### **1. Purpose of report:**

To consider relevant representations that have been made in respect of an application for a Premises Licence which seeks to permit the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption on and off the premises) to operate from 10:00am until 11:00pm (Monday to Sunday).

Premises to remain open to the public 24hours (Monday to Sunday).

### **3. Brief Summary of Report:**

An application for a Premises Licence was received on 22<sup>nd</sup> June 2016 in respect of Staycity Aparthotels, Newhall Square, 88 Charlotte Street, Birmingham, B3 1PW.

Representations have been received from Environmental Health, as a responsible authority, and from other persons.

I, Paul R Samms, as a representative of Environmental Health, formally raise a representation on the above application.

My representation(s) concern the likely effect of the grant of the licence on the promotion of the following licensing objective: **the prevention of public nuisance**

I am concerned that the grant of the licence would undermine the licence objective for the prevention of public nuisance.

My concerns include (but are not exclusive to) a complainant complaining of intrusive noise as a result of :

1. Noise from patrons using the external area during noise sensitive times.
2. Noise from taxi's.
3. Noise from patrons from within the hotel rooms.

I think that this concern can be dealt with by the use of appropriate conditions.

1. The Hotel Manager shall ensure that a written agreement is made with reputable taxi companies to ensure that when taxi's pick up and drop off customers from the licensed premises noise from these vehicles does not cause a nuisance to local residents.
2. Customers who require a taxi from the site shall be advised by staff to use taxi companies specified by the Hotel Manager.
3. Notices shall be displayed within the licensed premises for customers to view giving details of taxi companies to use
4. The Hotel Manager shall ensure notices shall be displayed near the entrance and exits of the Hotel at a weekend advising customers who wish to use the outside areas that they should do so with respect for the nearby residents and keep noise levels to a minimum.
5. The Hotel Manager shall be responsible for ensuring that patrons wishing to utilise the outside areas do so quietly and that noise from patrons moving to and from the external areas is kept to a minimum.
6. The Hotel Manager shall be responsible for ensuring that the external areas do not create a nuisance to neighbours at the premises and if necessary restrict the number of people utilising the outside areas at any one time.
7. Customers will not be allowed to take drinks outside the premises.
8. From 9pm until 8am on each day all external doors and windows are to be closed except for access and egress.
9. Guests shall be prevented from using the lounge area after 11pm.

**In light of the matters set out above I have no objections to the licence being granted provided appropriate conditions are imposed to deal with the concerns raised.**

To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing to voice my objection to a recent application for a licence to sell alcohol which has been shown in the windows of the Stay City Hotel on Charlotte Street in the Jewellery Quarter. I understand that it is possible to raise any objections prior to the 28 July 2016.

We have had numerous issues with the hotel not controlling noise levels from residents on the street outside at all hours (normally from midnight until 5am). Further to this, residents from the hotel have been smoking cannabis in the street outside and littering the area (with clothing, shoes, broken bottles and glasses) - something which the hotel have not tackled.

I am a resident in the House of York apartments opposite the hotel and our lives have been seriously disrupted since the hotel opened. Despite numerous complaints to the council and the hotel itself, nothing has been done. Noise levels are out of control at the weekend and the street is filthy come monday morning.

I now fear that if this alcohol licence is granted it will only increase the disruption on an otherwise quiet street. The hotel have shown an inability to manage residents when they don't have a bar, I am concerned they will have no way of controlling things with alcohol being sold.

I think it would be a short sighted and irresponsible move to grant the licence which would cause further distress to residents on the street (which also contains offices and a secondary school).

Good morning

I live at Caspar House on Charlotte Street and up until earlier this year, I have enjoyed living in the street since I first moved here in 2013.

I have already registered a complaint with my local MP Shabana Mahmood, Cllr Kath Harley, Cllr Sir Albert Bore and Cllr Carl Rice about the general upset the StayCity Hotel has brought to the residents of Charlotte Street since it opened because of anti-social behavior from the residents of the hotel particularly over a weekend.

Since this hotel has opened the tone of the street has been lowered significantly because of the standard of guests that the hotel is attracting. When the plans were put up for discussion, some of us from Charlotte Street attended a meeting to discuss the hotel and we were all assured by the hotel management/owners that it would only be business visitors and families that would be staying there. However, this is not the case - it is full of noisy and disruptive stag and hen parties and general gangs of people who have no regard or respect for the local environment they are staying in.

On a regular basis (mainly Thursdays to Sundays) we have to put up with:

- Gangs of youths standing on the street late at night who are noisy, drunk and smoking drugs openly on the street
- Gangs of young men shouting and swearing loudly, urinating on the street including against our apartment block Caspar House, the House of York (the block directly opposite the hotel) and the college
- General litter including food, pizza boxes and empty bottles and beer cans being left on the street, this has attracted seagulls to the area.

As you will appreciate this is not what we want and as a result we have started to ask for our street to be cleaned more because the hotel only clears the pavement directly outside its own building.

The way I see this is that we all share the street, but since the StayCity has opened it does not act fairly or properly in its obligation to respect that ethos and as a result their guests make it very unpleasant for residents who permanently live here. For the record, we never had this much trouble when the Travelodge was the only hotel on our street.

I am alarmed to see that the StayCity wants to obtain a license to sell alcohol in the hotel, please for the sake of the residents of Charlotte Street who share the street with the hotel please do not grant this license as I really dread what will happen if their customers are allowed to buy alcohol on tap, it is bad enough that they can buy alcohol from the Co-op supermarket next door to the hotel.

Before the hotel is allowed to sell alcohol it should make a investment in committing to stopping its guests and their anti-social behaviour and once this has been tested and proven that is it working, then the application should be reviewed again.

I am interested to hear your comments and your proposed actions on this matter.

Hello,

I'm writing to object to the above premises licence application, concerning Staycity Aparthotel Newhall Square, 88 Charlotte Street, Birmingham B3 1PW.

I am a local resident - in fact, I live directly opposite Staycity at House of York, Charlotte Street.

My experience of witnessing how the hotel is managed, the amount of alcohol that is already consumed in it, & the inability of the management and staff (particularly the door staff) to control the behaviour of their (frequently drunk) guests (particularly at week-ends), informs my view that this application should not be approved.

My specific objections in terms of the licensing objectives relate to the prevention of public nuisance, and the prevention of harm to children.

Concerning public nuisance, there is already considerable late-night noise, particularly on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights (and early mornings) from hotel guests smoking (and drinking) outside the premises, and returning or leaving in cabs etc. Currently, guests either arrive with plenty of alcohol that they have brought with them, and/or buy it from the Cooperative Food Store just a few yards away from the hotel. The hotel's management and door staff are already incapable of controlling the noise and anti-social behaviour of many of their guests, and there is no evidence, or likelihood, that they would be able to prevent people buying alcohol on their premises from taking it outside, or that that they would be able to stop non-guests from accessing the premises and buying alcohol there. Granting a licence to Staycity would only exacerbate, in my view, the existing problems at the hotel.

The second grounds for my objection concerns the prevention of harm to children. The hotel's (non-noisy) guests often include families with young children, and any increase in the availability of alcohol on the premises, and an increase in the number of people drinking in the public areas of the hotel, could only impact negatively on them.

If, despite these objections, the committee is minded to grant the application, then I would strenuously request that a licence be granted for on-sales only and that the last time for the sale of alcohol should be no later than 22.00. But in fact I consider the reasons against granting the licence altogether to be strong enough to request that the committee turn down the application altogether.

