- 1. I am a former police officer, having retired from West Midland Police in 2006 after 30 years service. I started my police career in 1976 as a uniformed Constable in the Handsworth area of Birmingham, before moving on to CID in 1979. I was seconded to the Serious and then the Midland Regional Crime & Drugs Squad where I later specialised in drugs and intelligence gathering operations. I left the Midland Regional Crime Squad in 1997 and returned to West Midlands Police where I was stationed at Steelhouse Lane Police Station CID. Following an injury in 1999 I became the Licensing Officer for the Chinese Quarter in Birmingham, I held this position for four years.
- 2. Upon leaving the police in 2006, I set up C.N.A. Risk Management Ltd, a licensing consultancy company providing advice and assistance to operators of licensed premises including: advising on and submitting licensing applications; producing operational management protocols and risk assessments; security advice; mystery shoppers and drugs testing.
- 3. From my experience gained during my time as a police officer responsible for licensing issues, I am aware of how important partnerships between the operators and authorities are. For this reason, a significant amount of my time is spent acting as a liaison between my clients and the responsible authorities. I have attended a number of Licensing hearings as an expert witness in the four licensing objectives.
- 4. C.N.A. Risk Management Ltd is currently retained by a number of clients on a full time basis to a look after their premises situated throughout the midlands. I also provide a licensing consultancy services to many other operators as and when they require assistance, All of my clients are from the late night leisure market including nightclubs, lap dancing venues, restaurants and bars.

- 5. C.N.A. Risk Management were instructed by Solicitor Heath Thomas of Harrison Clark Rickerbys Solicitors to visit the premises known as The Arthouse, a multi-purpose venue in Bissell Street, Highgate, Birmingham. I was to look at the operational side of the venue and to see what issue if any the venue would pose. My company have also been instructed to put in place management protocols and procedures to ensure that the premises meet the licensing objectives, in particular, the prevention of crime and disorder and promotion of public safety.
- 6. In conducting my investigation into possible issues at The Arthouse I have found that in Bissell street on a Friday & Saturday there are what we call 'Boy Racers' driving slowly past the front of Arabian Nites, a venue which is located in the same building, occasionally sounding their horns. This is capable of being a nuisance which may amount to Anti-Social Behaviour.
- 7. I have been liaising with West Midlands Police, Environmental Health and the Highways Department with a proposal to eradicate ASB in Bissell Street, by setting up a temporary road closure each weekend from 9pm through to 4am.
- 8. In my professional opinion, if protocols and procedures are put in place to ensure the premises meet the licensing objectives then the premises can promote the licensing objectives under the licensing act 2003 and will not give rise to/impact upon existing levels of crime and disorder and public nuisance in Bissell Street.

4.	I have since become aware of the letter that accompanies the petition attached a	nd
	marked 'DM1', and having been a resident here for over five years, I am able	ţo
	comment on the issues raised.	

- 5. I live approximately 50 metres from the Shisha Bar known as Arabian Nites. Save for "special" times of the year for example Eld, which can be a bit noisy, I have never experienced any problems with the operation of Arabian Nites.
- 6. does not even live near Arabian Nites, and she would not be affected by its operation at any time.
- 7. I park my car near my home and near the premises, and I am able to say that I have experienced no problems with my car. Neither have my neighbours, and it is simply incorrect to say that we have been hit on many occasions. If these problems really exist in the way that a suggests, then I would have an expectation that the police would be here each night. They haven't, and there is not the problem that suggests.
- 8. I have seen come out with her IPad filming the premises and its clientele. I have also seen her on other occasions going to the park when we had problems with bikers when she has gone straight into the group shouting and swearing at them. I think she just allows small things to bother her, and then she gets involved herself.
- 9. I have not experienced any anti-social behaviour from Arabian Nites. The operator is genuinely concerned about the way in which they operate and has engaged with neighbours. Whilst the parking is sometimes a bit of a bother, I can say that no

neighbours' cars have been hit. I have experienced on one occasion nails in one of my tyres, but that was before Arabian Nites came to the area, and it was possibly due to kids. I cannot say that Arabian Nites has given rise to any problems associated with cars.

- 10. Living so close, I can also confirm that I have never experienced verbal abuse from the customers of Arabian Nites. My daughter works at the and I used to put my head out and look out for her at the end of the evening which would be around closing time for Arabian Nites, and again I can say that I have never experienced any problems at that time.
- 11, I have never been inside Arabian Nites, and I can only comment upon any issues that exist around the premises rather than inside.
- 12. With regards to allegations of drug taking in the Grove and the Croft, again this is nothing to do with Arabian Nites. There is a large problem locally which is quite separate to Arabian Nites, and the two are separate issues. To suggest that customers are linked to drug taking locally is simply untrue. Highgate has its own pre-existing problems.
- 13. Very occasionally, I have heard shouting in the street, again this is not connected to Arabian Nites, there has been the very odd occasion when somebody might have been refused entry and they may have made a little noise then.

