1. Purpose of report:

To consider a relevant representation that has been made in respect of an application to vary the Premises Licence which seeks to extend the hours for the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption on the premises) to operate from 10:00am until 1:00am (Sunday to Thursday) and 10:00am until 2:00am (Friday and Saturday).

To amend the provision of Regulated Entertainment consisting of live music and recorded music, to operate indoors only, from 10:00am until 12:00midnight (Sunday to Thursday) and 10:00am until 1:00am (Friday and Saturday).

To extend the provision of Late Night Refreshment, to operate indoors only, from 11:00pm until 01:00am (Sunday to Thursday) and 11:00pm until 02:00am (Friday and Saturday).

Premises to remain open to the public from 09:00am until 01:00am (Monday to Thursday), 09:00am until 02:00am (Friday to Sunday).

Other dates and times are specified in the application.

2. Recommendation:

To consider the representation that has been made and to determine the application.

3. Brief Summary of Report:

Variation application received on 30th July 2021 in respect of the Premises at 23a St Marys Row, Moseley, Birmingham, B13 8HW.

A representation has been received from Planning, as a responsible authority.

I'm sorry if I am responding to this licensing matter incorrectly. Please do advise me for future reference if I am not following correct procedure. However, in the Planning Team we have had a new procedure come into effect on responding to licensing matters. I've had my attention drawn to these changes today and just happen to seemingly have a new licensing consultation.

I've attempted to click on the gov.uk link at the bottom of the email chain but unfortunately the link won't bring up a record. Therefore, to ensure a response is provided I thought I'd contact directly as per the 'new procedure'.

- The 'Premises Licence' reference number is *Birmingham-1105540*
- The site address in question is 23a St Mary's Row, Moseley
- Planning permission was granted in 2016 under planning application 2016/03874/PA, which included condition number 8 that requires 'Entrance doors on to pedestrian walkway shall not be used between 10pm -8am, except in the case of emergency access."
- As such, this variation of licensing terms to operate daily after 10pm would pose health and safety risks. If the changes to licensing arrangements were approved then the landowner would be in breach of planning control if the pedestrian walkway entrance doors were left open beyond 10pm. From a planning perspective, the landowner/applicant could apply for planning permission to vary the requirements of condition number 8 attached to permission 2016/03874/PA although I can give no guarantees such a planning application would be supported.

The objection to the proposed variation of the premises license at No. 23a St. Mary's Row, Mosely (REF 1105540) is on grounds of public safety, in accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003.

As explained in my previous email correspondence; there is a planning requirement – enforced by condition (condition no. 8 attached to planning permission 2016/03874/PA – requiring that entrance doors to a pedestrian walkway shall not be used between the hours of 10pm - 8am, except in the case of emergency access."

I am happy to defer to your professional judgement as to determining whether the proposed relaxation of the licensing hours beyond 10pm to allow "extension to opening hours, alcohol sales and performance of live and recorded music on a Friday and Saturday" poses a legitimate risk to public safety in this instance. However, it would be amiss of me not to draw your attention to the relevant planning condition (number 8) attached to permission 2016/03874/PA as a material consideration in your determination of this premises licensing application.

- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
 wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not

 wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an

- Live music: no licence permission is required for:

 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the
 audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains
 licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;



Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises— (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner; (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either— (a) a holographic mark, or (b) an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person must ensure that— (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures— (i) beer or cider: ½ pint; (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

(1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. (2) In this condition:- (a) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula $P = D + (D \times V)$, where— (i) P is the permitted price, (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; (b) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979; (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence— (i) the holder of the premises licence, (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence; (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994. (3) Where the permitted price would not be a whole number of pennies, the permitted price shall be taken to be the price rounded up to the nearest penny. (4) Where the permitted price on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax, the permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Each individual assigned to carrying out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Agency.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with operating schedule

2a) General conditions consistent with the operating schedule

The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure substantial food will be available at all times.

The licence areas of the premises shall be supervised by waiting staff throughout.

Off Sales of alcohol will only be made in respect of premium and specialist brands of spirits, liqueurs and wines.

All members of staff with the exception of personal licence holders who are involved in the sale or serving of alcohol will receive training regarding the law and responsible retailing of alcohol.

All staff training will be recorded and training records will signed by members of staff to confirm they have received and understood the training provided.

2b) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of crime and disorder

The CCTV system must be maintained and operational at the premises at all time when the premises are open to the public.

The images recorded by the CCTV system must be retained in unedited form for a period of not less than 28 days and will be downloaded and made available to any Responsible Authority upon request

CCTV to be installed to the satisfaction of West Midland Police. CCTV to record for no less than 14 days, to be downloadable and made immediately available to any of the responsible authorities on request. CCTV to record throughout the whole of the licensable activity.

The premises licence holder will implement measures to ensure customers are not permitted to drink on the street outside the premises.

2c) Conditions consistent with, and to promote, public safety

No enforceable conditions identified from operating schedule.

2d) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of public nuisance

The sales of alcohol for consumption away from premises (off sales) will be made in sealed containers only.

The premises licence holder will implement measures to ensure customers are not permitted to drink on the street outside the premises.

The licence holder will provide a bin or other receptacle in the external area used by customers to smoke in order that customers can dispose of their cigarette butts responsibly.

The bin/receptacle provided for customers to dispose of their cigarette butts must be removed and stored in a secured area during the hours when the business is closed.

The premises licence holder will ensure the external area used by customers wishing to smoke is kept tidy.

A notice must be prominently displayed and visible to all customers leaving the premises requesting they respect the needs of local residents and businesses in the vicinity and to leave the area quietly.

2e) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the protection of children from harm

All children permitted in the premises must be supervised by a responsible adult at all times

The premises operate a Challenge 21 age verification policy to prevent the sale or supply of alcohol to

persons under 18 years of age.

The premises will have a written age verification policy – Challenge 21 and must be signed and dated by all members of staff to confirm they have read and understand the policy in operation. The signed copy of the policy must be maintained at the premises and made available for inspection by any Responsible Authority on request.

A notice must be displayed at the premises and clearly visible to customers informing them that a Challenge 21 age verification policy is in operation at the premises.

The premises licence holder will maintain a refusals register (or refusal button on EPOS – Electronic Point of Sale) on the premises and ensure it is completed whenever a sale is refused to a person who cannot prove they are over the age of 18.

The refusal register or record of till recorded refusals must be made available for inspection to any Responsible Authority on request