I note that StayCity Apartments have made an application (no. 96476) to Birmingham City Council for a licence to sell alcohol on their premises, which is located across the road from our development. I write to strongly oppose the granting of this licence.

The opening of StayCity Apartments has considerably altered the nature of Charlotte Street in only a few months of business. Previous to the opening of the hotel, Charlotte Street has been a reasonably quiet residential street. You will, of course, be aware, that Travelodge have operated a hotel franchise for several years in the street. In the main, there has been little significant disruption from this hotel over the years.

This character is now no longer present within Charlotte Street. Each weekend brings large groups of guests who have come to explore Birmingham's nightlife. These groups are persistently rowdy; there is often noise spilling out from the apartments located at the front of the complex. Those coming to the front of the building to smoke are also persistently loud.

Even more disruptive is the level of noise caused by guests returning from a night out. Many like to loiter at the front of the hotel due in part, again, to its use as a smoking area. Despite these measures, the same issues persist. The impact of the measures taken by the hotel has been minimal. I am deeply concerned that the grant of a licence to serve alcohol on site will serve to further exacerbate the issue, exclusively caused by StayCity Apartments.

It is clear that the decision to apply for this licence is a purely commercial one. The Apartments are already served by a Co-Op, which sells alcohol until 11.00 pm, 7 days per week, and a pub (The Queens Arms), the combination of which allows guests to enjoy alcohol both in their rooms at any time and socially during licensed hours. Both of these amenities are less than 100 metres from the hotel. As most of the weekend trade is already staying in groups, there is no additional need to provide a social space for alcohol to be enjoyed in.

Granting a licence is likely, however, to increase the already detrimental effect that the hotel has already had on local residents. Alcohol will now be even more freely available than it already is, leading to louder guests, and a probable increase in people coming outside to smoke throughout the day and night, causing even greater disturbance. We believe that this level of impact is a step that is significant and disproportional on residents.

We would urge you to take the quality of life of residents on the street into serious consideration when deciding to grant this licence. It appears to bring no benefit to anyone, except the shareholders of the hotel who do not have to live with the local impact. We acknowledge that living in a city centre brings with it a certain level of noise; it is what makes our centre so vibrant. However, it seems deeply unfair to permit such a significant change to a residential street in order to simply serve the financial interest of a large company.

Dear Sir or Madam,

I am writing in regards to the licence application Ref:96476 for StayCity Apartments New Hall Square. I live directly opposite the hotel and am writing to strongly oppose the granting of the licence as I am certain that the licence will only compound the negative impact the hotel has had on the lives of the residents of Charlotte Street since it opened.

I have owned my apartment since October 2014 and until StayCity opened in February this year I have loved living in what was a quiet, clean residential street so close to the city centre. While I understand that living near the city will naturally mean there is noise, particularly on weekend evenings, the Travelodge Hotel and the Queens Arms pub on the road have rarely caused any disturbance and it has always been transient when it did occur. However since the StayCity Apartments opened there have been a marked change in the noise and rubbish on the street. The street is now covered with empty alcohol bottles, take away containers and at weekends vomit can frequently be seen outside our building.

This is due to the fact that the StayCity hotel is predominantly used by large groups who are in Birmingham for either stag and hen parties or nights out in Birmingham, despite the hotel's claims that the clientele are largely business or family guests. They often bring crates of alcohol with them and can be seen buying large quantities of alcohol at the Co-Op mini-supermarket which is next door, and, it should be noted, is open from 7am until 11pm every night. There are large groups of drunk guests creating significant noise from early evening where it can be heard that they are having parties in their rooms, then throughout the night when they are leaving for and returning from nights out in the city centre, typically until 4am at weekends.

The front of the hotel is used as the smoking area, which also causes significant disturbance to those living on Charlotte Street as the smokers come out throughout the night and as stated are frequently drunk and loud, making it impossible to sleep. Unfortunately this occurs every weekend and frequently during the week. The hotel management have employed security staff to try and control the guests, a move it should be noted that the Travelodge have never had to employ. However they are often unresponsive and I have had to contact the hotel numerous times throughout the night since the hotel opened to get the security staff to quieten the guests as they are shouting in the street. As recently as 7<sup>th</sup> July I had to call the Jewellery Quarter Police as there were guests of StayCity who were on the street outside the hotel drunk and shouting throughout the night. They were drinking on the street throughout the night and were hugely disruptive. Calls to the hotel only resulted in the security guards moving the guests a few meters down the road where they were still just as audible. It should be noted that this was a Wednesday night and the third night in a row that the residents of House of York were unable to sleep due to the drunk guests at StayCity.

Numerous bottles and cans of alcohol are left on the street and in our driveway arches, which despite discussing with StayCity they take no responsibility for other than the area of pavement directly outside their front door. The road now looks dirty and unkempt all the time due to this. There is a secondary school 100 meters from the hotel and the children will often walk down Charlotte Street on their way to school and I have had to stop children taking the half-empty bottles; by granting an alcohol license to the hotel it will surely just increase the problem.

StayCity Newhall Square has caused significant disruption and upset to the residents of Charlotte Street since its opening and this is largely in part to the drunk nature of the guests. As stated above, the guests already have easy access to alcohol at the Co-Op shop next door and in the numerous pubs and bars within walking distance to the hotel. Giving the hotel an alcohol licence would benefit no one apart from the shareholders of the hotel who are interested only in profit. I implore you to consider the local residents who have to live with the consequences of the hotel and their guests and decline the application for an alcohol licence; it will surely only cause greater disruption and benefit no one.

I note that, several weeks after opening, small signs urging guests to be mindful of residents have sporadically been displayed. A security guard is now also used across the weekend and during the week.

Despite these measures, the same issues persist. The impact of the measures taken by the hotel has been minimal. I am deeply concerned that the grant of a licence to serve alcohol on site will serve to further exacerbate the issue, exclusively caused by StayCity Apartments.

It is clear that the decision to apply for this licence is a purely commercial one. The Apartments are already served by a Co-Op, which sells alcohol until 11.00 pm, 7 days per week, and a pub (The Queens Arms), the combination of which allows guests to enjoy alcohol both in their rooms at any time and socially during licensed hours. Both of these amenities are less than 100 metres from the hotel. As most of the weekend trade is already staying in groups, there is no additional need to provide a social space for alcohol to be enjoyed in.

Granting a licence is likely, however, to increase the already detrimental effect that the hotel has already had on local residents. Alcohol will now be even more freely available

than it already is, leading to louder guests, and a probable increase in people coming outside to smoke throughout the day and night, causing even greater disturbance. We believe that this level of impact is a step that is significant and disproportional on residents.

We would urge you to take the quality of life of residents on the street into serious consideration when deciding to grant this licence. It appears to bring no benefit to anyone, except the shareholders of the hotel who do not have to live with the local impact. We acknowledge that living in a city centre brings with it a certain level of noise; it is what makes our centre so vibrant. However, it seems deeply unfair to permit such a significant change to a residential street in order to simply serve the financial interest of a large company.

