### 1. Purpose of report:

To consider the objection notice to the Temporary Event Notice (TEN), which seeks to permit the sale of alcohol (for consumption on the premises), the provision of regulated entertainment and the provision of late night refreshment, to operate from 7:00pm until 3:00am on 24<sup>th</sup> June 2022 to 25<sup>th</sup> June 2022.

### 2. Recommendation:

To consider the objection notice made by West Midlands Police.

### 3. Brief Summary of Report:

A Temporary Event Notice was submitted by Jolanta Zatlere and received on 6<sup>th</sup> May 2022 in respect of Nude Bar and Grill, 38 Bennetts Hill, Birmingham, B2 5SN.

An objection notice has been received from West Midlands Police.

### 4. Compliance Issues:

When carrying out its licensing functions, a licensing authority must have regard to the guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.

Relevant background/chronology of key events:</b></p> <p>A Temporary Event Notice was submitted on 6<sup>th</sup> May 2022 by Jolanta Zatlere, in respect of Nude Bar and Grill, 38 Bennetts Hill, Birmingham, B2 5SN, which was served on the responsible authorities on 6<sup>th</sup> May 2022.</p> <p>The Temporary Event Notice is attached at Appendix 1.</p> <p>An objection notice has been received from West Midlands Police, which is attached at Appendix 2.</p> <p>The current premises licence is attached at Appendix 3.</p> <p>Site location plans are attached, see Appendix 4.</p> <p>Under the licensing system of TENs, no actual permission is required to carry out a licensable activity on a temporary basis. An applicant must merely give notice of his intentions to operate a licensable activity to the licensing authority.</p> <p>However, the police or local authority exercising environmental health functions may intervene to prevent such events taking place or agree a modification of the proposed arrangements, and their intervention may in some cases result in the licensing authority imposing conditions on each TEN.</p> <p>Where TENs are submitted, and objection notice(s) are maintained, the licensing authority must consider the objection(s) at a hearing before a counter notice, or a notice including a statement of conditions can be issued relating to each TEN.</p> <p>When giving TENs, consideration should be given to the following four licensing objectives:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Good Afternoon Licensing,

West Midlands Police object to the granting of this TEN application for Nude Bar & Grill 38 Bennetts Hill Birmingham B5 2SN on 24<sup>th</sup> in 25<sup>th</sup> June 2022 between 1900x0300.

The event is a promoted by a third party and while West Midlands Police have no concerns with the event itself, West Midlands Police do have concerns about the lack of control the premises have in relation to this event.

It is West Midlands Police stance that the lack of control the premises licence holder currently has over this event may lead to a breach of the licensing objectives in relation to the prevention of crime & disorder and public safety.

The concerns are:

- The promoters are supplying the security staff which means the premises licence holder has no control of their premises as the door staff will be directed and managed by the promoters. (The premises need to have control of the door team and they need to be deployed by the premises licence holder to have this control.)
- The premises have no way of controlling ticket sales and limiting the sales to the numbers on the TEN application and premises fire certificate.
- The premises are unaware of any risk assessment carried out by the promoter for numbers of door staff, which company they intend to deploy, entry policy, search policy, dispersal policy etc.
- Any risk assessment ideally needs to be carried by the premises holder or at least signed off by them as agreement.
- The fact that the TEN application is between 1900x0300 when the premises is licenced until 0200 so the TEN would nullify the premises licence from 1900.

I have spoken with the applicant at length, explained the above concerns and offered assistance of how to take this forward, who is copied into this email.

If the above concerns are addressed to the satisfaction of West Midlands Police then the objection would be withdrawn.

## Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises— (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner; (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either— (a) a holographic mark, or (b) an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person must ensure that— (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures— (i) beer or cider: ½ pint; (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.”

(1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. (2) In this condition:— (a) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula  $P = D + (D \times V)$ , where— (i) P is the permitted price, (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; (b) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979; (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence— (i) the holder of the premises licence, (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence; (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994. (3) Where the permitted price would not be a whole number of pennies, the permitted price shall be taken to be the price rounded up to the nearest penny. (4) Where the permitted price on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax, the permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Licensing Act 2003 Door Supervision Mandatory Condition No: 1 Each individual assigned to carrying out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Agency.



## **Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with operating schedule**

### **2a) General conditions consistent with the operating schedule**

No enforceable conditions identified from operating schedule.

### **2b) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of crime and disorder**

Alcoholic drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers saved for consumption in external areas provided for that purpose.

No customers carrying opened bottles of alcoholic drink upon entry shall be admitted to premises at anytime the premises are open to the public.

It is considered that for the nature of the operation door supervisors will not be required however, the Designated Premises Supervisor will undertake a risk assessment as to the deployment of door supervisors and will employ the same appropriately. Any persons exercising security (as defined by paragraph 21a of schedule 2 of the Private Security Act 2001 shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority).

Such person will be employed at the premises at the discretion of the designated premises supervisor/holder of the premises licence.

Digital CCTV to be installed and operated within the premises internally within the premises internally to cover all public areas (save for toilet facilities) and to include the rear external terraced area.

The CCTV images will record and display dates and times.

The CCTV footage will be stored for a minimum of 31 days.

On the reasonable request from a Constable or authorised officer of a Responsible Authority the management will give full and immediate cooperation and technical assistance to the downloading of data.

The premises will maintain an incident and refusal log which will be available to the Police and Licensing Authority on reasonable request and be retained for a period of 12 months.

When trading past 01.00hrs for the sale of alcohol the last entry or re-entry to the premises (save for returning smokers) will be 01.00hrs.

A profile of all door staff deployed at the premises will be kept by the premises. This will include a copy of their SIA badge and a copy of photographic ID. If photographic ID is not available then a utility bill less than 3 months will be acceptable. Door staff will sign on and off duty. Profiles and signing in / out sheets will be held on the premises for a minimum of 3 months and made available to West Midlands Police immediately on request.

The premises licence holder or their nominated person will check the CCTV system daily, prior to carrying out any licensable activity to ensure it is working and recording. The check will be documented and signed, timed and dated by the person carrying out the check. This documentation to be made immediately available to any of the responsible authorities on request.

### **2c) Conditions consistent with, and to promote, public safety**

The Premises Licensee will comply with the reasonable requirements of the Fire Officer from time to time.

### **2d) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of public nuisance**

Where appropriate prominent and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of the local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.

### **2e) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the protection of children from harm**

No films or videos of any description will be shown so that they can be viewed by persons under the age of any applicable BBFC/Local Authority certification.

Children under the age of 16 shall not be permitted to enter or remain at the premises after 22:00 unless resident, dining with an adult or attending a pre booked function.

The premises will operate Challenge 21.
