1. Purpose of report:

To consider relevant representations that have been made in respect of an application for a Premises Licence which seeks to permit the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption on the premises) to operate from 08:00am until 10:00pm (Monday to Sunday).

Premises to remain open to the public from 08:00am until 10:00pm (Monday to Sunday).

2. Recommendation:

3. Brief Summary of Report:

An application for a Premises Licence was received on 5^{th} April 2017 in respect of Ace Face Barbers, 92 Bristol Street, Birmingham, B5 7AH.

Citing the following reasons:

Being a neighbour living on Henstead Street, the proposed licence backs onto my property and/or is within close proximity.

- A) This particular area of town already has several licensed premises already, (the Wellington hotel, the fountain pub, prysm night club, loft lounge, penthouse club, missing bar, Nightingale club, various restaurants, and Tesco and other off license premises to name but a few.
- B) The noise pollution already felt from the above premises, general noise, arguments and fights in the street, is already bad enough. I know city living you need to expect a degree of this, but 1 thing this area does not need is another outlet for it. I know my neighbours thoughts are along similar lines.
- C) Henstead st is already being used as a public toilet with their clientele on their way home. This is unacceptable to me, to step outside my door to human excrement and urine.
- D) I don't think alcohol which is a consumed product (so therefore food) should be sold/opened or consumed where hair is being cut, surely there must be some restrictions around this that the council imposes, if only from a public health perspective.
- E) As this is a barbershop premises presumably it will be visited by children often. Given this fact the premises has sunbeds in the basement already, I don't think they must have a license for these, as there is no fire exit from this basement, as it backs onto the carpark. If this is already being ignored, what's to say they won't sell alcohol to minors, and said minors are not already using these sunbeds.

I ask that the council take into consideration the points I've raised and fully appreciate that i have nothing personal towards these premises, or continued business, just the opposite I wish them well, but this area already has enough public nuisance issues to deal with without granting more.

Being the Leaseholder at The Wellington Hotel, 72 Bristol Street Birmingham B5 7AH

I would like to cite the following reasons:

- A. As you may be aware that "Ace Face" is in an area of town already served by several licensed premises; Namely, The Wellington Hotel, The Fountain Inn, Prysm Night Club, Loft Lounge, Penthouse Club, Missing Bar, Tesco and other off license premises including various types of restaurants
- B. "Ace Face" is a barbershop and in my opium raises questions around Health & Safety in terms of suitability of the premises to offer the sale of any type of alcohol, as I understand from the environmental health comes under the food hygiene regulations.
- C. As the premises is a barber shop; children could visit the premises and should not be in the kind of environment where alcohol is being consumed.
- D. I understand the premises have a basement, and if this is the intended area where alcohol will be served from then I am informed that there is no fire escape route.
- E. On a purely personal note I have concerns about the effect on my Business. I am barely managing to make ends meet as it is and one more licensed premise in the area could be the final nail in the coffin could result in me having to close down. It is not only the loss of my business that concerns me; but I also have staff who would become unemployed, two of whom live on the premises and would become homeless. In addition my Business also offers hotel accommodation at competitive rates which Birmingham can ill afford to lose.

I would ask the council take the above points into consideration when assessing this application.