Good afternoon,

Having been involved with the licensed trade for close to twenty years, I would like to strongly object to this license application for the following reasons:

**1. The prevention of crime and disorder**

The clientele of Staycity are implied by their marketing to be business guests and families. Whilst there are some business guests and families that stay there, the vast majority of weekend guests are young people looking for a cheap night out. Many can be seen purchasing quantities alcohol from the Co-Operative store on Charlotte Street or shipping in crates. It is a regular occurrence to see young males swigging from bottles in the street and drinking from cans in the reception area. Those who have been to the many clubs and bars in the city centre return at intermittent intervals all through the night until 6am. Many are drunk, noisy and abusive. I have photographic evidence of this behaviour and also photographic evidence of the inaction of hotel security.

Since the premises opened, the litter on Charlotte Street has increased ten fold. From takeaway wrappers to vodka bottles to condoms – all of which I have witnessed being thrown from cars by people parking up to enter Staycity.

The smell of cannabis smoke regularly comes in through our windows which is unpleasant as well as illegal. The guests smoking cannabis do so on the House of York side of the road to escape the view of security staff. When challenged, many of these people become aggressive.

**2. Public safety**

I have witnessed drug use outside the apartments, along with discarded 'laughing gas' canisters strewn up and down the street. These problems have been mentioned to Staycity management. Whilst I understand that the gas canisters are not illegal, I believe that with the combination of gas, alcohol and any other drugs

that Staycity guests are consuming, it will only be a matter of time before a fatality occurs. Police have been called to the premises several times recently – once involving a knife attack.

### **3. Prevention of public nuisance**

As residents of The House of York, Charlotte Street, Birmingham, myself and my partner have had our lives turned upside down since Staycity opened. We currently have a case open with Environmental Health (case **WK/008308932**, Contact name – Paul Samms) who are investigating our complaints of nuisance noise caused by Staycity guests. I believe that the addition of an alcohol licence will increase the likelihood of public disturbance to local residents. I am of the firm opinion that due to the fact that Staycity cannot control their guests when they have been drinking elsewhere, it would be foolish to expect them to be able to control them whilst drinking in their own premises.

Urination and vomiting in the street and also in the private archways of House of York have also been witnessed.

The 'smoking area' at the front of the building currently causes the most disturbance. This occurs mostly at weekends but can happen on any day between 11pm and 5am.

This has caused us no end of problems. We initially had to move our mattress into our living room as it has fewer windows than the master bedroom.

We have now taken the drastic step of moving our bed into our box room at the rear of our flat. We should not have to live like this.

### **4. The protection of children from harm**

As the previous points should illustrate, any children staying at this premises with their families are already exposed to far more than any child ever should. To even consider that an already noisy environment with regular drug users, groups of drunk youngsters and other anti social behaviour would be an appropriate setting for children to be staying in is positively ludicrous. The belief that adding a premises licence into the mix would not increase the already extensive problems and badly managed nuisance is quite frankly disturbing and worrying.

That Staycity and Birmingham City Council would even contemplate an alcohol licence for this premises is beyond ridiculous.

The other Birmingham Staycity site does not have a licence, despite it being in a more appropriate area for such.

It is my opinion that to allow Staycity to serve alcohol, Birmingham Council would be giving the green light to Staycity to continue to operate as they are – without thought or valid consideration for the families who wish to stay in their premises.

Reading the Tripadvisor reports on this premises, many of the guests who stay there report internal noise constantly throughout the night with little or minimum action taken to prevent it.

I look forward to hearing your reply and verdict.





Please find an update regarding the above.

The Staycity Hotel has residents of the House of York in Charlotte St living on the opposite of the road.

Environmental Health have received 1 complaint of noise nuisance on 12th May 2016 and we understand that a number of other residents have made representations. The complainant has complained of loud noise from patrons within the bedroom areas, staff activities within the main reception lobby (i.e. sound of telephones ringing etc) as well as noise from taxi horns and patrons accessing the external areas

Officers witnessed intrusive noise from the Staynehall Hotel between 24<sup>th</sup> July 2016 at 23:50 and 25<sup>th</sup> July 00:25

The noise included patrons talking and shouting, taxi engines adding to overall higher background night noise levels. The noise was said to come in waves of short duration but frequent enough to disturb sleep. Officers noted that the tenant has to relocate to the rear bedroom to try and escape noise. Officers recommended relocation of taxi rank to the next street.

NME (noise monitoring equipment) has been retrieved from the complainants property. Recordings for 15<sup>th</sup> August 2016 between 2 - 2:30 am. Unfortunately, it has not been possible to collect a full data set as the equipment had a power failure (we were expecting up to 4 hours worth of recordings as opposed to the half an hour collected). I have analysed the recording and note that voices from people were well above the background noise level.

Due to the loss of data it has been difficult to judge the impact of noise from the recordings. It is clear however, that if these noise episodes continued throughout the early hours the complainants may have been subjected to noise nuisance.

Env health is concerned that residents will suffer as result noise nuisance from:

1. patrons within the premises (i.e. bedrooms with windows open)
2. patrons in the external areas.
3. noise from staff activities (i.e. phones) from within the reception area.
4. Taxi's.

In the light of further information and discussion with the applicant since the representation, I have asked the company to consider agreeing modifications to the original list of conditions.

Please find final list of suggested conditions attached.

Please accept my apologies for taking so long to bring this update, as well as the late submission of evidence.

Unfortunately, I had forgotten to submit the information when Officers witnessed intrusive noise and in the case of the noise monitoring information the department was unable to analyse the results until this morning as the recording equipment was not retrieved from the complainant's property until last Thursday afternoon.





1. The Hotel Manager shall ensure that a written agreement is made with reputable taxi companies to ensure that when taxi's pick up and drop off customers from the licensed premises noise from these vehicles does not cause a public nuisance to local residents.
2. Customers who require a taxi from the site shall be advised by staff to use taxi companies specified by the Hotel Manager.
3. Notices shall be displayed within the licensed premises for customers to view giving details of taxi companies to use.
4. The Hotel Manager shall ensure notices shall be displayed near the entrance and exits of the Hotel at a weekend advising customers who wish to use the outside areas that they should do so with respect for the nearby residents and keep noise levels to a minimum.
5. The Hotel Manager shall be responsible for ensuring that patrons wishing to utilise the outside areas do so quietly and that noise from patrons moving to and from the external areas is kept to a minimum.
6. The Hotel Manager shall be responsible for ensuring that the external areas do not create a public nuisance to neighbours at the premises and if necessary will:
  - a) restrict the number of people utilising the outside areas at any one time.
  - b) direct people away from neighbouring residential premises.
  - c) increase the number of stewards/doorman to control customers.
7. The Hotel Manager shall be responsible for ensuring that noise from customers does not cause public nuisance to local residents. If necessary the Hotel Manager will ensure that occupants of bedrooms causing intrusive noise shall close their windows to prevent noise break out.
8. Customers will not be allowed to take food or drink outside the premises after 11pm on any day.
9. From 9 p.m. until 8 a.m. each day all external doors and windows within the licensed area to be closed except for access and egress
10. Guests shall be prevented from using the lounge area after 11pm on any day

The Chief Constable of West Midlands Police applied on 14<sup>th</sup> June 2016 for a review of the Premises Licence under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 for The Acorn, High Street, Erdington, Birmingham B23 6SJ.

Representations have been received from other persons, see Appendices 1 – 6.

Review application is attached, see Appendix 7.

The hearing was initially scheduled to be heard by Licensing Sub Committee C on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2016.

