Following introductions and an outline of the procedure by the Chair, David Kennedy, Licensing Section, made introductory comments relating to the report.

Sarah Clover made the following points:

- a) The reason that it was necessary to make representations against the interim steps imposed was that the company, financially, could not last the 3 weeks until the full hearing. The company had recently opened a premises in Coventry and the Birmingham venue was subsidising those premises. 25 staff in Birmingham and a further 8 in Coventry were at risk and were awaiting their wages. In addition the landlord was owed rent.
- b) It was her understanding that there was no appetite to close the premises by the Authority but if the interim steps were not amended to allow the premises to trade then the premises would have to close for financial reasons.
- c) Carl Moore and Matthew Eason had had a meeting with West midlands Police the previous day for detailed discussions. An operating plan had been put forward but the police had indicated that that should have been done before and did not change anything.
- d) The premises had operated since 1982 and had for many years been known as a venue serving the LGBT community. Mr Eason had taken over in 2005. In recent years the demographics of the clientele had changed and problems were been created that the police were not happy with. It was now the intention to change the operating model back to catering for the LGBT community which the operating plan was setting out to achieve. It was intended to have staff on the door from 2200 hours. It was intended to control the migration from other bars and close at 0400 hours on Tuesday and Wednesdays. In addition last admission on other days would be 0400 hours. Other measures that would be introduced were polycarbonate glasses and body cameras. There was no issue with the introduction of a ID scanner but it was questioned how effective it would be in addressing the issues and would be an additional expense.

- e) The situation improved over the Christmas period but it was disputed that there had been a spike in the number of incidents in February 2018 as had been suggested by the police. Following the nasty incident on 28 March the police had looked at their logs again and highlighted a number of calls to the premises.
- f) The premises' logs indicated that during the same period there had been a couple of incidents where the police had been called to the premises. These included a person picking up other peoples drinks and an issue with the girlfriend of one of the door staff. The premises disputed the suggestion that underage drinking was taking place on the premises. The reference to 'significant injuries' in the Police's documentation was misleading as the only injury had been to a member of door staff.
- g) Regarding the incident on 28 March it was emphasised that the person had got past door security and the incident had been unforeseen. For this reason the premises were of the view that it should not be connected to other concerns of the police.
- h) It was noted that there are no conditions relating to the number of door staff required and on the night of the incident on 28 March 2018, when it became known that a door supervisor had called in sick, steps were taken to obtain the services of another door supervisor who unfortunately did not arrive until after the incident had occurred. Not problems were anticipated by having only one door supervisor available so the decision was made to open.
- i) The police appeared not to be treating the incident as a priority as they had only attended the premises yesterday to obtain the CCTV footage of the incident because the relevant officer was on leave.
- j) It was believed that the victim was hospitalised overnight and would recover fully from his injuries.
- k) The premises believed that the action plan had worked and the police had never used their power of veto for use of the premises beyond 0400 hours. The action plan was an ongoing relationship between the premises and the police and Mr Eason was in regular contact with the police via email.

Responding to questions from Members of the Sub-Committee and the Committee's legal advisor, Sarah Clover and Matthew Eason made the following points:-

- a) At the meeting with the police PC Reader hadhad concerns relating to the totality of the plan.
- b) Whilst body cameras had not been introduced other actions had been taken relating to a dress code, security, the provision of a drag artist to welcome people at the door, CCTV and drug use policy.

At this point in the meeting copies of the action plan were circulated:-

(See document No. 2)

At 1050 hour the meeting was adjourned and all present, with the exception of the Members, the Committee Lawyer and the Committee Manager withdraw from the room.

At 1100 hours the meeting reconvened and all parties returned to the room. Sarah Clover and Matthew Eason continued answering questions from Members:

- c) The difference between the October Action plan and the current one were outlined and in addition to those matters raised in b) above staff training was mentioned.
- d) It was acknowledge that the limited door staff on the 28 March 2018 was not correct and steps had been taken to ensure the correct numbers were on the door and elsewhere in the premises in the future. This would be 2 on the door and a further person circulating throughout the premises.
- e) With regard to staff training staff had been informed of a meeting with the between Moore Secure and bar staff tomorrow. Health and safety and fire training would be undertaken. Further training would be undertaken before the premises reopened.
- f) It was anticipated that the new plan could be brought in to use as soon as the premises reopened.
- g) The views of West Midlands Police were welcome and there was an ongoing dialogue between the premise and the police.

PCs Rohomon and Reader made the following points on behalf of West Midlands Police:

- a) The issue of the a certificate under section 53A (1)(B) of the Licensing Act 2003 was a very serious business and the issuing Officer had to be certain that serious crime and disorder had taken place at the premises.
- b) An incident had taken place which following investigation had led to the arrest of the offender. Following interview that person had been released on bail. The matter was serious.
- c) A meeting had taken place between the Licensee and the police. Matters discussed were those that the Sub-committee had heard so far in the meeting. By the end of the meeting the previous day the premises had not advised what their business plan was and had repeatedly evaded answering the question 'What is your business model?' Therefore the police had only seen the plan that morning.

- d) The problem was the late night hours that the premises operated and people coming from other premises and the plan had very little change to the one produced at the first meeting.
- e) Regarding door staff, conditions were proposed previously to deal with the people who came from other premises.
- f) The Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) was an experienced person and should be aware of the 4 objectives of the Licensing Act and appropriate measures should have been in place from the start.
- g) The DPS had blamed the door supervisors but it was his plan and he employed them. It was felt that this demonstrated a lack of management control which led the police to have little faith in him. In addition management of other parts of the business could be improved.
- h) There had been a drop in problem over the Christmas as the premises had employed more security staff and then had reduced the numbers.
- i) West Midlands Police were disappointed that the premises had not offered any conditions at the meeting the previous day or indeed at the present meeting. No paperwork had been forthcoming at the meeting the previous day. What has been produced did not address the control of the late night admissions from other premises which were causing the problems.
- j) There was no proof that staff had been trained in a proper fashion.
- k) The financial situation at the premises did not outweigh public safety or the 4 objectives of the Licensing Act.

Responding to questions from Members of the Sub-Committee and the Committee's legal advisor, PCs Rohomon and Reader made the following points:-

- a) West Midlands Police had been in discussions with Matthew Eason on how procedures could be overhauled to change times and have 3 door staff in place at all times licensable activities were taking place. It was conceded that on occasions it had not been possible to speak to each other as both parties were busy.
- b) The hours the premises remained open allowed people to leave other premises when they closed between 0200-0300 hours and gain access to Glamourous.
- c) It remained the view of the police that the interim steps should remain in place as the police were concerned that the DPS continued to blame others and he would continue running the premises in the same way without producing a robust plan being produced. There were still concerns relating to staff training. For these reasons West Midlands Police had no confidence that the premises would managed correctly.

