# **1.** Purpose of report:

Kamal Jit Sharma applied on 7<sup>th</sup> August 2015 for the grant of a Premises Licence for Mary Vale News, 87 Mary Vale Road, Bournville, Birmingham, B30 2DP.

Representations against the application have been received from other persons. See Appendices 1 - 11.

Representations in support of the application, including a petition, have been received from other persons. See Appendices 12 - 23.

The application is attached at Appendix 24.

A Condition has been agreed with West Midlands Police and the applicant, which is attached at Appendix 25.

Dear Licensing,

I wish to submit my objections to licence application 92424

I have been contacted by a number of concerned residents who have asked that the licence be refused as the granting of a license is likely to result in all four of the licensing objectives being broken.

I and my constituents believe that such a licence would encourage drinking in the local Cotteridge park (some 100m away) and on the former garage site at the junction of Mary Vale Road and Franklin Road, which is where young people/gangs of youths already hang out as well as causing more litter in the area. This in itself would invariably lead to an increase in alcohol fueled anti-social behaviour (causing a public nuisance) and would also put children in harms way.

Nearby Cotteridge park has already seen a number of alcohol fueled incidents of antisocial behaviour where alcohol purchased in Cotteridge or Stirchley has been brought into and consumed in the park. The premises in question is considerably closer to the park, and would almost certainly exacerbate the situation.

The property is within Bournville neighbourhood where there are currently no off sales of alcohol permitted and would create a precedent if one premise were to receive an alcohol licence. This would have almost certainly encourage other premises in Bournville to apply for off sale alcohol licences. This would destroy the special and unique character of Bournville.

The premises in question is a small, traditional news agent / sweet shop with a small amount of convenience foodstuffs. The shop is frequented by young children (often unaccompanied) and parents with children. To introduce the sale of alcohol to this shop would potentially put children in harms way

Can I also remind you that the application for an alcohol license by the nearby Tesco Express Bournville was (quite correctly) refused for the same reasons.

I spoke to your office and was advised I only needed to write in order to object. However one of my concerns is the public nuisance caused by another outlet that is allowed to sell alcohol. As I previously state there is now litter, an informal car wash, the loitering of people around the corner of the street and what appears to be an increase in number of youngish men (early 20's) using the car wash next door to the newsagent as a 'hang out'.

Once the children return to school this will become an increasingly uncomfortable place to be for them.

Again as I stressed previously there is an off licence less than a five minute walk away in Stirchley.

#### Dear Sir/Madam

I am writing to formally object to the application to sell alcohol from the convenience store at 87 Maryvale Road. I live in York Close just around the corner. My objection is based on the following:

- The increased likelihood of people congregating around the shop, which can be intimidating to passers-by, particularly as the convenience store is on a main pedestrian route to and from the train station. The trains run until the late evening (approx. 11pm) and walking past a group drinking on the street at this time will feel particularly intimidating.
- Children use and walk past the store on the way to and from school, the bus routes on Pershore Road and the train station. Child safety could be put at risk if individuals and groups congregate in the area and are drinking.
- The increased likelihood of alcohol being consumed in Cotteridge Park, which is an important and very well used community resource. This will likely increase the frequency and severity of anti-social behaviour and litter.
- It is likely to damage the ethos and safe atmosphere in Bournville, which is in no small part attributable to the lack of places to purchase alcohol. I understand that technically the corner shop is not in the BVT, however in reality its location feels very much part of Bournville.
- Alcohol is available for consumption next door in the Working Mens Social Club, so there is already
  opportunities to consume alcohol nearby. The drinking takes place within the Club however, whilst if sold
  from the shop drinking is more likely to take place on the street and in the Park. It is likely that Police call
  outs will increase, placing additional costs on Policing.
- If people wish to purchase alcohol for consumption at home, the Co-op is only just down the road which sells a wide selection of alcohol.
- Unlike places like Moseley and Kings Heath, Bournville does not really have any restaurants or any at all with a bring your own bottle policy. The convenience stores in Moseley and Kings Heath sell alcohol to service these restaurant goers, therefore alcohol is consumed in a restaurant with a meal. If 87 Maryvale is granted an alcohol licence the only options can be in the home or on the street.

I do not believe that this proposal is widely known. I only noticed a small A4 letter attached to the shutters of the convenience store. It is not legible or particularly noticeable if you are walking by on the pavement. I suggest that larger posters and even direct letter drops would be necessary to ensure all local residents are informed and have the opportunity to comment.

In addition to this and as previously mentioned, Bournville has managed to remain free of beers wines and spirits being sold across the counters in shops since the 1800s and I can see no reason for it to start now when there are plenty of places within walking distance, but outside Bournville, where alcohol can be bought.

Bournville has a beautiful friendly and safe park less than 200 yards away in Franklin Road and the last thing we need is underage kids and 'troubled' adults using the park as a place to consume drink sourced so near by.

I am very upset and concerned about the impact this would have on the residential streets surrounding the shop and immediate areas. There have been previous issues with anti-social behaviour around Cotteridge Park/Cotteridge and this can only add to the problem. Young people congregate on the corner of this shop currently so the fact that they will also be able to buy alcohol will just make the situation worse. My elderly neighbours have already expressed deep concern about the availability of alcohol in an area they have always previously felt safe in.

I feel this application has been dealt with inappropriately. I have been informed that the owner of the shop has asked customers to sign a petition to agree to the application when purchasing from the shop. Some residents may feel under pressure to agree to this, particularly the elderly.

It would be very much appreciated if a colleague can confirm why letters have not been issued from Birmingham City Council to the local residents informing them that an application has been made. A small notice in a shop window is surely not a sufficient way to convey the information to residents.




