Residents and business owners outlined the issues that

produced photographic evidence of the damage caused			
to business premises and homes. As this was the			
second time that flooding had occurred in the same			
location ie Formans Road, Pentos Drive, Percy Road			
there was a need for the authorities to take immediate			
action to prevent the risk of further flooding during the			
next heavy rainfall. Business owners spoke of			
irreversible damage caused and that they were			
uninsurable. It was felt that the area had been			
'forgotten' and had not received the same attention as			
other areas of the city that had been flooded at the			
same time and that poorer areas had not received the			
same access to resources from the council as other