In summing up PCs Rohomon and Reader, on behalf of West Midlands Police made the following points:

- a) They had heard nothing new that would satisfy them that the suspension could be lifted.
- b) The way forward was that a proper action plan needed to be in place. Although such a document had been circulated at the meeting it was emphasised that West Midlands Police had not had time to go through it.
- c) The action plan had not been written when the expedited review had been lodged.
- d) The view of West Midlands Police was that the suspension of the licence should remain in place.

In summing up, Sarah Clover, acting on behalf of the premises, made the following points;

- a) The police had required the plan to be a written document yet when such a document was produced they then criticised it.
- b) In reality the document was made up of a combination of proposals that the police would have seen before. It was more descriptive and a much improved document from that produced in October. There was no reason for the police not to have confidence in it.
- c) The ID problems had been cured and the steps taken to overcome them had been successful.
- d) Glamourous had always been a destination and late night venue since 2005 opening to 0600 hours and for the police to suggest otherwise was unfair.
- e) It was now the intention to concentrate on encouraging people from the LGBT community to visit the premises to move away from people from other premises. This was in direct response to the incident that took place on 28 March 2018.
- f) The underage issue related to the girlfriend of one of the door staff had come to the premises. The member of staff no longer worked at the premises. That had no bearing on the incident on 28 March 2018.
- g) It was emphasised that the Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor was an able and good operator who the police could have confidence in. There were no issues of non-compliance as suggested by the police. For these reasons the premises could safely reopen.

 Section 182 Guidance indicated that the financial situation of the Licence Holder could be considered and weighted during the decision making. It was necessary to reopen as staff with families would have to be laid off soon

At 1145 hours the Sub-Committee adjourned and the Chairman requested that all present, with the exception of the Members, the Committee Lawyer and the Committee Manager withdraw from the meeting.

At 1325 hours all parties were recalled to the meeting and the decision of the Sub-Committee was announced as follows:-

01/110418 **RESOLVED**:-

That, having considered the representations made on behalf of Mr Matthew James Eason the premises licence holder for Glamourous Show Bar, Albany House, 27-35 Hurst Street, Birmingham, B5 4BD in respect of the interim step imposed on the 29 March 2018, this Sub-Committee hereby determines to retain the interim step of suspension of the premises licence.

The Sub-Committee carefully considered the representations made by, and on behalf of, the premises licence holder but were not satisfied at this stage that it was appropriate and proportionate to modify the existing Interim Step of suspension, so as to allow the premises to effectively re-open and undertake licensable activities.

Concerning the incident on the early hours of 28 March 2018 and the history of other reported crime at the venue in the run up to the Expedited Review application being submitted, the Sub-Committee accepted that there were discrepancies between the two parties in relation to compliance with the premises' Action Plan which the premises were placed on in October 2017. However, the incident which gave rise to the Review application itself was not disputed and clearly involved serious crime and/or serious disorder.

The Sub-Committee felt that it was not appropriate at this stage to modify the Interim Step of suspension in the context of the West Midlands Police's continuing concerns about having confidence in the Premises Licence Holder and his ability to properly promote the licensing objectives.

Although, a constructive meeting had taken place between the two parties on the 10 April 2018, this was very much in the opinion of the Sub-Committee the start of a discussion about how the premises licence holder should address the Police's continuing serious concerns around the prevention of crime and disorder, specifically seeking to establish the root causes of these matters and how they should be dealt with moving forwards.

The Sub-Committee did feel the arguments around modifying the interim step of suspension were finely balanced, and were pleased to note that the premises licence holder had prepared an Operating Plan for the premises should the Sub-Committee have agreed to lift the suspension. However, they were equally concerned that the plan, which was submitted to them as part of the premises

licence holder representations, had only been formally presented to the Police on the morning of today's meeting, and at the Polices request, from the meeting which had taken place the day before.

Although the legal representative for the premises licence holder submitted that the submitted Plan contained "nothing new", the Sub-Committee had expected more constructive discussions to have taken place between the parties involving a more formal review of the venues policies and procedures, including all appropriate risk assessments and how these would be actioned as conditions and evidenced by the venue. That said, the Sub-Committee felt it was nevertheless important to note that the premises licence through their engagement of CNA Risk Management Ltd would be seeking to address these specific issues.

The Sub-Committee therefore considers at present that the suspension of the premises licence until determination of the review hearing remains necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

In reaching this decision, the Sub-Committee has given due consideration to the guidance issued by the Home Office under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 in relation to expedited and summary licence reviews, the Certificate issued by West Midlands Police under Section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003 and the application for review and the representations made at the hearing by the Police, Premises Licence Holder, and their legal representative.

The premises licence holder may make representations against the interim steps taken by the licensing authority.

On receipt of such representations, the licensing authority must (if the representations are not withdrawn) hold a hearing within 48 hours of their receipt. When calculating the 48 hour period, any non-working day can be disregarded. Where the licensing authority has already held a hearing to consider representations against the interim steps, the holder of the licence may only make further representations if there has been a material change in circumstances.

All parties are advised that there is no right of appeal to a magistrates' court against the decision of the Licensing Authority at this stage.

1. Purpose of report:

As a result of a closure order being issued by the Magistrates Court under section 80 of the Antisocial Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 the Licensing Authority is required to review the premises licence in accordance with section 167 (1) & (2) of the Licensing Act 2003.

2. Recommendation:

To consider this review and to determine this matter.

3. Brief Summary of Report:

As a result of the Licensing Authority receiving notification that the Magistrates Court has issued a closure order in respect of Arabian Nites, Part of 52-68 Bissell Street, Digbeth, Birmingham, B5 7HP the authority is required to review the premises licence.

A representation has been received from West Midlands Police, as a responsible authority.

4. Compliance Issues:

4.1 Consistency with relevant Council Policies, Plans or Strategies:

The report complies with the City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Council's Corporate Plan to improve the standard of all licensed persons, premises and vehicles in the City.

5. Relevant background/chronology of key events:

On the 5th July 2018 Birmingham Magistrates Court notified the Licensing Authority that they had issued a closure order in respect of Arabian Nites, Part of 52-68 Bissell Street, Digbeth, Birmingham, B5 7HP in accordance with section 80 of the Anti-social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014.

As a result of receiving notification of the closure order the Licensing Authority is required to review the premises licence granted to QR Holdings Limited in respect of the aforementioned venue.

A copy of the closure order issued by the Magistrates Court is attached as Appendix 1.

The review application was advertised, by the Licensing Authority in accordance with the regulations; the closing date for responsible authorities and other parties ended on 12th July 2018.

