Amendment to Motion, paragraph 2.1

At Motion, paragraph 2.1 delete the second sentence and insert:

Council notes the significant public concern, expressed regardless of political party, in north Birmingham, Walsall and Sandwell about this project together with the concerns expressed by local government partners and the major bus operator in the sector.

Council therefore recommends that the petitions are not discharged, and calls on the executive to suspend the A34 Perry Highway Improvement Scheme, to allow:

- an assessment of what work is essential to be delivered before 2022;
- a full assessment, jointly with stakeholders, of the impact on park and ride development, public transport and congestion in north of the city including the potential for significant congestion while the work is undertaken;
- priority to be given to the rebuilding of Perry Barr station;
- a final scheme to be developed, to be delivered after 2022, that is proven to be a cost-effective use of public money in pursuing the objectives of zero carbon emissions and improved air quality;

- an assessment of the architectural merits of the Perry Barr flyover and its potential, as an arched structure, to contribute to creative design of new developments in the area, noting that demolition and replacement in themselves add significantly to carbon costs
- the continued use of the Perry Barr flyover by bus and other traffic to enable smooth functioning of the A34 and the A34/A453 junction up to 2022.