However the Sub Committee resolved to adjourn the hearing to today's date in accordance with Regulations 11 to 13 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings Regulations) 2005 due to a potential breach of the Data Protection Act 1998 as a result of sensitive personal data not being appropriately redacted by West Midlands Police from their Supplementary Evidence bundle.

All parties were notified of the decision made by the Licensing Sub-Committee to adjourn the initial hearing. A copy of the adjournment decision made by the Sub Committee is attached at Appendix 8.

West Midlands Police have resubmitted their Supplementary Evidence bundle, appropriately redacted, see Appendix 9.

The Premises Licence Holders legal representative has resubmitted their Supplementary Evidence bundle, which is attached at Appendix 10.

Dear Licensing

Myself and Cllrs Alden and Beauchamp wish to make representations with regards to the premises licence review that has been submitted for the Acorn by West Midlands Police. We support the review and would ask that the premises licence be revoked on the grounds of Prevention of Crime & Disorder, Public Safety and Prevention of Public Nuisance.

The Acorn is one of several premises within the High Street which we receive complaints from local residents, visitors and shoppers and local businesses. Such complaints have been as recent as the last meeting of the Erdington Ward Committee, where concerns were raised by members of the public in attendance. Many of the complaints also originate from residents of Church Road and other nearby residential roads as they live in close proximity to the premises.

Several of the allegations made to us have included criminal and drug-related activity. Issues regarding the Acorn have been discussed with the Police on a number of occasions over the last few years. The Section 182 Guidance states that the Police should be considered the experts in relation to Crime & Disorder, and they will have access to more evidence and information to demonstrate how this Objective is not being complied with. However, we support the Police and the revocation of the premises licence will prevent further crime and disorder from taking place.

Notwithstanding the above, the premises is also contravening the Objectives of Public Safety and Prevention of Public Nuisance through its operation. Many of the clientele who attend this premises are particularly unsavoury, engaging in loud, drunken raucous both during the day and in the evenings. This includes loud, aggressive behaviour and excessive swearing and profanity. This activity has created an intimidatory atmosphere around the premises, which is made worse by this clientele often standing outside on the pavement drinking and smoking. This has a direct impact of shoppers and visitors to the High Street, who are not able to avoid being witness to this behaviour and many are forced into the road or to cross the street when passing the premises.

Such behaviour is the same as to that witnessed at the former Hairy Lemon pub, which was located just up the High Street. That premises had its licence revoked following a review submitted by the Police. It would therefore be consistent for the Acorn to have its licence revoked on the same grounds so that this troublesome premises can be removed from our High Street.



In my role as BID Manager for the High Street area of Erdington, I wish to make the following points about the above public house for the Premises Licence Review:

- a) The Acorn has for some years now been the source of anti-social behaviour and public safety issues in the town centre.
- b) Obviously inebriated individuals can be seen daily in groups on the pavement outside the premises presenting an intimidating picture to passers-by.
- c) I have had numerous complaints from shoppers and visitors about The Acorn, to the degree that many avoid going to that part of the town centre, or have stopped shopping in the area due to harassment and anti-social behaviour.
- d) There is no doubt that The Acorn has played a large part in deterring shoppers from the High Street, and recent examples of anti-social behaviour, including fights outside the premises, has reinforced this view for many.
- e) The poor reputation that The Acorn has is long running, and shows no sign of improving.
- f) My role includes trying to attract not only shoppers but also investors to the town centre, and The Acorn's reputation has always preceded my efforts.
- g) My view is that The Acorn's reputation and the ongoing behaviour of drinkers there has also affected our chances of creating some semblance of a night-time economy in Erdington. I live local to the High Street myself, and the area around this public house at night is always intimidating.
- h) Businesses nearby have long complained to me about the issues at The Acorn, several refusing to make official complaints because of fear of reprisal.

I would be happy to discuss the content of this letter at the review.

I wholeheartedly support West Midlands Police and our local Councillors in their aim to revoke the licence of The Acorn Public House, High Street, Erdington in line with the licensing objectives of Prevention of Crime & Disorder, Public Safety and the Prevention of Public Nuisance.

On 12 November 2012 I attended a Licensing Sub-committee hearing at Birmingham Council House to complain about the anti-social behaviour concerning the Hairy Lemon Public House on Erdington High Street and succeeded, on 1 May 2013 at another hearing, in helping to achieve the revocation of the licence of that premises. I mentioned to the Police Licensing Officer, Sergeant Walker, at the time that the clientele and the problems would migrate down the High Street to the nearby Acorn and inevitably this has proved to be the case.

I live in the flats situated at the top of Church Road, some fifty yards around the corner from the Acorn and am all too familiar with the problems it causes. The clientele stand outside The Acorn smoking, drinking, using foul language, arguing, littering the pavement with nub ends and cigarette packets, and impeding the progress along the High Street of decent people going about their ordinary business by blocking the pavement with their intimidating presence, despite the Public Space Protection Order in place. It is simpler to cross the road to circumnavigate the Acorn frontage.

Another problem which I believe is likely to be linked to The Acorn is drug users utilising the churchyard of St Barnabas and even the grounds of the flats where I live. (I have found cannabis wraps in the back garden.)

Erdington is a multi-cultural area which is struggling to achieve urban regeneration. The presence of such a licensed premises on the High Street is detrimental to both the commercial interests of local retail outlets and residents alike. I urge you to revoke the licence in support of West Midlands Police and the residents of Erdington .

I write somewhat in the defence of the Acorn Pub License continuing.

While I can see obliquely, why The Cross Keys had its License to present entertainment pulled. I only attended there on Sunday Evenings and noted a slight air of disturbance through a white 'thuggish' element in the crowd.

The Acorn though is a different 'kettle of fish' - a mixed white and black crowd (especially on Friday and Saturday Evenings), with young people there and old persons, with the group of 30-40 year olds missing to a large extent, for whatever reason.

I would dispute the Police's assertion that there is fighting within the Pub. I would ask that they prove that. I go there extremely often and have never seen a fight within the Pub. You will always get minor disputes outside a Pub, as with every Pub.

Of the other charges placed, I can say that I have never been offered anything stolen to buy, if that occurs. I am white and older - maybe that is why.

It seems to me that the wider picture needs to be taken into account. I have no commercial interest in any of the Pubs in Erdington or elsewhere; I submit only as a consumer; where I quote a person - that person has said that directly to me, and I attest that is what they said.

Martin & Chris (can't quite remember Martin's last name at the moment, though begins with a B). I have it written down somewhere, owned the Hairy Lemon. They took strong umbrage when I said it was closed down the second time for drugs - they said that was not true, in the second instance it was for fighting. They had had the Pub for a short time, according to them and were trying to get it under control from any fighting - they run numerous other pubs, Dubella in Boldmere and a second Dubella (in Brindley Place, near to the Bank bar restaurant) - so they are experienced in the Pub trade.

So Hairy Lemon lost, Cross Keys - now with limited music; and now the possibility of the Acorn Pub to be closed down on Erdington High street, so what would Erdington be left with - no single Pub on the High Street with entertainment. Where will people go? Fights on Street, perhaps. Music entertainment is a harmless way to let off steam after a week of working for all.

The strength of the Acorn needs to be taken into account - white and black people side by side, happy and tolerant, every night of the week. Any trouble I have seen outside of the Pub or any Pub has always been - one girl/bloke jealous of another; too much drink; the security people do a good job, in a friendly manner, of asking anyone who acts like trouble to leave. What the expelled then subsequently do in the High Street cannot be fairly held at the Licensee's head. Often, persons are told 'you have too much - no more drinks to be served to you'.

