Initial equality impact assessment Aims: To review, approve and implement the fees and charges for the Sport and Leisure Service for 2019/20.

Objectives:

To introduce a revised set of maximum fees and charges for the year 2019 taking into account the following elements:

The city council's Corporate Charging Policy

The need to ensure relevant expenditure is met and that budgeted income targets are achieved.

The need to maximise income potential

The need to increase participation in line with the City Council's strategic priorities.

Benchmarking with neighbouring local authorities and Core Cities.

Usage trends and other market forces

In setting maximum fees and charges for Sport and Leisure there is a requirement that all operators of the service adhere to the citywide policy, this is detailed within the service specification. There is a risk that the increase to prices will impact on the volume of customers, therefore these are maximum prices which allows for either an external leisure operator or the Wellbeing Service to discount where appropriate to meet local demands and increase business.. To also mitigate this risk the proposed prices have been compared to alternative provision to ensure prices are competitive so that the risk of any customer loss is minimised. In addition a marketing campaign will be focused on explaining the increases and maintaining customer levels to all sections of the community.

The City Council operates a Passport to Leisure scheme which offers concessionary prices to disadvantaged groups and those on low incomes. Additionally Be Active, Be Active + and Active Parks offers free activities commissioned by Public Health. This scheme has resulted in an increased volume of customers particularly those from hard to reach groups and communities.
