1. Purpose of report:

To consider relevant representations that have been made in respect of an application to vary the Premises Licence which seeks to extend the hours for the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption on the premises) to operate from 11:00am until 11:00pm (Monday to Thursday), 11:00am until 12:00midnight (Friday and Saturday) and 11:00am until 10:30pm (Sunday).

To amend the provision of Regulated Entertainment consisting of live music and recorded music, to operate indoors only, from 11:00am until 11:00pm (Monday to Thursday), 11:00am until 12:00midnight (Friday and Saturday) and 11:00am until 10:30pm (Sunday).

Premises to remain open to the public from 10:00am until 12:00midnight (Monday to Thursday), 10:00am until 01:00am (Friday and Saturday) and 10:00am until 11:00pm (Sunday).

The application also seeks to remove the following conditions listed under Annex 2, Sections 2a and 2d:

- The premises shall operate a membership policy. Only bona-fide members can hire the facilities of the premises. Non-members will be allowed as a guest of the member hiring the facility.
- No regulated entertainment will take place at the premises if any regulated entertainment is taking place in the bar/original wooden club house of the Boldmere Sports and Social Club, Boldmere Road. This condition is to be replaced with 'no regulated entertainment will take place at the premises if any regulated entertainment is taking place in the bar/original wooden club house of the Boldmere Sports & Social Club SAVE for New Years Eve'.

2. Recommendation:

To consider the representations that have been made and to determine the application.

3. Brief Summary of Report:

Variation application received on 5th November 2018 in respect of Boldmere Suite, Boldmere Sports & Social Club, 323 Boldmere Road, Sutton Coldfield, Birmingham, B73 5HQ.

Boldmere Sports & Social Club applied on 5th November 2018 to vary the Premises Licence for Boldmere Suite, Boldmere Sports & Social Club, 323 Boldmere Road, Sutton Coldfield, Birmingham, B73 5HQ.

Representations have been received from other persons. See Appendices 1-2.

The application is attached at Appendix 3.

The current Premises Licence is attached at Appendix 4.

Reference: Objection to Amendment to Boldmere Club Premises Licence Ref No. 108691, Licence No. 4503. Boldmere Suite, 323 Boldmere Road, Sutton Coldfield, Birmingham, B73 5HQ.

Objections:

- There is no Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) named on the licence this is essential if the
 management policy is to work/operate as stated on the licence. This named person should be in
 place and named on this application. This application should be rejected on these grounds without
 further consideration.
- 2. The new later hours proposed for serving alcohol and playing both live and recorded music should be refused. To help prevent crime and disorder, to prevent any public nuisance in this residential area, the club is hidden away by housing on three sides with a narrow single track access between the houses. For the protection of children both on the club premises at these late hours with alcohol being served and the children asleep with their families in the surrounding houses.
- 3. The Council Licence Committee on 12/08/2015 rejected Licence Ref 91821 for the Boldmere Suite. The late hours on this application similar to this new application were rejected as the committee agreed with local residents with regard to the impact of the proposed operation on occupants living nearby to the Boldmere Sports and Social Club.

The committee went on to say that the club was the source of a long standing public nuisance in a noise sensitive area which the club management had not addressed satisfactorily. The conduct of club members in connection with events was the cause of noise and disturbance in the early hours of the morning, when residents are likely to be asleep.

The committee also noted that an increase in footfall to the Boldmere Suite would exacerbate the situation as experienced by the local residents. Tied with the existing club certificate premises this would result in peaks of noise and disturbance on the premises grounds and nearby streets as large numbers of club members and guests would simultaneously leave the licensed premises, resulting in greater disturbance and noise in a primarily residential area with a low ambient noise level at these late hours.

Nothing has changed to the operation of this club or the behaviour of its members and the above observations by the licence committee still hold today, with regard to the experience local residents have with the late night activities of this club. This application should be rejected.

Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy

 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.

Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.

- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience,

and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

- 4. Where taking place in a building or other structure please tick as appropriate (indoors may include a tent).

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Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises— (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner; (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either— (a) a holographic mark, or (b) an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person must ensure that— (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures— (i) beer or cider: ½ pint; (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

(1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. (2) In this condition:— (a) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula $P = D + (D \times V)$, where— (i) P is the permitted price, (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; (b) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979; (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence— (i) the holder of the premises licence, (ii) the designated premises suppryisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence; (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994. (3) Where

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the permitted price would not be a whole number of pennies, the permitted price shall be taken to be the price rounded up to the nearest penny. (4) Where the permitted price on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax, the permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Each individual assigned to carrying out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Agency.