The Police have listed a litany of 'crimes' in a hysterical way 'a catalogue of' crime. The Conservatives have now run with this - by putting a flyer through every letterbox based on encouraging fear. I am sure most people who will vote to revoke will have never seen any problem in or out of the Acorn. Erdington is a working class area.

The grounds for this application are that the licensing objectives in terms of the prevention of Crime and Disorder, public safety and the prevention of public nuisance are being undermined in that:

Over the past year the premises has seen a catalogue of crime and disorder take place which has included disorder, fights, anti-social behaviour, intelligence informing police of drug dealing and stolen property from local shops being sold in the premises.

Some of the incidents that have occurred have also involved weapons ranging from a knife taken by a customer from the premises kitchen onto to the High Street following a fight involving intoxicated customers from the pub. Also quite recently information was passed to the police that a regular drug dealer had entered the location and was in possession of a gun.

Over the months both the licensing officer and the local neighbourhood policing team have attempted to work closely with all the DPS's and the licence holder to address the issues at the location and most recently addressing the licence conditions imposed by the licensing committee following a review in October 2010. It is also suspected that the current DPS has had a blasé attitude to reporting crime and disorder at the location.

It is quite evident that management at the premises is inadequate and falls below the standard expected of responsible operators. The current DPS's has not met their responsibilities to the role in ensuring that the licensing objectives are being promoted. This has been evident in their time at the location, incidents have occurred and no staff have called for the police and there have been occasions when the DPS has been far from truthful when giving incident details to the police.

By reason of the matters aforesaid, it is felt that it would be a necessary and proportionate response to request a review of the premises licence. West Midlands Police believe that due to the history of the premises there are no solutions to its problems as they were addressed at the last review in October 2010. Conditions were put in place then in an attempt to quell the issues but it is evident that this has not worked. It has also been shown that the last two DPS's that have been put in place by the licences holder resulting in the reviews has also had no bearing on the way the location has been run or reduced the crime and disorder that's taken place. West Midlands Police respectfully request that the licensing committee use all the options available to them when assessing the evidence and making a decision on the future of this licence.

The following incidents have been noted by Police:

Over the past 1 months the location has seen:

1. All incidents relate to the location and have been seen as under the control of the premises. They have included drunken violent crime, disorder and anti-social behaviour.
2. Reports of crime which include criminal damage, assaults, drunk & disorderly, wounding.
3. Intelligence logs which contain information of drug dealers frequenting the location, information regarding assaults and wounding and information that stolen property from local shops are being sold in the pub.
4. Also over these months the conditions have been breached on several occasions, this being:
  - Customers being allowed to drink at the front of the premises
  - Customers being served to excess.
  - On occasions when responsible authorities request CCTV it's taken days to be supplied as staff have no knowledge of its use.
  - Staff training records have not been produced and it's believed that they didn't exist.

It is the submission of West Midlands Police that since March 2011 these premises have become associated with alcohol fuelled disorder and serious crime which has been caused by poor management at the location. Attempts have been made to work with management to eradicate the problems associated with the location.

The licensing objectives are therefore being undermined in terms of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and it is at the expense of financial gain for the premises.

I am PC 1978 Deano Walker of the West Midlands Police stationed at Erdington Police Station and I currently hold the post of local policing Licensing Officer for the Birmingham North Local Policing Unit which covers the Erdington Wards and the main High Street.

I am making this statement in relation to drink related crime and disorder, anti Social behaviour and large number of police calls to the Acorn Public House on Erdington High Street, Birmingham.

#### The Community

The High Street in Erdington and the other surrounding streets are a main shopping area in the Erdington area and it's used by the local community and visitors on a daily basis.

Erdington has a diverse community with the shops themselves serving the local people who live within it. There is a variety of ages that use the High Street, elderly, young mothers and their children, school children; office workers from the adjoining business are just an example of the local community and workers using the High Street on a daily basis.

Along the High Street and also within walking distance of the Acorn are 11 other Public Houses & Clubs where alcohol is served on premises. Along with on sales in the local area there are also over 20 premises that serve customers off sales alcohol and are all again within walking distance of the Acorn.

Historically the High Street has suffered with alcohol related offences due to the large the number of premises where alcohol can be both purchased and consumed. This area is policed by the local Neighbourhood Police Team consisting of both Police Officers and PCSO's.

The area was designated an alcohol free zone in August 2004 and it covers the whole of the Erdington as well as the High Street. This has given officers the power to direct people not to drink in a public place but not on license premises and with these powers the High Street has seen a significant drop in street drinking.

**Continuation of Statement – PC Deano Walker**

Members of the local community, shoppers and local traders on the High Street have expressed their concerns to local police regarding their experiences with persons under the Influence of alcohol and the Acorn has been identified as a location causing these issues. Although there is no specific information that customers drink alcohol purchased from the Acorn local shoppers, businesses and community leaders have informed police of the intimidation they feel with drunken customers from the Acorn stood at the front of the premises. Police are informed of arguments taking place, fights, foul language, noise issues and general antisocial behaviour and has taken place both during the day and the evening. People say they fear walking past the premises (often crossing the road to avoid the pavement outside the pub) because of customers stood outside smoking and also leaving the location intoxicated. The information obtained from these members of the public has been given verbally as they fear reprisals if they make a formal complaint or give evidence before this licensing committee.

**Acorn Public House.**

The Acorn was previously policed by the D2 Operational Command Unit from Queens Road Police Station where the police licensing officer was based. In April 2009 the West Midlands Police Force went through a restructure with boundary changes. The Acorn then fell under the policing boundary of the Birmingham North Local Policing Unit with the command station being in Sutton Coldfield. This change saw a change of licensing officer and it soon became apparent to the licensing officer the issues the premises caused on the High Street. There were reported incidents of crime and disorder, antisocial behaviour which was all alcohol related.

In September 2009 the licence was transferred into a company name of "Total Pub Solutions Limited" with the directors appointing the designated premises supervisor (DPS). With all the issues being caused local police and the licensing officer attempted to resolve them. This was with the new management, in particular the director "Martin Cartwright" and the DPS. This unfortunately did not work and the issues were due to the current DPS that was appointed by the licence holder. When the Police brought the issues to the attention of the licence holder and evidenced the DPS was covering up and ignoring the issues police concerns were brushed off and not believed. As a result of this in October 2010 the police requested a review of the licence which resulted in the DPS being removed, hours of trading being reduced and several conditions placed on the licence in an attempt to improve the premises.

In November 2013 the licence was transferred into company name "Sheldon Pubs Limited" but it still remained under the same director's control as the previous licence holder. However, over the years there has been a steady flow of issues with the premises and again all has been due to the current DPS. The DPS has turned a blind eye to issues in the pub, not abided with the conditions and not being supportive to police when investigating crime and disorder. Police have been called to many issues at the pub with no complaints from victims of crime and the DPS stating that it was not under the roof or control of the premises.

Over the past 12 months incidents have increased, culminating in serious incident of drunken violent disorder, firearms incidents, known drug dealers using the pub, serious assaults which have included wounding's on customers and staff and licence conditions being breached on many occasions.