A representation has been received from West Midlands Police, as a responsible authority. See Appendix 2.

The Premises Licence is attached at Appendix 3.

Site location plans are attached at Appendix 4.

When carrying out its licensing functions, a licensing authority must have regard to Birmingham City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Guidance issued by the Secretary of State under s182 of the Licensing Act 2003.

The Licensing Authority is also required to take such steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, which are: -

- a. The prevention of crime and disorder;
- b. Public safety;
- c. The prevention of public nuisance; and
- d. The protection of children from harm.

West Midlands Police have obtained an ASB closure notice for 3 months against Arabian Nites. The background to this closure was the discharge of a firearm from within the licensed area of Arabian Nites. The firearm discharge, ricocheted and then hit an innocent member of the public who was at an event in the premises, fortunately this caused only slight injuries. A bullet fragment was found on the stairwell within the licensed premises. There was an event in the basement section of the premises which is shown on the plan as the bowling alley, although through the course of the investigation it would appear changes have been made to the layout of the premises which are not reflected in the licensed plan for the premises.

At the initial ASB application the premises maintained they were not open, and showed CCTV via a mobile phone of the front to confirm they were not open. Also during the court hearing a person purporting to be the IP tried to obtain access to the court, he was prevented and so handed in a note saying that he was the injured party and wanted to retract his statement. Officers have since investigated this and it appears that the person attending court was not the injured person, as he was of a different ethnic group. This was viewed with suspicion by West Midlands Police as an attempt to distance themselves from the incident which they denied had taken place.

After collating further evidence West Midlands Police reapplied for the ASB closure notice, providing evidence that the firearm discharge-

- Did take place
- A person was injured
- It was within the licensed area of the premises of Arabian Nites
- That the IP had not attended court or retracted his statement
- Officers were prevented access to Arabian Nites for a period of time
- Access could have been granted through the landlords office but this was not offered or discovered until officers had forced entry into the building

Through the second application Birmingham Magistrates court issued the 3 month closure against Arabian Nites and indicated that all areas on the licensed plan were now closed.

West Midlands Police are seriously concerned that crime and disorder, and public safety objectives within the Licensing Act are being compromised by Arabian Nites. During the investigation officers were able to access partial CCTV (that was not password protected) which showed the discharge of the firearm and the injured persons. When officers went back to the premises several days later with a warrant to seize the remaining cctv, they were delayed in getting in, and then discovered that the cctv had been removed, in what officers described as a hurry, preventing officers from obtaining the evidence needed.

At the court hearing the premises introduced the CCTV engineer who confirmed he had taken the CCTV at the request of the premises, however he had not been told to download any footage (contrary to what the premises management had told officers when they executed the warrant), and that the hard drives were actually delivered back to the premises 20 minutes after the Police had left the premises and yet the premises did not inform the Police, or had done anything with the hard drives.

During the court proceedings the premises introduced CCTV footage which they claimed was Tenesha Stewart, opening the fire doors from Arthouse and using the car park, and that is how they had gained to Arabian Nites. If this is true and this was not established as fact, there is serious concern that the premise licence holders are either

allowing people to use their licence and then denying involvement or have no control on who uses their premise licence and so there is no effective control on these premises.

At the time of the incident Arthouse had had its premise licence suspended and so should not have been operating.

West Midlands Police will be attending the licensing hearing on the 19th July and will be represented by the same counsel that we used during the court proceedings – Mr James Rankin

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises— (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner, (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either— (a) a holographic mark, or (b) an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person must ensure that— (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures— (i) beer or cider: ½ pint; (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

(1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. (2) In this condition:— (a) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula $P = D + (D \times V)$, where— (i) P is the permitted price, (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; (b) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979; (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence— (i) the holder of the premises licence, (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence; (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994. (3) Where

the permitted price would not be a whole number of pennies, the permitted price shall be taken to be the price rounded up to the nearest penny. (4) Where the permitted price on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax, the permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

The admission of children under the age of 18 to film exhibitions permitted under the terms of this licence shall be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made: (a) By the British Board of Film Classification (BBFC), where the film has been classified by that Board, or (b) By the Licensing Authority where no classification certificate has been granted by the BBFC, or, where the licensing authority has notified the licence holder that section 20(3)(b) (s74(3)(b) for clubs) of the Licensing Act 2003 applies to the film.

Each individual assigned to carrying out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Agency.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with operating schedule

2a) General conditions consistent with the operating schedule

Regulated Entertainment shall take place indoors only.

The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that if any adult entertainment is introduced to the premises, then it will only be done after giving at least 14 days notice to the Police Authority.

The security levels at any event will be dependent on the risk assessment and such number as is agreed shall become a condition of the Premises Licence.

2b) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of crime and disorder

The premises must operate an incident book and record all incidents that occur inside and immediately outside the premises. Incident book can be inspected at any time upon request. The incident book to be available for inspection by any regulatory body.

All training records for all the staff, in regard to drunkenness and the protection from harm for children to be maintained, and to be available upon request from any regulatory body.

Premises to operate a drugs policy and lost / found property policy. Copies of both to be supplied to the Licensing Department. Steelhouse Lane Police Station.

Venue to ensure the entrance area together with the queuing area to be well illuminated by secure lighting to a high standard and maintained.

The premises is to maintain staff profiles for all door staff working at the premises, and for any door staff that have worked on the premises in the last three months. The door staff profile will consist of identification for the member of staff.

A copy of his / her SIA Badge. Passport or driving licence.

If the proof of identification is anything other than the photo driving licence, then the member of staff will need proof of address, which must be a utility bill and to be dated within the last six months

Door supervisors stationed outside the frontage of the premises will wear high visibility jackets /coats and will have their SIA badge held in a clear arm sleeve holder. Door supervisors inside the premises will wear hi visibility waist coats, again with the SIA badge positioned in a clear arm 'sleeve holder in visible view to the public.

The CCTV system is to be installed at the premises to the specification agreed with the licensing Department at Steelhouse Lane Police Station. CCTV is to be operational whilst the premises are open and be recording continually. If a hard drive system is used the recordings are to be kept for a minimum of 31 days. CCTV images to be made available to any responsible authority immediately on request.

Premises must supply a full month's list of events in writing to the Licensing Department at Steelhouse Lane Police Station, month in advance.

If the premises use a new promoter for any event, then for the first event the management for the premises will arrange to meet at Steelhouse Lane Police Station. Licensing Department at least 28 days before the first event, with the risk assessments for the event. The premises will not hold any new events without the prior agreement of the Licensing Department at Steelhouse Lane Police Station. Recommendations made to the management that satisfy the four licensing objectives will become conditions for that event on the premises licence.

