CIRCUMSTANCES & THE VICTIM IS THE STORE MANAGER OF BROADSTONE ROAD, WITH THE OFFENDER BEING A REGULAR CUSTOMER. THE OFFENDER HAS PREVIOUSLY BEEN PROVIDED WITH CREDIT FROM THE STORE HOWEVER THE VICTIM HAS BEEN ADVISED BY THE STORE OWNER THAT THIS CAN NO LONGER BE DONE.

OFFICERS FIRST ATTENDED BROADSTONE NEWS, 83 BROADSTONE ROAD, STECHFORD. ALL 3 IP;S (AMBRET STREET) WERE OUTSIDE THE SHOP AND VERY IRRATE. THEIR VERSION IS THAT (1) WAS ON HER OWN SERVING IN THE SHOP WHEN THE TWO OFFENDERS (RECOLUMN SERVING IN AND REQUESTED TO SPEAK TO THE MANAGER ABOUT HIM SELLING IS 15 YEAR OLD SON AND OTHER UNDERAGE CHILDREN ALCOHOL. That, having reviewed the premises licence held under the Licensing Act 2003 by Mr Abdullah Khan in respect of Yardley Cut Price, 83 Broadstone Road, Yardley, Birmingham B26 2BY, upon the application of the Chief Officer of Weights and Measures, this Sub-Committee hereby determines that the licence be revoked, in order to promote the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, and protection of children from harm objectives in the Act.

The Sub-Committee's reasons for revoking the licence are due to concerns expressed by the responsible authorities, namely the Trading Standards department of the City Council, and West Midlands Police.

Trading Standards had submitted a Report to the Sub-Committee explaining that in November 2019, Trading Standards had received an allegation from a local resident which suggested that the shop had been selling alcohol to those under 18 years of age.

Trading Standards therefore visited the shop in the same month, in order to issue a Trader's Notice to advise the management that the underage sale of alcohol was an offence under the Licensing Act 2003, and also to put them on notice that a test purchase exercise (for underage alcohol sale) could be undertaken as a follow-up, to ensure that the licence holder was complying with his responsibilities under the legislation. Test purchasing, which is a regular part of Trading Standards' normal work, is carried out to check compliance with the law – namely whether or not a premises is prepared to sell alcohol to a teenager who is visibly under 18 years of age.

In February 2020 Trading Standards conducted a test purchasing exercise. They visited the Yardley Cut Price premises. On the day in question, two female volunteers were assisting the officers – one a 14 year old, and the other a 15 year old.

On entering the Yardley Cut Price premises, at approximately 11.25am, a Trading Standards officer stood in the shop and observed as the staff member behind the counter allowed the 15 year old volunteer to purchase a four-pack of "WKD", which is an alcopop-style pre-mixed vodka drink of 4% ABV, by selecting it from the shelf, taking it to the counter and paying for it.

The staff member behind the counter who permitted the sale did not ask the 15 year old to show some age-related ID; indeed the staff member did not even ask the



volunteer to state her age. These circumstances did not inspire confidence that the premises was properly managed, properly staffed, or capable of following the law. After leaving the shop with the volunteers, officers returned to the shop to inform the staff member that the underage sale was an offence, and that it would be reported. A further Trader's Notice was issued.

Given that the shop had proven itself incapable of handling sales of alcohol legally, despite being put on notice that a test purchase exercise could be carried out, the recommendation of Trading Standards was that the Sub-Committee should revoke the licence. This proposed course was supported by West Midlands Police, who addressed the Sub-Committee on the impact that underage sales of alcohol have on the licensing objectives.

The Sub-Committee found the information provided by the Police in the Report to be useful in explaining the effects of improper sales of alcohol on youngsters, their families and the emergency services. The Sub-Committee agreed with the Police's conclusion, namely that any licensed premises prepared to take such risks with the licensing objectives was failing to uphold the trust placed in them by the City Council.

The Sub-Committee then heard from the licence holder, through his legal representative. The Sub-Committee gave careful consideration to the licence holder's submissions, but was not remotely satisfied, given the evidence submitted by the two responsible authorities, that the premises was capable of proper operation.

The suggestion from the premises, namely that the appropriate course was to simply add some further conditions and impose a suspension of the licence, was not sufficient to ensure that the licensing objectives would be properly promoted. As the Police observed, conditions were already on the licence to cover proper operation. The issue was that poor management and a lack of responsibility (despite advance warning) were undermining the licensing objectives.

The Sub-Committee was of the view that it was impossible to have any confidence in the premises, given the management style which had been described by the responsible authorities. Accordingly the only course was to revoke the premises licence.

In reaching this decision, the Sub-Committee has given due consideration to the City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, the Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 by the Secretary of State, the application for review, the written representations received and the submissions made at the hearing.

All parties are reminded that under the provisions contained within Schedule 5 to the Licensing Act 2003, there is the right of appeal against the decision of the Licensing Authority to the Magistrates' Court, such an appeal to be made within twenty-one days of the date of notification of the decision.

The determination of the Sub-Committee does not have effect until the end of the twenty-one day period for appealing against the decision or, if there is an appeal against the decision, until the appeal is heard.

attention of Ishrat Habib and she was very clear in her response that she did not know who this person was.

For Ishrat Habib to say we did not identify ourselves in untrue and that she wasn't paying attention again is untrue, why would she proceed to show me the premise licence and her new qualification which she got from a folder.

We were told Mr Khan was on his way, although the shop wasn't busy I was conscious that we were taking room up in a small shop and that social distancing measures had to be in place. I had a very quick look in one isle where the alcohol was and then said we would wait outside.