Quiet recently the current DPS (who was off premises) when an incident occurred involving a female removing a large knife from the pubs kitchen, walking out onto the High Street looking for a male she had just been involved in an altercation with. The following day the Police Licensing Officer spoke to the DPS who stated she was in her 1<sup>st</sup> floor living accommodation to the pub whilst it occurred but she was not aware of the incident and. CCTV showed the female with the knife from their kitchen on the High Street, she returned to the pub where she was hidden by staff whilst police searched for her and the

knife. The CCTV then showed the DPS returning after the incident and 20 minutes later shows the female offender leaving via the back of the pub with the DPS.

With the CCTV evidence Police suspect that the DPS was fully aware of the whole incident and removed the offender to avoid her arrest. This suspicion was confirmed when Police believe that the staff hiding the offender is their mother and the DPS is the aunt of the offender.

Following this incident Police met with the licence holder who stated the DPS was mistaken and was not on site or even in her accommodation upstairs but in fact received a call regarding the incident. West Midlands Police believe that the DPS was fully aware of the whole incident; her sister/staff member hid the offender being her daughter, that it was her niece with the knife on the High Street and then lied to the police about the events.

Concerns for police since this incident, the evidence was been given to the licence holder but the DPS still remains in place. This is either because the licence holder continues to have faith in their current DPS or the evidence given to them is not believed.

It is quite evident that management at the premises has been inadequate for many years and falls below the standard expected of responsible operator. The Premises Licence holder has appointed the past 2 DPS's and they have not met their responsibilities to ensure that the licensing objectives are being promoted. Police believe that both the DPS and the licence holders have put profit over public safety and have shown a clear lack of responsibility.

The question has to be asked that the past two companies holding the licence (all having the same directors) has appointed the past two DPS's who have all failed the premises, the local community, failed to promote the licensing objectives and caused the trigger of a second review in nearly six years. The committee now have to question the suitability of the licence holder and the directors appointed.

By reason of the matters aforesaid, it was felt that it was necessary and proportionate response to request this review of the premises licence with a view to revoke the licence fully. West Midlands Police believe that due to the history of the premises there are no solutions to its problems as they were addressed at the last review in 2010. Conditions were put in place in an attempt to quell the issues but it is evident that over the past 12 months that this has not worked. It has also been shown that over the past 6 years the two changes in DPS's it has had no bearing on the way the location has been run or reduced the crime and disorder that's taken place.

It is evident in this file that the Acorn Pub and has been and will continue to be a drain on Police, ambulance resources, accident and emergency along with the NHS in general.

The Acorn has been and will continue to be a threat to both customers and staff from the potential risk of assault.

The general public going about their business have had to and will continue to endure antisocial behaviour from customers drinking in the pub as they come into the vicinity of the premises and local business will continue to loose trade as their customers avoid the area due to the crime and antisocial behaviour that is associated with the pub.

It is requested by West Midlands Police that the committee consider revocation of the licence held at the Acorn Public House.

I am Police Community Support Officer SUSAN PATRICIA HASKINS (30856) and I currently parade from Erdington Police Station, Wilton Road, Erdington, Birmingham.

On Monday 6<sup>th</sup> June 2016 I was on high visibility foot patrol on Erdington High Street in company with my colleague, PCSO ROY THOMAS (30836). The weather was extremely warm, and the High Street was very busy with many shoppers still purchasing.

At approximately 16:45hrs. a member of staff from the ICELAND STORE (who I now know to be [REDACTED]) hailed us across the road saying he had been told by a customer that she had witnessed a female come into the store and shoplifted foil and a drink. She gave him a description. I do not know this customers name. Given the description, MR [REDACTED] said he could not remember her name but believed that she had a store ban. He gave me a description of a female, wearing grey top & bottoms and said he thought she may have gone into the ACORN PUBLIC HOUSE, which is situated nearby. I asked MR [REDACTED] to go and view the CCTV to see if he could ascertain what the female may have taken without offering payment, later leaving the store. I went outside and stood by the entrance to the pub and had a cursory look inside. I observed a white female playing pool in a grey top & joggers. I went back outside and asked Control for Officers assistance, as the person matching the description was possibly inside the public house. Unfortunately, no resources were available at the time of my call to assist.

I noticed there was a small group of approximately 4 customers by the door, most of them smoking. They looked very nervous as I went back a second time to stand nearer to the pub entrance. I looked down and spotted a small joint of fresh pork loin meat displaying an ICELAND sticker, with a sales value of £5.00 propping open the pub door

and a further 5 joints of the same meat secreted behind the other door inside an orange COST CONVERTERS plastic carrier bag. There was a black male, again quite nervous, standing less than 12 inches in front of the items and I asked him, "ARE THESE YOURS?" (I now know this person is referred to locally as "T" or "TREVOR". I do not know his surname) to which he replied, "I DON'T KNOW, SOME WOMAN LEFT THEM!". I said, "IN THAT CASE, YOU WON'T MIND ME TAKING THEM". I picked the meat up and took everything back into the store.

I confirm there were 6 joints of fresh pork loin £5.00 each - totalling £30.00, each bearing a retailers tag for ICELAND. No receipt was visible inside the bag. Once in the store I went upstairs to the main office, where my colleague PCSO ROY THOMAS had accompanied ICELAND employee, [REDACTED] to identify the female believed responsible on their CCTV system.

When the employee spotted the female matching the description on screen by the meat counter (timed at 16:10hrs) you can see the female placing several pieces of meat into white plastic carrier bags, and walking back out of the store, the reverse way, through the "in entrance" without offering payment.



Looking at the CCTV I am able to confirm the woman on screen was not the same female I had observed playing pool inside the ACORN PUBLIC HOUSE. The female inside the PUBLIC HOUSE was white, and the female on the CCTV is mixed race, wearing a grey top, joggers, with grey/silver Nika trainers. She wore over a grey top a short black hoodie, with beige detail at the top and matching elbow pads. She had a wide hair band, grey/black which pulled her hair back. She was of slim build.

From CCTV footage, the witness had identified a second incident of shoplifting of foil and a drink, where the same female walks straight past the tills, again without offering payment. This was timed at 16:37hrs. The female was wearing the same clothes as the previous incident timed earlier at 16:10hrs.

I advised our control the person I believed responsible could not be found and had handed the meat back to the ICELAND.

I continued my patrols in company with PCSO THOMAS looking in the other larger retail stores on the off chance the female had not left the High Street and had continued shopping.

I left the area approximately 17:30hrs with PCSO THOMAS with no further sightings.

Also I'm struggling with getting the CCTV from The Acorn every time I ring I get the answer machine and haven't had chance to pop down. Officers were told on the night by Jackie that they couldn't have the CCTV as she didn't know how to work it, is this a breach of their licence conditions? Surely the licensee should be able to work it?

**I know you talk to Jackie around the issues I send to you but I now truly believe she is paying you lip service. If these obstructions continue we will put a formal request to you to**

replace the DPS and if that wont be done then we will request Birmingham city council licensing committee to consider it at a review.

Deano, as above really, thought you might be interested in a chat with her. Also I'm struggling with getting the CCTV from The Acorn every time I ring I get the answer machine and haven't had chance to pop down. Officers were told on the night by Jackie that they couldn't have the CCTV as she didn't know how to work it, is this a breach of their licence conditions? Surely the licensee should be able to work it?

