## WARD PL:

Melanie Coton presented the ward planning process:

- Talked through timeline. The first iteration of the plan is to be submitted in January 2023. MC share more info on the timeline
- There are different ways to gain views from the community. This could include open events, survey, resident group meetings, Neighbourhood Plan meetings.

Residents reviewed the Ward Plan priorities 2018 to 2022. Items discussed include:

- Keep 8 priorities, update the actions.
- Consider removing 'Pride in the local area'.
- Consider what enforcement action can be undertaken to deal with flytipping/ASB issues.
- Unused land/Commercial properties such as Grove Lane. What action can be taken?
- Increase involvement with schools.
- Look to re-open disused forest land in Handsworth Park
- Unadopted paths and alleyways include in priority 1. Find out who owns Hedingly Road
- Alleyways look at improving lighting in alleyways
- HMO/Exempt accommodation. Consider linking with other wards to share best practice on how to tackle issues.
- Rodent control identity hotspots and consider actions which can be taken
- Crime and safety priority all elements to stay. Consider including violent crime/knife crime
- Parking reservation of parking spaces with wheelie bins
- The Children and young people and education sections need to be updated
- Wellbeing include swimming pool repairs
- Adult services define what services are available and if additional support is required.
