MATTERS DISCUSSED AT THE MEETING INCLUDING LOCAL CONCERNS:

- 1. Introductions and notice of recording Cllr Councillor Atwal
- 2. Apologies Neil De Costa ,Ken Brown and Cllr Kooner
- 3. **Local Police** with Police Sgt. Mc Garth Sgt. Mc Garth reported that crime for the Ward was low currently with fewer burglaries and robberies when compared to the same period last year he believed this to be due to the arrest of some local prolific burglars. Then discussing and updating the residents on A.S.B issues in HMO's in Cornwall Road and Wheaton Vale; speeding and resulting accidents in Church Road; inconsiderate and

dangerous parking around Handsworth Wood Girls Academy . Sgt Mc Garth gave crime prevention advice and went over the methods for contacting the Police this included calling 101, West Midlands now and the website which offered a chat line for non - urgent calls and of course 999 for emergencies .

- 4. Residents issues / Open forum The following items were raised and discussed by the residents and Councillor Atwal.
- HMO'S –Planning, PRS, supported housing and A.S.B Residents voiced their frustrations with ongoing problems with the existing H.M.O in the Ward including anti social behavior and problem landlords. Residents were also frustrated at the slow development of the city wide forum on H.M.O's which they had outlined in the Ward plan a while ago .**Action** Invite Planning and PRS team to the next Ward meeting on 9th January 2020.
- Fallen leaves/ wet dangerous not cleared foot paths Action Cllr Atwal to seek clarity on the leaf clearing policy with the cabinet member .
- Effective Health Care Commissioning in Sandwell and West Birmingham.-
- Road safety around the local schools siting speeding and obstructive parking as a regular occurrence. Residents asked if the Ward had made progress in establishing "20 is plenty "zones around schools as in other Wards around the City. Councillor Atwal said he would support any resident's petition on the subject. **Action** Karl Randall the Senior Highways Engineer for Perry Barr to be invited to a future meeting to discuss road safety issues and 20 is plenty zones in the Ward.