**Proposed draft Conditions  
The Acorn, High Street, Erdington, Birmingham**

**Prevention of Crime and Disorder**

1. The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that all staff members engaged or to be engaged, in selling alcohol at the premises shall receive the following induction training. This training will take place prior to the selling of such products:
  - The lawful selling of age restricted products
  - Refusing the sale of alcohol to a person who is drunk

Further verbal reinforcement/refresher training covering the above will be carried out thereafter at intervals not to exceed 8 weeks, with the date and time of the verbal reinforcement/refresher training documented.

All such training undertaken by staff members shall be fully documented and recorded. All training records shall be made available to West Midlands Police, officers of the local authority and officers from the Trading Standards team upon request.

2. An incident log will be maintained by the premises showing a detailed note of incidents that occur in the premises. The log will be inspected and signed off by the DPS (or a person with delegated authority) at least once a week. The log book should be kept on the premises and be available for inspection at all times the premises are open by authorised officers of the Licensing Authority or the police. An incident will be defined as being one which involves an allegation of a criminal offence. Any refusals made for alcohol service e.g. underage, will also be recorded in writing and feedback given to staff as relevant.
3. No open vessels, bottles or other type of container will be allowed outside the front of the premises and notices prominently displayed to this effect.
4. Any person who is barred from the premises shall be forthwith reported to PubWatch and to West Midlands Police with a description if possible.

**Protection of Children from Harm**

5. The premises will operate a "Challenge 25" policy whereby any person attempting to buy alcohol who appears to be under 25 will be asked for photographic ID to prove their age. The recommended forms of ID that will be accepted are passports, official Photographic Identity Cards issued by EU states bearing a hologram or ultraviolet feature, driving licences with a

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photograph, photographic military ID or proof of age cards bearing the 'PASS' mark hologram. The list of approved forms of ID may be amended or revised with the prior written agreement of West Midlands Police, the Licensing Authority and Trading Standards without the need to amend the licence or conditions attaching to it.

6. Signage advertising the 'Challenge 25' policy will be displayed in prominent locations in the premises.

## **POSITION STATEMENT**

### **The Acorn Public House, High Street, Erdington**

1. Sheldon Inns Limited has two directors namely Martin Cartwright and Michael Howard a sleeping director. All day to day running of the company and decisions are made by Mr Cartwright who has 30 years' experience in the trade and the company has 27 pubs under management from various pub companies namely Greene King, Wadworths, Enterprise Inns, Punch Taverns, Admiral Taverns and Star Pubs and Bars. Currently Sheldon have 5 pubs under management from Star.
2. In respect of the Acorn Sheldon has a three year tenancy agreement with Star as landlords and they run it and pay rent to Star and pay for all their beer to Star and they are responsible for paying all bills on a landlord and tenancy arrangement.
3. Sheldon have had the Acorn since September 2009 and dealt with a previous application for a review dated 6<sup>th</sup> September 2010 and confirm that by the hearing on 26<sup>th</sup> October before the Committee Sheldon had dismissed Teresa O'Meara following consultation with Deano Walker of West Midlands Police. She was replaced by Mairead Friel on 5<sup>th</sup> October who proved unsuitable and she was replaced on 22<sup>nd</sup> October 2010 by Jacqueline Vinning.
4. It is written into Sheldon's agreement that they must not do anything to jeopardise the licence and if this was to happen Sheldon would potentially incur a severe financial penalty.
5. Between October 2010 and now there has been very little contact with West Midlands Police (WMP) and the only formal contact was an email from Mr Walker of 31<sup>st</sup> December 2015 stating "If the obstructions continue we will put a formal request to you to replace the DPS and if that won't be done then we will request Birmingham City Council Licensing Committee to consider it at a review". As a matter of record Sheldon have received no such formal request and following receipt of the email mentioned above Mr Cartwright spoke to Mr Walker on the telephone about it and again assured him that Miss Vinning would be competent to use the CCTV and be as cooperative as possible in the future.
6. So far as replacement of the CCTV is concerned Sheldon upgraded the Matrix and installed two additional cameras to fully cover the front of the pub and the entrance and replaced an existing camera that did not work in the pub. This was carried out on 9<sup>th</sup> December 2015 for a sum of £1,550 which goes some way to explain why Miss Vinning was uncomfortable with the new system in the month of December 2015.

7. At the hearing in October 2010 there was some discussion prior to the hearing where the hours of the premises were reduced and the door was left open to Sheldon to reapply to get the hours back to midnight. As a matter of record no such application was ever made as it was clear after a short while that the Police would prefer them to keep the new hours imposed by the Committee despite the fact of a drop in turnover of £1,500 - £2,000 per week. This only goes to show that to Sheldon money is "not paramount".
8. Miss Vinning lives in the flat above the Acorn on her own and is the DPS. She is aged 57 years and has been in the licensed trade for about 20 years. All of those as licensee and she has run a number of difficult pubs including the Pelham Arms in Alum Rock and others in Smethwick and Brownhills. She has an exemplary record as a publican and obtained a Personal Licence in 2005 under grandfather rights.
9. As will be seen above she applied for a change of DPS at the Acorn which took effect on 22<sup>nd</sup> October 2010 and she has held that position ever since. She had already carefully looked at the Acorn having previously been at the Lad in the Lane nearby and decided to take it on. She knew it was going to be a challenge and she got herself some good staff. So far as contact with the Police is concerned she is of the considered opinion that the premises were far harder to run in the early days than now. She now finds things difficult due to having cleared the bad element out in the early days but is of the opinion that that does not stop those people coming back and being a nuisance outside the premises. In addition things are worse outside since the Hairy Lemon closed about three years ago.
10. She strictly enforces the conditions on the licence and in particular has a comprehensive CCTV system with 11 cameras and four outside covering the front and rear of the premises. She has numerous notices in the pub as is shown on the photographs relating to Challenge 21 and drugs and she does not allow any children in the premises at all. She attends almost every Pubwatch meeting and has also asked the Police to have a drug sniffer dog walk through the premises on a Friday evening which they are unable to do due to lack of government funding. She has door control provided by Safetynet who were recommended by Mr Walker and they are at the premises as per conditions every Friday and Saturday from 7pm to 12 midnight. They are more or less the same persons and they do a good job and there have been recent meetings with Safetynet and Mr Walker and his Sergeant Hill who are happy with the running of the door. In the papers there are unsubstantiated allegations about drug dealing in the premises. Miss Vinning states categorically that this does not take place and the toilets are regularly checked. There is a similar suggestion about stolen goods ending up in the Acorn and being sold to customers and staff and this is just not true and if people should come in with bags Miss Vinning asks them to leave. In her opinion she has an exceptional staff who have been with her for three to five years and they are regularly reminded not to serve people who are intoxicated. It is her view that they do a good job. As a matter of record

one other employee Tina Barrett also has a Personal Licence and Adele Sweeney has just applied for hers. As a general rule there is always Tina or Miss Vinning behind the bar and in charge.

