility for the premise.
- 10. A record should be kept detailing, the name and address relative to the person left in charge of the premise and the times and dates when the authority to cover exists, in writing.
- These should be individual entries covering short periods of time only and should not exceed more than a three week period.
- 12. The authorised person should also sign on each occasion that he/she has physically seen inspected and is fully aware of all the conditions attached to the premise licence. The DPS should sign to acknowledge that they agree to the authorised person being in charge of the premise for any times specified. The records of these matters should be kept fully updated at all times.

All Records shall be retained at the premises for a period of no less than 12 months and made available to responsible authorities on request.

c) Public safety

d) The prevention of public nuisance

A risk assessment will be carried out and updated on an annual basis

e) The protection of children from harm

A Challenge 25 policy will be adopted in order to reduce the
 potential for underage sales of age restricted products including
 alcohol. If a customer appears to be under 25 years of age and
 cannot prove that they are eligible to purchase the age restricted
 item with a valid UK or Ireland Photocard Driving Licence, a valid
 Passport or PASS accredited proof of age scheme card, they will
 be refused service.

Challenge 25 posters will be displayed at the premises to reinforce this policy. Posters will be placed at; each till, each area alcohol is stocked and at the point of entry into the store. The posters will be displayed prominently and in sight of customers and staff.

A Refusals Register is to be used to record all incidents when a sale
is refused. The register is to be kept in the store at all times unless it
is requested by authorised officers of responsible authorities. The
Refusal/Challenge Register is to be checked and signed off by the
Designated Premises Supervisor every two weeks.

All staff ,WHO ARE NOT PERSONAL LICENSE HOLDERS ,working at the premises involved in the sale of age restricted products including alcohol will receive on-going training and will be refreshed at least every 6 months. This will be recorded in a staff training register and will also include a written test of knowledge. The Training records must be made available to

authorised officers of responsible authorities on request. Records shall be retained at the premises.

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NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the following documents (which do not need to be certified).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport
 as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay
 indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement
 indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in
 the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National
 Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A full birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of the holder's
 parents or adoptive parents, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's
 permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
 official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
 Government agency or a previous employer.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
 work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
 licensable activity.

- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic
 Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or
 residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder
 with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not
 subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity
 when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance
 number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A
 (2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK
 with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or
 reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration
 decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
 who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
 the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one
 of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

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
NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and
 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the
 screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides
 by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
 wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
 exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
 wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
 indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol
 for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
