


Percentage of RFAs by Category



Animal Welfare



- There were 8 investigations into illegal importation of dogs/puppies
- A venomous scorpion was accidentally imported in a vegetable delivery and needed to be rehomed at a zoo with a dangerous wild animal licence. We also had a Gecko accidentally imported with a delivery of spectacle frames from Thailand



Animal Welfare



- The implementation of the new Dog Control Orders has been achieved through educational and enforcement means.
- The Dog Warden/Enforcement Officers have undertaken some 80 proactive enforcement exercises. Many are undertaken with officers from West Midlands Police.
- At total of 21 Fixed Penalty notices have been issued to dog owners who have failed to clear up after their dogs or have allowed their dogs loose on public roads.
- 50,000 poop scoop bags have been given out whilst engaging with the public on dog fouling initiatives.

SURVIVAL STANDARDS RADON

In 2015-16 Birmingham Trading Standards...

- Received 4,762 Requests for Assistance
- Recovered £86,466 in redress for consumers
- Confiscated £146,442 of assets from convicted criminals
- Responded to 152 requests for advice from Birmingham businesses
- 22 successful prosecutions comprising 219 individual offences
- A total of £37,401 in court fines issued
- A total of 21 years worth of prison sentences imposed
- A total of 23 months suspended prison sentences imposed
- A total of 850 hours of unpaid work orders imposed



Car Clocking

In a recent case...

- 255 clocked vehicles
- 1 million+ miles clocked
- 5 individuals found guilty of fraud
- Total of 12.75 years in custodial sentences
- Proceeds of Crime investigation ongoing



False / Misleading Adverts

In a recent case...

- Trader advertised replica Ferrari for sale
- Car had been clocked by 100,000 miles
- He failed to disclose insurance write-off
- Car was in an un-roadworthy condition
- Five Consumer Protection offences
- Fined £11,623 and car forfeited



© Counterfeiting



- 318 complaints of counterfeiting received by the service

- 8,610 items seized with an estimated street value of over £70,000



- Teams of officers conducted high visibility patrols at the Rugby World Cup events to tackle the sale of counterfeit Rugby merchandise.



In a recent case, a shop owner from Kingstanding was prosecuted for selling counterfeit clothing, shoes and electrical goods. He received an 8 week suspended prison sentence and was ordered to pay back £100,000 following a Proceeds of Crime Act investigation.

Product Safety

- 313 complaints received relating to unsafe goods
- Complaints have included cosmetics, electrical items, furniture, toys & nursery goods



A trader was convicted of product safety offences after various unsafe cosmetics were seized and found to contain banned substances. Trader was fined £9,200.




9 Suspension Notices were issued in relation to 1,766 unsafe 'Hover Boards'.



- Officers tested sunbeds at beauty salons for compliance with safety standards.
- 42 premises visited
 - 132 sunbeds tested
 - 19 non-compliant
 - All were made compliant

ROGUE TRADERS


- In our annual survey, 99% of residents said they objected to traders calling at their door and 87.3% said they felt threatened by callers at the door.
- Of those residents living in a No Cold Calling Zone, 83.3% said it made them feel safer at home and 96.3% agreed that they should not be removed.
- 9 Rapid Responses were conducted by Trading Standards Officers to residents with live problem trader incidents.



Officers visited banks across the City to provide training on how to spot potential rogue trader incidents involving their customers. Following our visits, one bank got in touch after an elderly lady tried to withdraw £2,000 for roofing work. Officers attended and prevented the lady falling victim.



Posters and leaflets were distributed at Doctors' Surgeries across the City to warn residents of doorstep crime issues.




Trading Standards continues to receive reports of a wide range of scams that are in existence. Many of them emanate from outside the EU and can be incredibly difficult, if not impossible to tackle.