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Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with operating schedule

2a) General conditions consistent with the operating schedule

The Club Committee will have a Management Policy in relation to the use of the Boldmere Suite as a function room to ensure the promotion of the 4 licensing objectives.

A Nominated staff member of the Club or a Committee member will be present during all functions involving regulated entertainment to ensure a proactive control on the regulated entertainment to avoid causing public nuisance.

The Designated Premises Supervisor or another qualified person will train any staff at the premises on the basic laws of selling alcohol and on compliance with the conditions on the premises licence and a log of this training will be maintained. The training log can be inspected by any responsible authority on request.

The premises shall operate a membership policy. Only bone-fide Members can hire the facilities of the Premises. Non-members will be allowed as a guest of the member hiring the facility.

All applications to hire the facilities of the premises will be put to members of the Committee of the Licence Holder before the reservation is agreed. A record of the hire of the Premises must be kept for a period of 12 months.

All staff must be trained before they first start work at the premises and that refresher training is regularly provided (minimum of yearly:

- 1.Staff themselves might be personally liable if they sell to young persons in breach of legal requirements;
- 2.Proxy sales staff should remain vigilant to the age profiles of groups of customers to avoid adults purchasing alcohol destined for somebody under age.
- 3. Staff will be trained on signs of persons drinking to excess.
- 4.A record of the training will be kept and all members of staff will sign to confirm they have received and understood the training given.
- 5.All training must be recorded on premises and be made available to responsible authority immediately on request.

The licence holder or the DPS must play an active part in the local Pubwatch (if applicable), work closely with other members in the watch and must show representation to pre-arranged meetings.

No drinking vessels at any time are to be taken beyond the outside perimeter of the premises as shown on the licensing plan and the premises licence holder must ensure notices are displayed in any designated outside smoking or drinking area to inform patrons of the restriction.

Signage displaying to customers to "Respect Local Residents – please leave quietly" to be displayed around location and especially at the exits and smoking areas.

All Regulated Entertainment will take place indoors only.

2b) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of crime and disorder

A Challenge 25 policy will be operated by the premises with notices informing customers of the policy being displayed within the premises. Staff must be regularly reminded/trained to enforce the challenge 25 policy. A staff training register will be maintained and all training recorded.

The premises licence holder shall ensure that a CCTV system is in operation at the premises and is installed to a specification agreed with West Midlands Police Licensing Section. The CCTV must be working and recording at all times when the premises are open and conducting Licensable activities.

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The main entrance door to the premises must be covered by the CCTV system.

CCTV will be digitally recorded for up to 28 days and will be made available on request to all licensing authorities. There will all be a member of staff on duty who is trained and able to show and download images from the system during opening hours. It will be in recording operation during opening hours and it will cover all licensable activity areas of the premises.

Staff members are to be trained in the operation of the CCTV system to enable images to be made available to any Responsible Authority immediately on request.

The licence/DPS holder must ensure that an Age Verification Policy applies to the premises which, as a minimum, must require individuals who appear to be under the age of 25 years of age to produce on request, before being served alcohol identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either a holographic mark or ultraviolet feature. Such ID can be a passport, photo card driving licence, PASS-approved card or military ID.

The premises will have an incident book and record all incidents that occur inside or immediately outside the premise, regardless of whether any of the emergency services have been called. The record of incident will include details of the member of staff involved in the incident and the actions taken. Regular liaison with police will be encouraged to ensure cross-reference of venue related incidents. This incident book can be inspected at any reasonable time by all responsible authorities

2c) Conditions consistent with, and to promote, public safety

No enforceable conditions identified from operating schedule.

2d) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of public nuisance

No regulated entertainment will take place at the premises if any regulated entertainment is taking place in the bar/original wooden club house of the Boldmere Sports and Social Club, Boldmere Road.

A noise limiting device will be used to control the sound of any amplified regulated entertainment taking place at the premises and the level must be set to ensure that no public nuisance takes place.

All windows and doors in the General Purpose room (being the Licensed area) will be closed during any regulated entertainment, save for access and egress

During Regulated Entertainment Representatives of the Club will monitor the level of sound escape from the Premises at the perimeter of the Boldmere Sports and Social Club premises with a particular focus on residential properties. These checks must be documented. Noise sensitive areas to be identified and mapped.

Prominent signs will be displayed in both car parks, Sheffield Road and Boldmere Road, and inside the Premises requesting customers vacate the premises quietly and have regard for local residents.

2e) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the protection of children from harm


All Alcohol refusals will be logged in a Refusals Register. This is to be made available to any Responsible Authority upon request.
