Cabinet Member Priorities 2018/19

Summary of Cabinet Member responsibilities:

- **Transport Strategies** sustainable travel policies and programmes.
- **Highways** maintenance of roads & streets, and traffic management.
- Advice to Planning Committee on highways issues and developments.
- Air Quality complying with regulations and becoming a clean air city.
- Green City sustainability, liveability and environmental improvement.
- Climate Change proactively tackling the causes and consequences.



Invest in our city

We will continue to attract major investment to our city, creating jobs and growth and providing the integrated transport system needed to support this:

- Enable investment in transport infrastructure supporting the Big City Plan.
- Maximise opportunities created by the arrival of HS2 in 2026.
- Progress the Snow Hill Growth Strategy for this major transport hub.
- Support the transport elements of an Inclusive Growth Strategy for East Birmingham and delivery of the NEC Masterplan.
- Ensure appropriate transport provision for the forthcoming Peddimore employment site and Langley Sustainable Urban Extension.
- Develop Green Travel Districts to help local centres thrive and prosper.



Keep Birmingham moving

We will develop a transport network of routes and public spaces in our city that efficiently meets demand from more residents and more trips:

- Refresh Birmingham Connected, our Transport Policy Statement, with plans for transport demand management and road space allocation.
- Ensure our highway network copes with projected growth and minimises the impact of congestion on residents and businesses.
- Continue to develop a way forward for highway maintenance services that will enable us to have confidence in future service delivery following the successful Supreme Court Decision against Amey
- Increase the number of trips by walking, cycling and public transport by making this safe and easy to access for everyone.
- Deliver priority measures that make public transport a reliable choice.



Improve Public Transport

We will make public transport in our city more attractive and easier to access with priority given to local services:

- Improve and increase local rail services, including re-opening stations on the Camp Hill line and extra capacity through the Midlands Hub project.
- Bring forward proposals for extension of the Midland Metro tram network.
- Deliver three new Sprint routes as part of our commitment to a green Commonwealth Games resulting in public transport improvements.
- Work with the West Midlands Bus Alliance to make journeys quicker, more attractive and better value.



Support Cycling & Walking

We will continue to make significant improvements to walking and cycling infrastructure around Birmingham:

- Produce a Local Cycling & Walking Strategy and Infrastructure Plan.
- Complete cycling superhighways on the A38 and A34 and canal access improvements through the Birmingham Cycle Revolution programme.
- Encourage more physical activity and improved wellbeing by building on successful initiatives such as Big Birmingham Bikes and Active Streets.
- Work with Transport for West Midlands to develop a Bike Share scheme.
- Ensure residential developments have adequate cycle storage facilities.



School Travel

We will engage with schools across the city to encourage and enable safe, sustainable and healthy modes of travel:

- Use the national Modeshift STARS scheme for work with schools and recognise excellence in promoting sustainable travel.
- Deliver a training programme for teachers and other school staff.
- Run a 'School Keep Clear' campaign to tackle inconsiderate, dangerous and illegal parking around the school gate.
- Work with Living Streets to deliver a Walk to School outreach project



Green City

We will create a cleaner, greener Birmingham, tackling the effects of man-made air pollution and climate change on our city:

- Work with the Government to introduce a Clean Air Zone for Birmingham.
- Develop a Clean Air Strategy to improve health & wellbeing for everyone.
- Support the roll-out of cleaner and greener hydrogen fuelled buses.
- Deploy a fast and rapid charge point network for electric taxis, cars and commercial vehicles
- Build on our pioneering project to retrofit black cabs with cleaner engines.
- Undertake a detailed study looking at the feasibility of creating an energy company to deliver benefits for addressing fuel poverty and decarbonisation.
- Enhance our green city with green routes for walking and cycling.



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