Premises to supply a risk assessment for all events held at the premises. A required 28 days notice unless otherwise agreed with the West Midlands Police Licensing Department at Steelhouse Lane Police Station. Included in the risk assessment is a search policy which will reflect the event risk and security deployment plan.

The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that a fixed camera will be placed on the outside of the premises at the entrance with the ability to monitor any queue and the Door staff to augment the fixed camera and monitor any queue.

The Premises Licence Holder will make adequate provisions for monitoring and controlling the number of persons entering the licensed premises and any temporary structures within it. The Licence Holder will make all necessary arrangements by way of fencing, gate systems, security and other provisions to prevent unauthorised access to the licensed premises.

The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that individuals who are drunk, disorderly or both will not be permitted access to the premises.

2c) Conditions consistent with, and to promote, public safety

No enforceable conditions identified from operating schedule.

2d) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of public nuisance

The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure the conduct of patrons leaving premises will be supervised and monitored to minimise potential nuisance. Similarly, conduct of the general public in the vicinity will be monitored and the Police advised of inappropriate behaviour/unlawful activity.

The Premises Licence Holder shall not permit noise emanating from the licensed premises to unreasonably disturb persons in the neighbourhood and in any case, will ensure that the noise levels from the event during the times authorised by this licence shall not exceed levels set at neighbouring occupied residential properties that will be agreed with Responsible Authorities.

The Premises Licence holder shall ensure that whenever regulated entertainment takes place within the licensed premises, such entertainment will not be such as to be a statutory nuisance in the nearest noise sensitive or residential premises.

Noise propagation tests will be undertaken, during which the sound systems will be configured and operated in a similar manner as intended for the relevant Event. The sound sources used for the test shall be similar in character to the music likely to be produced during the relevant Event. Appropriate control limits at each sound mixer position and adjustments to sound amplification equipment will be agreed as a result of the testing to the satisfaction of the appropriate Responsible Authority.

2e) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the protection of children from harm


The premises shall adopt the Challenge 25 Scheme and appropriate signage will be placed at the entrance to the premises and adjacent to any bar servery. The premises will operate a policy whereby any person attempting to buy alcohol or any person attempting to gain entry to the premises who appears to be under 25 will be asked for photographic ID to prove their age. The only ID that will be accepted is a passport, driving licence with a photograph or an accredited proof of age card bearing the PASS mark hologram.

If the premises wish to conduct an underage event (that is involving anyone under the age of 18 years on the premises) the premise must inform the Licensing Department at Steelhouse Lane Police Station a minimum of 28 days in advance. The management must contact Steelhouse Lane and arrange for a meeting with the promoter and the management to discuss the risk assessment. Any such event will be treated as high risk. West midlands Police will have a power of veto over any such event.







Both this previous application and the current application concern the discharge of a firearm inside Arabian Nites at approximately 05:45 hours on Saturday 26 May 2018.

On 29 May 2018, the court found that WMP's evidence did not meet the :--- ---relevant statutory threshold and that there were clear inconsistencies between WMP evidence and evidence given on behalf of Arabian Nites by its manager and co-owner, Mr Daniel Alawi.

og some population, par distance, since Mr Alawi claimed in evidence that Arabian Nites closed at approximately 01:00 hours on 26 May 2018 and had remained closed when the above mentioned firearms incident occurred. In evidence, Mr Alawi relied upon CGTV purportedly available from 76 cameras within Arabjan Nites, which he had on his mobile phone. He showed multiple clips of motion activated CCTV to support his assertion that Arabian Nites was closed, and that it was impossible for the incident to have occurred inside Arabian Nites.

Since this date, WMP has investigated both the firearms discharge and the above account given by Mr Alawi in greater detail.

WMP submits that the evidence relied upon in this application shows that the firearms incident in question occurred inside Arabian Nites.

WMP goes on to submit that this incident was so serious that it creates the necessity for the making of a closure order. Mr Alawi appears to have lied under oath to distance Arabian Nites from the incident or lacks control over Arabian Nites to the point that it has operated without his knowledge or consent; and resulted in potentially fatal violence as well as causing a significant threat to members of the public.

WMP respectfully submits that: (1) people have engaged in disorderly, offensive or criminal behaviour on the premises; (2) the use of the premises has resulted in, and if an order is not made, is likely to result in serious nuisance to members of the public; and, (3) if an order is not made, there is likely to be serious disorder and criminality near those premises associated with the use of those premises.

WMP remains very concerned that the continued operation of Arabian Nites will lead to a member of the public suffering serious or fatal harm. Therefore, WMP submits that a closure order is necessary to prevent the above mentioned criminal behaviour, serious nuisance or disorder from continuing, recurring or occurring.

For completeness, WMP has applied for a closure order as opposed to an expedited licensing review because Arabian Nites does not appear to rely on having a licence to sell alcohol to attract business from members of the public. It is distinct from a pub or nightclub in this respect. Whilst Arabian Nites has a licence to sell alcohol, the provision of entertainment, food and shisha pipes appear to be equally significant factors for members of the public to attend. Accordingly, the WMP submits that a closure order is the most appropriate measure to safeguard members of the public.

I went inside with PC 3724 ADDISON & PC 3833 CAVALLARO to check that there were no injured people or a scene that needed preserving. - I am PC 21743 HITCHMOUGH of the West Midlands Police ('WMP'), currently on Small Heath and Highgate Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT) covering these two areas as stated.
- 2) My duties include both the patroling of and responding to incidents that take place within Small Heath and Highgate area of Birmingham. In addition, I work with partner agencies, such as the local Businesses and also Birmingham City Council (BCC) to assist in the prevention and detection of crime.
- 3) I make this witness statement in relation to ARABIAN NITES SHISHA LOUNGE, 54 76 BISSELL STREET, HIGHGATE, BIRMINGHAM, WEST MIDLANDS, B7 7HP. This information is from my own knowledge and belief save where stated.

ARABIAN NITES

- 4) ARABIAN NITES has a licence to operate as a restaurant, show plays, films, indoor sporting events, live music, recorded music, performances of dance, anything of similar description to that falling within (live music) (recorded music) or performances of dance, late night refreshment and sale of alcohol by retail (both on and off the premises). Birmingham City Council granted the license on 18th July 2016 and the Designated Premises Holder is Mr Amandeep Uppal.
- 5) I am familiar with the layout and have attended ARABIAN NITES on several occasions over the last 2 years. I have been in several different rooms during this period. I am aware that ARABIAN NITES is on two floors and has a large basement. The basement has been used as a bowling alley and a nightclub. I have been shown around the premises by management on previous occasions and have attended the location for various reasons.