Some scams we have dealt with this year:

- A lady who was just about to send £600 to a scam postal lottery when the Trading Standards Officer arrived
- 110 referrals from the National Scams Hub relating to postal scams such as Prizemasters and One World Lottery
- A gentleman who had amassed thousands of scam letters in his home having responded to them over many years

Five Scam Awareness Talks were delivered to various community groups across the City.

HAJJ

The service continues to receive complaints about unscrupulous Hajj and Umrah tour operators misdescribing travel and accommodation packages.

Many tour operators are claiming to be ATOL protected when they are not, risking consumers' funds if the trip fails to go ahead.




Trading Standards continues to work with the Association of British Hajj to raise awareness of the issues amongst the Muslim community.




Recent prosecution cases...

Purobi Travels Ltd and Moshina Khanna each fined £2,000 and ordered to pay costs of £900 for failing to have ATOL protection.

Al Hashmi Hajji and Umrah Tours Ltd found guilty of Fraud Act and consumer protection offences in relation to false claims to be ATOL protected. Sentencing will follow a Proceeds of Crime investigation.









Recent Prosecution Cases...

Shiza Gold Jewellers:

- 23 items seized with no hallmark
- 2 items under carat
- Fined £2,000
- £3,340 costs ordered

Ayan Jewellers Limited:

- 72 pieces of jewellery seized
- None were hallmarked
- 20 pieces sent to the Assay Office for examination – all failed

- Fined £5,000
- £2,300 costs ordered

- Under the Hallmarking Act 1973, all jewellery that is described as being gold, silver, platinum or palladium, must carry a legally recognised hallmark.

Ilicit Alcohol

Most bottles contained the genuine product but had a counterfeit UK Duty Paid stamp

- 15 premises inspected
- 395 bottles of vodka seized
- 220 bottles of whiskey seized
- Market value of £7,500
- 4 premises had their alcohol licence revoked
- 1 licence review pending
- Prosecution cases submitted for the most serious cases



Partnership working with West Midlands Police saw suspected counterfeit alcohol seized from premises in Kingstanding.





Illicit Tobacco

- 82 premises inspected
- 115,540 cigarettes seized
- Estimated Street Value £22,500

Pritpal Khurana trading as M&S News given an 8-month suspended prison sentence and 250 hours unpaid work after officers seized over 6,000 packets of illicit cigarettes from his Washwood Heath store.

Salim Salih trading as Supersam given a 10-month suspended sentence and 100 hours unpaid work after 1,000 packets of cigarettes and 200 pouches of tobacco seized from his Handsworth store.

Proceeds of Crime investigations to follow for both cases.

Premises Licence Reviews & Representations



Birmingham Trading Standards is a Responsible Authority under the Licensing Act 2003.

In 2015/16 we received and assessed over 300 applications for new Premises Licences or variations to existing licences.

Where licensed premises were found in possession of illicit alcohol or tobacco, Trading Standards called for reviews of their licence.


In 2015/16, Trading Standards called for 10 licence reviews. Of these 9 have been concluded and have resulted in the licences being revoked.





WEIGHTS & MEASURES

- 40 enquiries received, 26 relating to suspected short-measures
- 3 pubs were visited following short measure beer complaints and test purchases made – 1 formal warning issued



- Officers inspected stalls at the Birmingham Christmas Market to ensure compliance with UK legislation.
- Weighing Machines and Spirit Measures tested for accuracy.

Proceeds of Crime

Trading Standards has two Accredited Financial Investigators. Alongside Trading Standards cases, they also conduct Proceeds of Crime investigations for the Corporate Fraud Team, Planning Enforcement and the Waste Enforcement Unit.



- 30 cases were referred to our Accredited Financial Investigators to consider confiscation of assets.
- 35 applications to Crown Court for Production Orders to obtain financial information.
- 3 Restraint Orders issued to prevent dissipation of assets.



- 5 Proceeds of Crime Act hearings at Crown Court – all found in favour of BCC.
- A total of £146,442 confiscated from convicted criminals.
- Trading Standards receives 37.5% under the Asset Recovery Incentivisation Scheme.
