How will the innovation be implemented?

The SVNF meets monthly at the sbcFamily Learning Centre (SBC). On those occasions (and since 2017), plans about this idea have been presented and discussed. Communication is mainly via email, where all involved exchange information and this will continue. On other occasions there have been smaller meetings and on site appointments at the proposal sites, which will also continue. Plans have been drawn up for some sites (SBC open space, Rail Station+ open space, Station Road + open space, Police Station, All Saints open space). All teams were aware of the part they play in implementing the programmes over the next few months. Our programme was followed by programme makers for "Blooming Marvellous" to be aired next season.