Attendance with Sec 8 search warrant Thursday 31st May 2018

- 6) At approximately 16:23hrs on Thursday 31st MAY 2018, I attended ARABIAN NITES SHISHA LOUNGE, BISSELL STREET, HIGHGATE in relation to a SECTION 8 warrant. The intention of the warrant to my understanding was to secure and preserve evidence in relation to CCTV at the location in relation to a recent shooting at the venue. I attended this premises with several of my colleagues and officers from CID.
- 7) On arrival at the premises it was clearly shut. The main entrance had its shutter completely down. There was no sound or movement coming from inside the venue. The rear wooden door at the far end of the premises that you can access via the car park was locked shut. This was the same for the other wooden door leading to the fire escape on BISSELL STREET. I then informed DC 8116 HARRISON (CID) that I was aware of a site manager's office and that we should try there before forcing entry. I then escorted DC HARRISON to an office on the first floor of the SATURN BUILDING that is adjoined to the ARABIAN NITES SHISHA LOUNGE.

- 8) DC HARRISON and I then entered the SATURN BUILDING and made our way to the first floor. Inside the manager's office was an Asian male, aged around 45 years who —spoke to DC HARRISON. I heard the male confirm that he was in charge of the premises and that he would send one of his workers down to the front of ARABIAN NITES who would allow us access into the building. DC HARRISON explained to the male that he had a warrant to search the premises.
- 9) Around 40 minutes later PS 4012 AHMED who is MOE trained attended the location. PS AHMED forced entry into the premise via a locked door just behind the fire exit door shown on page 1 of Police Exhibit DH/1. No representative from ARABIAN NITES or the SATURN BUILDING attended to allow us entry into the building.
- 10) I then entered ARABIAN NITES through this door and made why way down a dark corridor and into the main seating area. I then made my way down a flight of stairs just off the main seating area that leads into the basement where I was aware that there is a bowling alley. I then made my way through a small seating area and through a set of doors into the bowling alley area. It was evident that the bowling area had been taken away and replaced with a dance floor. At the far end of the dance floor was a DJ booth where the bowling pins would normally be. As I continued to walk around and enter the area I knew as the arcade room a store cupboard was open where all of the bowling equipment and been stored away. I then made my way up a flight of stairs next to the arcade area that leads back up to the first floor. Next to these stairs is a large glass cabinet that hosts a lizard. I know this as it is a unique and memorable thing to have in a nightclub.
- 11) Since visiting the premises, on MONDAY 4th JUNE 2018 I have viewed several images taken by SOCO 51520 PAUL TEBBUT on the 26th MAY 2018 following the allegation in question of a shooting at ARABIAN NITES. I can say and confirm that I recognize these images to be of the basement area of ARABIAN NITES that include the area of the bowling alley mentioned above and the distinctive glass cabinet housing a lizard.
- 12) I have also viewed PC 0409 BENTLEY's Police issued body cam from the Sec 8 warrant he attended with me on the 31st MAY 2018. PC BENTLEY enters ARABIAN NITES though the forced entrance point and then makes his way down a short corridor. He then turns left towards a flight of stairs leading to the arcade area as described above. PC BENTLEY then makes his way through the bowling alley area

where he joins me. I can produce a document DH/1 that compares images SOCO 51520 PAUL TEBBUT took and still images from PC BENTLEY's body cam.

ARABIAN NITES comparison images Police Exhibit DH/1.

13) PAGE 1: Shows a still image taken from PC BENTLEY's body cam. This image is taken from BISSELL STREET looking at the side fire escape of ARABIAN NITES. Directly behind this door was locked door that officers forced open to gain entry into the premises.

PAGE 2: The above image is taken by SOCO 51520 PAUL TEBBUT (Image 1) This shows the stairway leading to the arcade area next to the bowling alley area.

The picture underneath is a still image taken from PC BENTLEY's body cam.

Both images are of the same location inside ARABIAN NITES.

PAGE 3: The above image is taken by SOCO 51520 PAUL TEBBUT (Image 2) This shows the top of the stairwell described above. As you can see, there is half back stool to the left of the image next to a white counter with a black surface top. This area to my knowledge is the area that officers recovered a fired bullet.

The picture underneath is a still image taken from PC BENTLEY's body cam as he is halfway down the stairwell looking back towards the top of the stairs. As you can see the half back stool is in the same place and position as in the previous photo.

PAGE 4: The above image is taken by SOCO 51520 PAUL TEBBUT (Image 3) This shows the bar area next to the bowling alley. From the picture, the bar area at the top is curved with two lights hanging from the ceiling in the middle. There is a white table to the left of the bar and a small table directly in front of the bar. To the right of the bar there is a black door leading to a storage area. There is also a table folded up that is leaning against the wall to the far right.

The picture underneath is a still image taken from PC BENTLEY's body cam. This is clearly the same location as the above mentioned items match up in every detail.

PAGE 5: The above image is taken by SOCO 51520 PAUL TEBBUT (Image 4) This shows the stairwell in the basement area next to the bowling alley area and in front of the areade area. At the bottom of the stairwell to the left there is a distinctive mark in the wood. I have circled this is red. To the right of the stairwell you can see a glass cabinet with a bright white light inside that houses a lizard that I mentioned in point 10. There is a green and white illuminated fire escape sign directly in the middle of the stairwell hanging from the ceiling. To the left of the picture against the wall there is a small table with a black base and a wooden top. To the right of the stair well there is a red fire extinguisher attached to the wall

The picture underneath is a still image taken from PC BENTLEY's body cam. I have circled in red the same distinctive mark as you can see in Image 4. The other above mentioned items also match up exactly as described.

There is no doubt in my mind that all of these images are of the same location and are inside the ARABIAN NITES premises.

- 14) As I continued to walk around the ARABIAN NITES, on the ground floor in the far right hand corner of the venue towards the back was a set of stairs leading to 2 above floors. These stairs had door in front of them that was unlocked. The first floor had a large landing with 2 doors. One door was close to the top of the stairs and the one down a corridor to the left. The first door was locked as it leads into some kind of Islamic teaching centre or Mosque. The second door down the corridor lead into another corridor then ran from left to right. As I opened this door I could see that it lead back towards the SATURN CENTRE offices. I also recognised this corridor from a previous visit to the SATURN CENTRE. It is my belief that the manager at the SATURN CENTRE would have known about this entrance and could have allowed access into ARABIAN NITES via this entry immediately when we DC HARRISON informed him of the warrant.
- 15) I can also produce a copy of the lay out of the premises of ARABIAN NITES ground floor and basement. Police Exhibit DH/2. I can use this to talk the court through my statement if required to do so. This may allow the court a better understanding of the descriptions in my statement.