I do not recall any children in the premises, in fact it wasn't that busy, as we remained outside I saw a couple of people go into the shop no more. There wasn't heavy traffic noise, as at the time the roads were fairly quiet as the Covid 19 lockdown was being observed.

I only recall Ishrat Habib making one call in our presence to Mr Khan.

I also call in doubt the credibility of the statement of Ishrat Habib, following from our visit we checked all the details of all the persons involved and we found someone with the exact details has a criminal conviction for importing controlled goods into a foreign country for which that person received a sizeable sentence and was then deported out of that country back to the UK.

I even sent an email to the licensing authority, asking if they had received a personal licence application for Habib as we would look to object.

I would say that it took about 5-10 minutes for Mr Khan to attend the shop. When he came to the shop we were both still outside and I called his name and he came over to us, we were standing by our vehicle. As always I produced my warrant card and identified myself as a Police licensing officer.

I asked Mr Khan who the DPS was, and initially he told me the name of the person on the proposed application, when I asked him who the DPS was now as the shop was selling alcohol. Mr Khan mentioned Mr Mailvaganam, I asked him why the lady behind the till had not heard of Mr Mailvaganam and he could give no answer.

I asked if he could contact Mr Mailvaganam as I was not convinced there was an effective DPS in place, as the person behind the till had not even heard of him. Mr Khan stated he needed to go through Abdullah Khan, and he tried to call him several times but could not get through.

I did ask Mr Awais Khan what his relationship was with Abdullah Khan and he said to me that they worked in the shop. Mr Awais Khan stated he had been the manager at the shop for the last 3 years. I then asked Mr Khan if he had met Mr Mailvaganam, he said he had a couple of times, in the years he had been there

and that he mainly came to bring stock. I asked him if he had a contact number for Mr Mailvaganam, but was told he needed to go through Mr Abdullah Khan.

Mr Awais Khan then told us the Mr Mailvaganam lived in Manchester. At this point I stated to Mr Khan that I did not believe there was an effective DPS in place and as such until they could prove that they had authorisation from Mr Mailvaganam to sell alcohol under his name then they could be committing offences.

We went back into the premises and explained this to Ishrat Habib as well. In is interesting that during the trading standards review hearing that followed our visit, they produced such an authorisation which was in writing and claimed it was there at the premises, this was not the fact at the time we visited.

Mr Awais Khan was involved in the business when the failed test purchase took place, which resulted in the trading standards review application. In the supporting documentation for that we supplied evidence that Mr Awais Khan was involved, in the business at a higher level than he is claiming now.

He is described in a crime report on 19th Jan 2020 as being the store manager, this crime report relates to credit being given for alcohol, something that was then reported at the hearing as being just for milk. The crime report is clear that is states it was for alcohol and the value of £14. The victim (Mr Awais Khan) refuses to give more credit until the tab is paid off, this indicates a higher level of involvement in the operational side of the premises.

In November 2019 West midlands police received a 999 call from the premises, where it was alleged the family of a child had come into the shop to complain and then caused problems. In the MO of the crime report it indicates that the staff member had called the manager, who then becomes one of 5 victims of a crime. This manager is identified as Mr Awais Khan. None of the 5 victims we have recorded for this incident were Abdullah Khan. It shows that the first person the shop assistant called was not Abdullah Khan but Awais Khan, again indicating a higher level of involvement.

This is the date when we received complaints that the premises were selling alcohol and cigarettes to a child of 15 years.

The statements are trying to indicate that he new proposed licence holders had less of an involvement in the premises than the evidence we have tends to show!

I am currently employed by West Midlands Police as a licensing officer.
On Friday 10 th April 2020 I was on duty with my Colleague PC Rohomon when we visited Broad News 83 Broadstone Road. B26 2BY as the premises had submitted a licensing application.
On entering the premises there was a female behind the counter who I now know to be Ishrat Habib. PC Rohomon entered the premises first and introduced himself and me to the member of staff. With both showed her our warrant / ID cards as we were both in plain clothes and both wearing jeans and trainers with a casual top.
PC Rohomon spoke with Habib and asked if she was in charge of the shop at the time, she said she wasn't but would call him and he would come to the shop an speak with us. I now know to be Awais Khan
While we were waiting for the person in charge PC Rohomon asked Habib a question, asking who had authorised her to sell alcohol. She didn't really appear to fully understand the question but gave a name other than the DPS as shown on the current premises licence at the time.
PC Rohomon as Habib if she knew the DPS as per the premises licence and showed her the name on a copy of the licence. She said she didn't know who that was.
While PC Rohomon was talking with with Habib there were a couple customers in the shop but when they approached the till the conversation stopped in order for Habib to serve the customer and then would restart. The shop door was open but there was none or very little noise coming from outside the premises. The premises itself did not seem very busy with customer footfall.
We decided to wait outside the premises for the male Habib had called as we didn't want to be inside the premises longer than necessary due to self-distancing COVID 19 regulations.
We waited outside for approximately 10 minutes when Khan arrived He walked towards after PC Rohomon had call his name, again we introduced ourselves as we had been standing by our car outside the shop.

PC Rohomon had a conversation with Khan regarding the licence application, how long he had been involved in the business and what was the relationship of the current DPS with the business. Khan stated that the DPS lived in Manchester and had only seen on a couple of occasions.

We went back into the shop with Khan and PC Rohomon told both Khan and Habib that if they continued to sell alcohol they may be committing an offence as he believed there no effective DPS in place to authorise the sale of alcohol.
