1. Purpose of report:

To consider a relevant representation that has been made in respect of an application for a Premises Licence which seeks to permit the provision of late night refreshment, for consumption on and off the premises, to operate from 11:00pm until 12:00midnight (Sunday to Thursday) and 11:00pm until 01:00am (Friday & Saturday).

Premises to remain open to the public from 11:30am until 12:00midnight (Sunday to Thursday) and 11:30am until 01:00am (Friday & Saturday).

2. Recommendation:

To consider the representation that has been made and to determine the application.

3. Brief Summary of Report:

An application for a Premises Licence was received on 17th February 2017 in respect of Classic Fish Bar & Kebab House, 319 Wyndhurst Road, Stechford, Birmingham, B33 9DL.

I wish to submit a formal objection to the above licensing application submitted by Mr Mir to extend the operating hours of the Classic Fish Bar & Kebab Takeaway located on 319 Wyndhurst Road, Stechford, Birmingham.

The Public Register/Licensing report shows his application was first submitted on 17 February 2017. My objection, as dated above, falls within the 28 day deadline during which to raise a formal objection to this application.

I am objecting with regard to the 'Nuisance' conditions set out in the application as follows:

1. The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that the doors of the premises will be kept closed to reduce any noise or smell nuisance from occurring in the licensable hours

With regard to this condition, I am not satisfied that the requirement for the doors to be kept closed during licensable hours adequately safeguards residents from the noise/smell nuisance generated from this business in the longer term.

This condition fails to set out what measures the business is expected to adopt during the summer months for example, when the shop doors may well be open due to warmer weather. I would like this condition clarified further, particularly if the business is expected to adhere to this condition all year round. It's not clear how this condition would be enforced or policed and would any failure to keep the doors closed at all times during

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licensable hours immediately constitute a breach of the condition terms and invalidate the license?

I live in very close proximity to this shop (i.e. houses down) and have already raised concerns with one an Environmental Health representative about the noise that currently comes from the two huge extractor fans situated at the rear of the building. I sleep in the bedroom at the back of my house and I have to keep my windows closed if I want to go to bed any time before 11.00pm due to the disruptive and invasive noise. I don't think it's fair or acceptable to further extend the operating hours until midnight and allow this business to cause further noise nuisance and annoyance to local residents.

2. The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that employees and customer are encouraged to leave the premises without causing any nuisance to the neighbours.

With regard to this condition, there is a serious issue with litter originating directly from this business and I have complained on a number of occasions to the Council and more recently to my local Councillor (Carol Jones) about this. I am not convinced that the business do or have ever actively 'encouraged' their customers to use the two bins situated directly outside the shop and the amount of discarded chip papers that end up on my driveway (houses down) is testament to this.

Carol Jones MP escalated my concerns directly with Andy McCoy (BCC Fleet & Waste Management) on 1 February 2017 and received an email response from him confirming the following:

"...the bins and shop front are done by the ward crew on a Wednesday and the constituency crew do the bins and shop front on a Monday and Friday..."

The footfall to this business increases significantly over a weekend. Therefore, and assuming that the two crews do actually clear litter from the shop front on the days specified in Andy's email, the bulk of the 'weekend' litter is not cleared until a Monday. Consequently, anything that's not put in the bins provided over a weekend invariably ends up on mine and my neighbours' property or further down the street. Whilst I accept not all litter on the street comes from this business, there can be no doubt as to the origin of the chip wrappers and it angers me that I have to regularly clear my drive of this rubbish, which causes a nuisance to me and fellow residents.

I would ask that the seriousness of the litter problem is taking into consideration when reviewing this licensing application. Whilst I appreciate Mr Mir can't be held entirely accountable for the disrespectful actions of his customers when they leave his shop, he should however be made to accept some responsibility for clearing up litter directly generated from his business. It's not unreasonable to expect a takeaway business situated in a residential area to take responsibility for this and I use MacDonalds (situated on the Stechford Retail Park) as an example. After making numerous complaints to MacDonalds about their takeaway wrappers littering the street, they duly acknowledged the concerns.

raised. They also adopted a responsible and respectful approach and sent members of their own staff out to collect MacDonalds litter discarded around the restaurant and in surrounding streets. If a global business such as MacDonalds is prepared to shoulder some responsibility for litter management in this area, I can see no reason why similar accountability conditions can't be specified in relation to Mr Mir's license application.

I don't think it's unreasonable, by way of a more detailed condition, to stipulate that all takeaway businesses are held accountable and responsible in some way for controlling and managing litter. In the case of Mr Mir's licence application, I would like to see measures put in place that require him to monitor and control litter around his shop, working in partnership with the Council waste collection crews.

This business not only generates excessive and unsightly litter, noise and smells but there is also a further consideration in terms of their customers parking across dropped kerb drive ways and disabled parking spaces when going to the shop. It's not just a serious problem for me but also other residents who live close to the business and I fear this will get even worse if the application to extend operating hours is approved.

I hope the Licensing Section will give due consideration to the points raised in this letter and my reasons for objecting to Mr Mir's licensing application. I have lived on Wyndhurst Road for 26 years and there has always been a chip shop at the end of the street, albeit run by a different owner operating reasonable and sensible opening times. Street litter from the chip shop was never an issue in all that time and has only become a large-scale nuisance since the shop came under Mr Mir's ownership and opening hours were extended.