I tried knocking loudly on the door in order to try to get the attention of anybody who may be inside, but nobody answered the door.

DC HARRISON made two attempts to call the owner, but did not get any response. He left a voicemail for him.

DC HARRISON informed me that the maintainance man who was originally going to let us into the premises was also no longer in the office. I had serious concerns that evidence was either being damaged, destroyed, or removed from the location, and that the delay in allowing us entry was to allow for this to happen.

A member of staff has arrived at the location - EBRAMA BOJANG. He told me that he did not have any keys to the venue, but had turned up to do his shift. He told me that someone would be inside, and was surpised when I told him that nobody appeared to be at the address.

The time had passed 1700hrs - when the venue was scheduled to open. I believed that this was now a deliberate attempt to frustrate the object of the search.

PS4012 AHMED - who had arrived as an MOE trained officer - forced entry through a wooden door into the premises. We entered the premises, and found nobody in there. The CCTV hard drives had been removed. The wires that previously connected it appeared damaged, and it appeared to me that the hard drives had been hastily ripped out. I believe that this happened whilst we were outside the premises.

The venue itself was vast. It was difficult to find my way around. Walking through insecure doors I was able to walk to various other exits that led to the neighbouring Arabic School - which was open to the street - and also to the office for the landlord MR RAFIQ. Had we been informed of this we could have avoided causing any damage upon entry. It also struck me that somebody could have entered the location and removed the CCTV hard drives and left through one of these other exits whilst we were being delayed.

There was a computer base unit next to the CCTV rack. I believed that this may have been used to back up some of the CCTV footage. This was therefore seized by DC HARRISON.

Whilst present at the location the owner - DANIEL ALAWI () - arrived at the location. He expressed displeasure at the Police having executed a warrant at his address. He informed me that the CCTV hard drives were with a technician to allow it to be downloaded for the courts. I have asked him for details of this technician and he has told me he would not tell me and I would have to speak to his barrister.

I have shown him the damage caused by the entry, and also shown him the computer base unit that was being seized and explained my reason for doing so.





- 2) My duties include both the patroling of and responding to incidents that take place within Small Heath and Highgate area of Birmingham. In addition, I work with partner agencies, such as the local Businesses and also Birmingham City Council (BCC) to assist in the prevention and detection of crime.
- 3) I make this witness statement in relation to ARABIAN NITES SHISHA LOUNGE, 54 76 BISSELL STREET, HIGHGATE, BIRMINGHAM, WEST MIDLANDS, B7 7HP. This information is from my own knowledge and belief save where stated.

Arabian Nites

- 4) Arabian Nites has a licence to operate as a restaurant, show plays, films, indoor sporting events, live music, recorded music, performances of dance, anything of similar description to that falling within (live music) (recorded music) or performances of dance, late night refreshment and sale of alcohol by retail (both on and off the presmies). Birmingham City Council granted the license on 18th July 2016 and the Designated Premises Holder is Mr Amandeep Uppal.
- The licence allows Arabian Nites to trade between 08:00 and 04:30 hours on Monday

 Sunday.

Background to ARABIAN NITES

- 6) ARABIAN NITES have been subject to many other offences/Crimes in the past. On Sunday 25th March 2018 there was an incident where there was disorder outside the location with a firearm being used and damage being caused to the shutter of ARABIAN NITES.
- A blackmail crime number was also generated, as it was believed the location and its owners were being extorted.

NPT dealings regarding intervention and prevention/Initial meeting

- 8) I have had many meetings with the new owner Ali ALAWI DOB.

 1. Ali came to us initially with his licensing advisor Carl at 1400hrs on Wednesday 28th March 2018 where a meeting took place between representatives from WMP Inspector 2352 AHMED, myself, PS 0449 HUSAIN, PS 21390 GILL and PC 2413 READER. This was to discuss recent issues and having a plan going forward and having a productive working relationship between ARABIAN NITES and the police.
- Ali stated that he was the co-owner of ARABIAN NITES along with a male called Babs. No other details for Babs were provided.
- 10) Ali stated that Organised Crime Gang (OCG) were blackmailing him. He claimed that he was the victim where gangs were going round the shisha bars and demanding extortion money. When the owner refused to pay, the gangs caused issues for the

location by making phone calls and calling more people to the location committing crime and disorder, some of which involved firearms.

- 11) We discussed preventative measures regarding what he could do and what intervention he could have from WMP.
- 12) ALAWI said he was happy to work with us and provide information when necessary but wanted us all to work together and was very pro in forming positive relations with the police.
- 13) He said he was the victim of crime and wanted police intervention and protection in terms of protecting his property.

Actions moving forward

- 14) In terms of moving forward we decided on the following things -
 - DS GILL would be the single point of contact for Ali
 - Small Heath and Highgate NPT would pay passing attention to the location during the key times
 - Ali would try and get Body Worn Videos (BWV's) for his security
- 15) Another meeting was arranged for Thursday 12th April 2018 where we could all meet Babs and see what he was doing in terms of the Issues facing ARABIAN NITES.
- 16) Officers robustly patrolled the premises in the coming days, engaged positively with staff and Ali; no issues were identified. Security were searching anyone entering and challenging people prior to entry.

Second meeting

- 17) Another meeting took place on Thursday 12th April 2018 between Inspector 2352 AHMED, myself and PC 2413 READER along with Ali and Carl but there was no sign of Babs.
- 18) We asked All where Babs was; he said Babs could not attend due to his father being unwell however, officers were told that he had come back from a holiday abroad.

- 19) All said he was happy with the police presence over the past few weeks and believed that the problems had gone away. Officers informed him of their belief that this was most likely not the case given the premises' history and the previous incidents of violence and disorder.
- 20) All said he was still trying to sort out the BWV's for security. The meeting was productive however, it was disappointing to see that Babs had not turned up but was going abroad on holidays rather than engaging with WMP.
- 21) We informed Ali and Carl that Babs needed to get in touch with us and we left that with them.

Subsequent engagement

- 22) On Friday 13th April 2018 I emailed Ali asking him what their risk assessment was and long term planning of the people causing issues at the location.
- 23) All responded on the same date and said that they had told door staff not to let the people in and they would be aware of the issues before they came to the doors.
- 24) Following this the NPT continued to pay passing attention and engaging with the door staff and management from the location.
- 25) On Friday 04th May 2018 officers attended ARABIAN NITES and spoke to Ali. He stated that he had not had further issues and through the grapevine, they had heard that the problems had gone away and any persons responsible from before would leave them alone.
- 26) All stated he did not know when Babs would be free as he said he owned half of Birmingham and was worth half a million.
- 27) All was asked regarding the BVW's and said that he had raised this with Elite Security but had not provided anything specific apart from that they would get round to this. He said he would get a screen set up at the entrance, which captured people's faces. No timescales were provided.
- 28) Following this officers continued to attend, pay passing attention and liaised with Ali face to face and over email. The engagement was productive and positive and Ali has appreciated police presence.

