#### 5595 **RESOLVED**:-

- (ii) that, in the event of the above legal agreement not being completed to the satisfaction of the local planning authority on or before 30 August 2017, planning permission be refused for the reasons set out in the report;
- (iii) that, in the event of the legal agreement being completed to the satisfaction of the local planning authority on or before 30 August 2017, favourable consideration would be given to the planning application subject to the conditions set out in the report and amended below:-

Delete Conditions 24, 26 and 33.

New Condition 37:

Requires a Phasing Plan.

No development shall take place until a phasing plan has been submitted and agreed in writing with the Local Planning Authority.

Reason: In order to secure the satisfactory development of the application site in accordance with Policy PG3 of the Birmingham Development Plan 2017 and the National Planning Policy Framework.

New Condition 38:

Implement Within Three Years (Outline).

Application(s) for approval of any reserved matter(s) must be made before the expiration of three years from the date of this permission.

The development for which permission is granted must be begun before the expiration of two years from the final approval of the reserved matter(s) or, in the case of approval on different dates, the final approval of the last matter to be approved.

Reason: To comply with Section 92 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended) and the National Planning Policy Framework.

(iv) that the City Solicitor be authorised to prepare, seal and complete the appropriate legal agreement.
