

### Early Life Experience and The Brain



#### **Critical Years**

- First 2 years baby's brain grows from 25% to 80% of adult size
- Development continues in childhood learning empathy, trust, community



#### Chronic Stress from ACEs

Violence - over-develop 'life-preserving' brain

#### NEUTRAL CUES LOOK THREATENING

School – anxious, disengaged, poor learner

#### ADVERSE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES

PHYSICAL ABUSE SEXUAL ABUSE VERBAL ABUSE PARENTAL **SEPERATION DOMESTIC VIOLENCE**

#### Compared with no ACEs, those with 4+ ACEs were:

3x more likely to be a current smoker 3x more likely to have had sex under 16 years 6x more likely to have used drugs 10x more likely to be problem drinkers 49x more likely to have ever attempted suicide INDEPENDENT OF POVERTY



#### If they had no ACEs problems could be reduced by:









Smoking 22% Early Sex

#### **UK:** Compared with no ACEs, those with 4+ ACEs were:

2x more likely to binge drink

3x more likely to be current smoker

5x more likely to have had sex under 16 years

7x more likely to be involved in recent violence

11x more likely to have used heroin or crack

11x more likely to have been incarcerated


