How will the innovation be implemented?

1. Provide a sports Coach, once a week in each of the facilities ran by the Weoley Castle Nursery Group (3).
2. The Sports Practitioner will be DBS checked, qualified (minimum Level 2) and has experience in working with children ages 2-3, 4-5 and 6-7, one of which will also be qualified in delivering Disability Sports Provision.

What outcomes will the proposal achieve? What will success look like and how will its impact be measured? How will you ensure legacy/ continuation and what learning will the project provide?

1. We envisage this program will create a new form of community led engagement and involvement, which will enable young people to address the challenges they face in a deprived community.
2. Delivery will be focused on physical mobility/Coordination/and handling opportunities and Agility, which will improve their Balance and Coordination
3. This provision will be inclusive for all that need it.
4. This project will also strengthen the community by creating an opportunity to up skill residents/workers of the area who are working with the young people.
5. Exit route, on Saturday Mornings -My1stFootballProgram2-3,4-5 and FUNdamental Training Program 6-7 which 5 places per programme will be funded.
6. After discussions with each of the groups they're extremely keen to continue the provision using their pupil premium money.