- 29) To my knowledge, I have not seen any BWV's being used by the security firm and there is no screen up at the entrance to prevent crime and disorder and protect the public.
- 30) Due to there being a shooting in the early hours on Saturday 26th May 2018 on Sunday 27th May 2018 officers put the paperwork together and a Closure Notice under the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act (2014) was served on the premises at 1630hrs. Prior to this I rang Ali on his mobile around 1220hrs but there was no response so I left him a message. I then emailed him at 1224hrs asking him to contact me. I finished my tour of duty at 1500hrs and had not had any response prior to leaving work.

WITNESS STATEMENT OF ABDOOL ROHOMON

- I am Police Constable 4075 Abdool Rohomon of the West Midlands Police ('WMP'). I am currently a Police licensing officer for Birmingham City Centre and have been in that role for 15 years.
- 2. My duties include dealing with issues concerning the Licensing Act 2003 and working with partner agencies such as Birmingham City Council Licensing, Public Health, West Midlands Fire Service and others to deal with applications under the Licensing Act as well as police-related issues that arise within licensed premises.
- I make this statement in relation to ARABIAN NITES SHISHA LOUNGE ('Arabian Nites') of S4-76 BISSELL STREET, HIGHGATE, BIRMINGHAM, WEST MIDLANDS, B7 7HP. The information is from my own knowledge and belief safe where stated.

Arabian Nites

- 4. Arabian Nites is a shisha lounge with a premise licence issued to it under the Licensing Act 2003. The licence has been issued to QR Holdings and allows the premises to show plays, films, indoor sporting events, live music, recorded music, performances of dance, anything of similar description to that falling within (live music) (recorded music) or performances of dance, late night refreshment and sale of alcohol by retail (both on and off the premises). The Designated Premises Supervisor is Mr Amandeep Uppal.
- 5. The licence allows Arabian Nites to trade between 08:30 and 04:30 between Monday Sunday.

Court Application 29th May 2018

- On the 29th May 2018 I was present at Birmingham Magistrates Court to provide evidence if needed in relation to a closure notice that West Midlands Police had issued against the premises.
- 7. During the hearing the new owner Daniel Alawi gave evidence under oath, that the premises was not open during the time of the alleged offence, and then proceeded to produce CCTV footage via his mobile phone that they were closed.
- 8. On hearing this evidence I was concerned as I was convinced from reading the Incident log, investigation log, a witness statement that it had happened inside Arabian Nites.
- 9. During the summing up by the barrister for Arabian Nites, a male who I did recognise but was with the Respondent, the other part owner and their licensing representative went to the court door. I then saw him walk back in and hand a piece of paperwork to this barrister.
- 10. After reading the piece of paper, initially the barrister said nothing about it, but as she finished summing up she read what was on the piece of paper.
- 11. She then read out that the original injured person (IP) from the shooting had attended court, to retract his statement as it had not happened and he had been paid a lot of money to say it had happened at Arabian Nites. This note was then handed to our solicitor before being handed to the court clerk.

- 12. I spoke to our solicitor in court as I was shocked about this new piece of evidence. I was wondering how the IP had even known about the court date, as I had not spoken to him and I was aware from the investigating officer that he hasfully co-operated with the Police and so for this to happen seemed strange.
- 13. As we were late and the courts had closed we had to be escorted out by Security at approximately 18:30 hours. There were only two security officers left in the building and both were with us. We were walked out by the female member of staff, who I now know to be called the staff. I asked to if this male was still in court but was told he had left, I asked that he looked like and was told he was a young Asian male
- 14. This did not tally with what I knew about the IP, as according to his description he was an Afro Caribbean male, so I was not convinced this was our IP from the shooting.
- 15. On the 1st June 2018 I attended Birmingham Magistrates' court and saw the security guards that had taken us out of the building on the 29th May 2018. I was informed by that had dealt with the male.
- 16. I took a statement from (which is produced as exhibit AR/1.
- 17. I also looked at the CCTV, the main foyer area is covered by CCTV but it was not recording, the main entrance was but due to the light imbalance, you only see a silhouette of the male walking into the court, so it did not show a full frontal.
- 18. Again from what the detailed in his statement I did not believe that the male that came to court was indeed our IP and that someone had just come in and said so.
- 19. In relation to the evidence produced at court from Arabian Nites that they were closed. On the 30th May 2018 I contact Birmingham City Council Licensing department and asked them to send to me the current licensing plan that was attached to the premise licence for Arabian Nites.
- 20. On the 31st May 2018 I received from Birmingham City Council licensing department the licensed plan area for Arabian Nites, which showed two levels being licensed, the basement and ground floor. I can produce this plan as exhibit AR/2.

- 21. This plan was sent to DC Harrison, who then produced a dot plan to show where he had been on the day after the investigation, where the bullet fragment had been found, where the stairwell was and where officers had found evidence of aparty going on.
- 22. Having seen this plan and statement from DC Harrison Is was convinced that the incident had happened inside the licensed area of Arabian Nites, and as such they had been open during that night.
- 23. I am aware that there is another licensed premises that adjoins Arabian Nites, called Art House.
- 24. I am personally aware that on the 16th May 2018 Birmingham City Licensing Authority Subcommittee C had suspended the premise licence for Art House.
- 25. I know this personally as I was the officer that lead on it and presented at the interim steps meeting. The suspension came into immediate effect on the 16th May 2018, which meant that the premises was closed for business.
- 26. I produce the subcommittee decision as exhibit AR/3 and a copy of the plan for Art House as AR/4. The plan for Art House differs from the plan for Arabian Nites. The two premises are entirely separate although they are contained within the same building.
- 27. I exhibit as AR/5 copies of the book completed by security staff referred to in the final paragraph of DC Gilbert's statement. These pages are titled Arthouse, however from all the evidence that has been produced, the CCTV, the licensing plans, the suspension of the premise licence for Arthouse, I am satisfied that this event happened inside the licensed area for Arabian Nites





That having considered the application made and certificate issued by West Midlands Police under Section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003 for an expedited review of the premises licence held by Art Venue Ltd, in respect of Arthouse, 54 Bissell Street, Birmingham B5 7HP, this Sub-Committee determines that the Licence be suspended pending a review of the Licence, such a review to be held within 28 days of receiving the Chief Officer of Police's application.

