1. Purpose of report:

To consider a relevant representation that has been made in respect of an application to vary the Premises Licence which seeks to amend the licensing plan to include a bar servery and renovation of the first floor to replace the existing bedrooms with a new licensed bar area.

5. Relevant background/chronology of key events:

Smithy Inns Limited applied on 2nd September 2019 to vary the Premises Licence for the Wagon & Horses, 28 Adderley Street, Digbeth, Birmingham, B9 4ED.

A representation has been received from West Midlands Police, as a responsible authority. See Appendix 1.

The application, including the revised plan, is attached at Appendix 2.

Conditions have been agreed with Environmental Health and the applicant, which are attached at Appendix 3.

The current Premises Licence is attached at Appendix 4.

Site Location Plans at Appendix 5.

It should be noted that there is a special policy in force for the Digbeth area. The effect of a special policy is to create a rebuttable presumption that applications for new licences or material variations to existing licences will normally be refused unless it can be shown that the premises concerned will not add to the cumulative impact on the licensing objectives being experienced.

The Council will expect the applicant to demonstrate the steps it will take to promote the licensing objectives. Where relevant representations are made, the Council will consider the application on its individual merits and decide whether to apply the special policy.

When carrying out its licensing functions, a licensing authority must have regard to Birmingham City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Guidance issued by the Secretary of State under s182 of the Licensing Act 2003. The Licensing Authority is also required to take such steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, which are:-

- c. The prevention of public nuisance; and
- d. The protection of children from harm.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the
 audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains
 licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.



In terms of the Environmental Health representation, I am grateful to Paul Samms for his time over the last couple of days and I am pleased to say we have reached an agreement. I have attached a further revised plan which is essence reduces the extent of the licensed area outside – for your ease of reference the area of the yard where the bins are currently positioned has been removed.

In terms of conditions the following have been agreed:

- To replace Condition 2d (Annex 2) There shall be no speakers used for amplified music, speech or sound outside the building as delineated by the red line of the attached plans between the hours of 23:00 10:00
- There Premises Licence Holder shall use all reasonable endeavours to ensure the door between the first floor function room and the bar remains closed save for ingress or egress when the function room is in use.
- On the first floor regulated entertainment shall be limited to the function room only save for activities permitted by virtue of the Live Music Act 2012

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Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises— (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to— (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner; (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either— (a) a holographic mark, or (b) an ultraviolet feature.

The responsible person must ensure that— (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures— (i) beer or cider: ½ pint; (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

(1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. (2) In this condition:— (a) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D + (D x V), where— (i) P is the permitted price, (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; (b) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979; (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence— (i) the holder of the premises licence, (ii) the designated premises a supply of alcohol under such a licence; (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994. (3) Where

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the permitted price would not be a whole number of pennies, the permitted price shall be taken to be the price rounded up to the nearest penny. (4) Where the permitted price on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax, the permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Each individual assigned to carrying out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Agency.

2b) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of crime and disorder

The licence holder will install CCTV in accordance with the reasonable recommendations of West Midlands Police.

2c) Conditions consistent with, and to promote, public safety

Maximum Occupancy Level - 80 persons throughout the premises

2d) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of public nuisance

The provision of entertainment facilities and regulated entertainment shall not take place in the external areas of the premises after midnight.

2e) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the protection of children from harm

All staff will be trained in their responsibilities under the Licensing Act 2003 and any other relevant legislation . This training will be updated on a regular basis and records will be kept of this.

A refusal book will be maintained on the premises at all times. The refusal register will be available for inspection by any of the responsible authorities.

Staff will record all refusals of alcohol and the books will be checked and signed weekly by the DPS.

The licence holder will operate a Challenge 21 Policy as a minimum and only accept photo driving licence, passport or PASS accredited I.D. card as valid proof of age. They will also be vigilant to ensure that adults are not purchasing alcohol for under 18's.

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