We are fearful of further crimes and feel prisoners in our homes. We have gathered video evidence and get verbally abused by the staff from Arabian Nites, calling us nosey, racists etc., we can not let them expand without any consultation or respect for the residents who have lived here for up 50 years, we have many elderly and young family's who suffer and the constant holse, shouting and screaming, affixe and anti-social behaviour of lighting, bringting, drinking keeps us in fear and this is not a way to live, I believe under the human rights act we have a right to live peacefully and safe in our humas. Due to noise we can not even open our windows at night.

	opinion, it is very much an orchestrated campaign by one resident only, namely

- 6. Rather than concentrating on the application for a new premises licence, that petition dwells on existing licenced premises known as Arabian Nites.
- 7. I have no personal or business connections with Arabian Nites.
- 8. I heard of complaints from a local resident, and made it my business to go down to Arabian Nites and take a look for myself to see whether or not these concerns were genuine.
- 9. I visited Arabian Nites and its locality on 11 occasions with the purpose of seeing for myself whether there are issues surrounding the operation of licenced premises. From those visits, the only issues I have found are ones involving vehicles, and drivers making a noise with their large exhausts and music coming from the cars. There has been no nulsance directly associated with or coming from the Arabian Nites premises.
- 10. I have also been a customer of Arabian Nites, and I am aware that it has a policy that customers will be searched and have to produce identification. Those that are not permitted entry may congregate on the opposite corner of the road opposite Arabian Nights. I have seen for myself this happening, and I have also witnessed security personnel from Arabian Nites go over and move those individuals away.

- 11. In terms of the comments contained in the petition, I am aware that there is a letter that accompanies this marked "EH1". The following comments I make are in relation to that letter, which is attached to the petition.
- 12. I disagree that we have a large amount of anti-social behaviour from Arabian Nites.

 This has simply not been evidenced on any of my 11 visits.
- 13. As a local resident, we have always had problems of crime within the Highgate area. Highgate has big issues with drug taking and that is why we now meet as a forum to discuss these issues. Arabian Nites is not the cause of the drug issues, and it is wrong to say that residents live in fear of crime because of Arabian Nites. There is only one complainant regarding these premises, and that is
- 14. There is a suggestion in the petition that neighbours cars have been hit on many occasions. Car crime has always existed in Highgate. Arabian Nites has no responsibility for this, and neither has it added to par crime in the locality.
- 15. I have never witnessed residents being verbally abused by clientele of Arabian Nites. In fact, no local residents frequent Arabian Nites, and it is only it hat has been there and I aware that she has verbally abused staff and customers so much so that a report was made to West Midlands Police. On all of the occasions I have been to the premises or in the vicinity of the premises. I have never experienced verbal abuse.

16	. There is a suggestion that the premises is associated with drug taking and drinking
	of alcohol. These premises do not sell alcohol, and neither do they permit drug taking.
	However, drug taking and drinking of alcohol is all over Highgate, and it is not a
	problem that is either caused by or associated with licensed premises which in my
	opinion serves only to control the drinking of alcohol.

- 17. There is also a suggestion that there has been criminal damage to wheely bins. I am not aware of this.
- 18. I have not witnessed any aggressive confrontations from youths in their cars.
- 19. also alleges that there is drug taking in parked vehicles. I have not witnessed any of this. When I have been to the premises and in its vicinity, there is no one in any of the cars parked by the premises.
- 20. I disagree with the suggestion that any residents have been threatened as a consequence of Arabian Nites. I have never been threatened or felt threatened in any way in connection with licenced premises and in particular the Arabian Nites.
- 21. The letter suggests that couples are making out on the doorsteps of residents, and again, I have never seen anything like that.
- 22. Parking on grassland and pavements is a common problem within Highgate. This problem particularly exists on Fridays, when the mosque is particularly busy. As a resident of Highgate, we have simply become used to it.

- 24. Regarding the allegation of litter and fast food and bottles, this is not a fast food premises, and I am aware that Arabian Nites does not permit bottles to be taken out of their premises. The allegation is simply unfounded.
- 25. I have not experienced nor am I aware of a persistent problem of people urinating or fouling in or around residents' premises and cars.
- 26. The suggestion that litter and drug use items are left in the Grove because of licensed premises is again unfounded. Aluminium canisters can be found anywhere in Highgate, it is not a problem that has come here because of Arabian Nites, it has always existed in the community.
- 27. As to noise and shouting, car homs sounding at 4am, I have been present at Arabian Nites when it has been closing. I have witnessed people saying goodnight to one another and the occasional car hom but I disagree that this would cause a nulsance to residents.
- 28. There have been occasions of cars sounding and revving their engines, but I am aware that Arabian Nites proposes to operate a road closure on Fridays and Saturdays each week, and I am confident that this will resolve any concerns relating to noise from vehicles in the vicinity.