The Sub-Committee's reasons for imposing this interim step are due to concerns raised by West Midlands Police in relation to matters which came to light as a result of an incident of serious crime & disorder that had occurred during an event held at the premises during the weekend of 12th May 2018, as outlined in the Chief Officer of Police's certificate and application.

The Sub-Committee heard the submissions of West Midlands Police, who confirmed that an investigation had started into the incident of serious crime and disorder. At 03:11 hours, the Police had been called to attend what was described to them as an incident in which a firearm had been discharged and thereafter a fight had broken out.

On arrival, the Police had found scenes of chaos, with patrons fleeing the location in a panicked manner; cars were observed by Police to be driving off at speed. An investigation was in its early stages. It was suspected by Police that there had indeed been a firearm crime, which was of course a serious crime, and too significant a serious risk to public safety to deal with via the ordinary licensing review regime

Bodycam footage recorded by a Firearms Officer attending the incident had been reviewed by Sergeant Williams carefully – in particular a recording of a member of security staff stating that a gun had been pointed at a man's head inside the premises. Police were already aware at this early stage that patrons had included those known to be involved in organised crime and in drugs. There were suggestions to Police that the Designated Premises Supervisor was a Mr Patel, which had caused alarm; following previous incidents at the club, the Sub-Committee had imposed a condition that he was not to have any role in management.

Following the incident, Police requested CCTV from the premises by contacting Mrs Wilcox, who is a Director of the company which holds the premises licence. However it had been Mr Patel who had responded to Police and supplied the CCTV footage. When the premises' CCTV was examined, it showed no incident at all Given the melee which had greeted the attending officers on the night, and the

chaos the Police witnessed of a 'starburst' of patrons escaping the scene either on foot or by car, this was surprising

The Sub-Committee heard submissions from the premises' legal representative, and from Mrs Wilcox, a Director of the company which holds the premises licence it was the premises' view that no serious crime incident involving a firearm had occurred at all. This was extraordinary given the account given on the Superintendent's Certificate. This, however, was their firm position, and accordingly the approach to the hearing taken by the premises was that no action should be taken; instead all decision-making should simply be deferred to the summary review hearing in 28 days' time. The premises did not propose any additional security/ searching methods which would prevent weapons being taken into the premises

The Police confirmed that the incident of serious crime and disorder was that involving the firearm, and the resulting 'starburst' of patrons fleeing the site. Yet the premises' general circumstances, and in particular the management arrangements described by Police, also seemed highly unsatisfactory.

The DPS had had little involvement in dealing with Police enquiries; instead, that job had been taken on by a member of staff who was not meant to have any managing control. Another member of staff, thought to be acting as some kind of Events Organiser/ Events Manager or similar, was named by Police at the hearing the Sub-Committee was taken aback on hearing this name in connection with Arthouse, as the name was well known to them as a person associated with problem premises elsewhere, and who had been shown in the past to have no concern whatsoever for the safety of night-time patrons in the city. It was noted that this person had stated to Police attending on the night that she had not seen any gun; this seemed surprising given that other staff, recorded on Police bodycam, had confirmed that a gun had been pointed at a man's head inside the club

A Venue Management Plan handed to Police showed the vast majority of events described simply as 'to be confirmed', which was completely unsatisfactory. The reason given by Mrs Wilcox for this was that the venue was often privately hired; the Sub-Committee found this unpersuasive, as such events would necessarily have to be booked in advance and details noted in order that arrangements could be made. The event on the night in question was described to the Sub-Committee as a private birthday party; West Midlands Police confirmed that this was the first time that they had heard the event referred to as such.

The premises, via their legal representative, urged the Sub-Committee not to suspend the Licence; they considered that there was no evidence that such an incident had taken place on the night. This was not persuasive. The Director stated that staff had left the premises as the event was over; yet staff had been recorded on the bodycam of the Firearms Officer. The Sub-Committee observed that the DPS named on the documents did not attend to address them, which they initially found surprising; however as the hearing progressed Members suspected that this was perhaps because the named DPS had had little involvement — either on the night or in the immediate aftermath. However the two staff members who had been identified as having a degree of involvement and/ or control did not attend to address the Sub-Committee either

The only person who did attend was a company Director who had not been present on the night and who had passed Police requests for assistance to Mr Patel to deal with The reason given by Mrs Wilcox for passing Police requests to Mr Patel was that he was available at the time; yet the Sub-Committee heard that Mr Patel "had to leave his brother's wedding" in order to liaise with Police over the CCTV of the serious crime incident. Members considered that this explanation rather confirmed the importance of Mr Patel's role in the premises' management structure.

It was the recommendation of West Midlands Police that the licence be suspended whilst the Police investigated. This was to ensure public safety. It was not accepted that the Premises Licence Holder company was running the premises through its Director Mrs Wilcox, it was suspected by Police that it was in fact Mr Patel who had managerial control. Throughout, the DPS had been conspicuous in his absence—in the descriptions of the night, the dealings with the Police, and also in not attending the Sub-Committee meeting.

The Sub-Committee agreed that the interim step of suspension was the correct course. On hearing submissions from both sides, the Sub-Committee was particularly concerned to hear of the management arrangements. It appeared that the arrangements were wholly unsatisfactory in terms of upholding the prevention of crime & disorder and public safety objectives. The suggestion by the premises that the evidence was pure speculation was not accepted; a 'starburst' of patrons had been directly witnessed by Police officers, and some patrons were suspected to be connected to organised crime and drugs. The application had not been made based on speculation, but on the basis of first-hand accounts recorded on the night it was striking that the premises' submissions were concerned primarily with the financial loss to the business that a suspension would cause, rather than the prevention of crime & disorder, or taking any steps to ensure public safety.

Having heard the Police's account, the Sub-Committee determined that it was both necessary and reasonable to impose the interim step of suspension to address the immediate problem with the premises, in particular the likelihood of serious crime and or serious disorder, and to ensure public safety

The Sub-Committee considered whether it could impose any other interim step, including modification of licence conditions, or exclusion of the sale of alcohol by retail or the removal of the Designated Premises Supervisor. The Sub-Committee did not believe however that any of these would address the seriousness of an incident in which the Police suspected a firearm had found its way in to the premises. The risks could only be addressed by the suspension of the Licence as an interim step.

In reaching this decision, the Sub-Committee has given due consideration to the City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, the Guidance Issued by the Home Office in relation to expedited and summary licence reviews, and the submissions made at the hearing by the Police, by the legal representative for the premises, and by a Director of the premises licence holder company

All parties are advised that the premises licence holder may make representations against the interim steps taken by the Licensing Authority. On receipt of such representations, the Licensing Authority must hold a hearing within 48 hours (excluding non-working days).

All parties are advised that there is no right of appeal to a Magistrates' Court against the Licensing Authority's decision at this stage