11. So far as contact with the Police is concerned Miss Vinning has attended most Pubwatch meetings. Sometimes no one else is there and Mr Walker is usually there on behalf of the Police and he has never said anything to Miss Vinning about the running of the pub. Over the six years she has been there she has not met him in the pub nor at the station. On one occasion last year he mentioned to her that he was going to talk to Mr Cartwright about a review but she cannot remember why it was. That is the only time she has heard review mentioned and there has been nothing in writing or by email to her.
12. Sheldon have dealt with the installation of the upgraded CCTV which was in early December 2015 at a substantial cost. As stated, for a time, Miss Vinning did not know how to download but Mark the installer came in on a couple of occasions and he gave her full guidance on a one-to-one basis so she could download at a Police request. Thereafter Miss Vinning trained Tina and if ever there was a problem Mr Cartwright could get Mark down to help.
13. Miss Vinning has never been told there has been a prosecution for anything that has happened at the public house and if the decision is made to remove her as DPS she will be out of work and would lose her accommodation above the premises and in a situation where she would find it difficult to secure a similar position.
14. Following a meeting between Mr Cartwright and Mr Walker and SafetyNet at Erdington Police Station on 20<sup>th</sup> May 2016 Miss Vinning has in discussion with Mr Cartwright reduced the entertainment to only Friday and Saturday each week, stopping such entertainment on Sunday, Monday and Wednesday as in Sheldon's view entertainment acts as an added reason for people to try to obtain entrance to the premises.
15. So far as the incident on 6<sup>th</sup> June 2016 is concerned Miss Vinning only knew about the earlier problem with a child being manhandled to which the Police were called. She was in the flat for part of the day as it was her day off and later went to collect her dog and was away for about half an hour returning with her dog as shown on the camera. She did not know anything at the time about the incident with the knife and did say to the Police she had been in the flat the whole time but that is not true as she had been away for about an hour to collect the dog. She thinks the Police came the following day to view the CCTV footage and they did operate it as they wanted to do it themselves and she could have done it herself. At no stage did Miss Vinning give a statement to the Police as is stated in their evidence about this incident.

16. Referring to page 2 of Mr Walker's statement "Although there is no specific information that customers drink alcohol purchased from the Acorn". Sheldon do not really understand what he is saying so far as people are being intimidated by people stood outside the premises and they are probably drinking alcohol purchased elsewhere. The Acorn does not and never has sold cans and certainly does not allow glasses outside when customers go for a smoke to the only place available namely the High Street. As will be seen from photograph number 3 taking drinks outside is forbidden.
17. So far as reprisals are concerned Sheldon question why there would ever be any as there is no evidence of this and it is a company that runs 27 pubs and welcomes all constructive criticism.
18. Referring to paragraph 2 of the statement of Mr Walker there is no evidence that the lady in the white trousers was hidden by staff when she came back inside the premises. She may have been in the downstairs staff lavatory. The only one who may have known she was there was Miss Vinning's sister who was an employee. As a matter of record Miss Vinning has dismissed her sister and her daughter the lady in the white trousers in the video is barred from entering the premises.
19. So far as page 3 of Mr Walker's statement is concerned in the second paragraph Mr Cartwright did not say the DPS was not on site or even in her accommodation as he did not know. He did not know that she had received a call about the incident.
20. So far as the DPS remaining in place Mr Cartwright only knew what was being alleged in detail when Mr Potts the company's solicitor, attended at Erdington Police Station on the afternoon of 21<sup>st</sup> July by arrangement to pick up the two bundles of evidence which Mr Cartwright has now read and decided that Miss Vinning remains in place as the best person to run this difficult site. Mr Cartwright who has been in the trade for many years does not accept the management of the premises has been inadequate. He refers to records on his telephone and it shows contact with Mr Walker in December 2014 and then there was none until January 2016 when Mr Cartwright phoned Mr Walker to discuss the premises. Sheldon deny that they have ever put profit above public safety as is alleged.
21. Overall Mr Cartwright does stand by his decision to keep Miss Vinning in place for six years as the best person to run the Acorn. He is also of the considered opinion that it is not proportionate to apply for a review and revoke the Premises Licence in all the circumstances of this case and having considered the evidence put forward by WMP.

### **Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions**

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol:-

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

Where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for sale or consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) the responsible person shall ensure that it is available to customers in the following measures:-

1. Beer or cider - ½ pint;
2. Gin, rum, vodka or whisky - 25ml or 35ml; and
3. Still wine in a glass - 125ml; and

The responsible person must also ensure that customers are made aware of the availability of the aforementioned measures.

Each individual assigned to carrying out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Agency.

**Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with operating schedule**

**2a) General conditions consistent with the operating schedule**

The provision of entertainment facilities (H and I) and late night refreshment is to take place indoors only.

No adult entertainment or services to be provided under the authority of this licence.

All staff are to be trained on the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 so as to promote the four licensing objectives.

**2b) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of crime and disorder**

Prominent signs are to be displayed informing customers of the requirement for "Proof of age for the purchase of alcohol and tobacco".

There is to be no right of entry or re-entry after 23:00.

**2c) Conditions consistent with, and to promote, public safety**

All emergency lighting is to be checked on a monthly basis.

Children are to only be allowed in the Beer Garden under adult supervision.

Staff are to be required to be alert and attentive with regard to broken glass etc.

**2d) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of public nuisance**

When entertainment is provided all doors and windows, save exits, are to be kept closed.

Prominent signs are to be displayed requesting customers vacate the premises quietly and have regard for local residents.

**2e) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the protection of children from harm**

No one under the age of 16 is to be allowed on the premises after 21:00.

### **Annex 3 – Conditions attached after hearing by licensing authority**

#### **3a) General committee conditions**

##### **CCTV -**

The CCTV system at the premises is to be installed to the satisfaction of West Midlands Police. It must include additional cameras in the bar area and on the main door entrance both inside and out. It will be digital recorded for up to 31 days and must be made immediately available on request to all responsible authorities. It must be in operation during opening hours with one hour overlap an hour before opening and an hour after closing. All members of staff are to be trained in the operation of the complete system.

##### **DOOR STAFF -**

All door staff shall be SIA licensed. They will be in place from 1900hrs on Friday and Saturday evenings and up to 30 minutes after closing. They will also be in place for any function night, either private or run by staff from the location. All door staff will wear as a minimum a fluorescent/high visibility tabard jacket which will display "Door Supervisor" to the front and rear. All door staff must book on and off duty and their profiles must be recorded on the premises, this record to be made available on request by any responsible authority.

##### **EVENTS -**

The local policing team and police licensing officer must be informed of any events and be given 28 days notice in writing. Details should include the nature of the event, name and address of booking party, number of persons attending and a full risk assessment for each event. If the police have any concerns with the event in relation to the four licensing objectives, then the police shall have the ability to veto the event.

##### **PUBWATCH -**

The licence holder or the Designated Premises Supervisor must play an active part in the local Pubwatch, work closely with other members in the watch and must be represented at all pre-arranged meetings.

##### **CHALLENGE 21 POLICY -**

The premises shall promote the Challenge 21 policy by training staff on different ID methods. This training will be carried out monthly and be recorded on the premises.

##### **STAFF TRAINING -**

All staff shall be trained monthly both on signs of drug abuse on persons and how to look for signs of use on the premises. Training will also be given on signs of persons drinking to excess. A training record must be kept on the premises and be made available to responsible authorities immediately on request.

**CAPACITY -** The premises must have a full risk assessment carried out by a responsible authority or company. The capacity must be assessed by West Midlands Fire Service and then displayed at the front of the premises.

**SIGNAGE -** The Challenge 21 policy is to be on display at all times. Signage advising customers to "Respect local residents, please leave quietly" is to be displayed around the premises and especially at the exit.

**WIND DOWN TIME -** Music levels will be reduced considerably 30 minutes before last drinks are served, to encourage customers to begin to leave the location as this will indicate the night is ending. It will also reduce noise escaping from the premises through the opening and closing of the main door when customers leave, thereby reducing annoyance to local residents.




