1. Purpose of report:

To consider a relevant representation that has been made in respect of an application to vary the Premises Licence which seeks to extend the hours for the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption off the premises) to operate 24hours (Monday to Sunday).

The application also seeks to add the provision of Late Night Refreshment, to operate indoors only, from 11:00pm until 05:00am (Monday to Sunday).

Premises to be open to the public 24hours (Monday to Sunday).

The application also seeks to remove all embedded restrictions inherited from the Licensing Act 1964, which are currently in force.

2. Recommendation:

To consider the representation that has been made and to determine the application.

3. Brief Summary of Report:

Variation application received on 29th June 2017 in respect of Spar, 32 Watford Road, Cotteridge, Birmingham, B30 1JA.

A representation has been received from other persons.

4. Compliance Issues:

4.1 Consistency with relevant Council Policies, Plans or Strategies:

The report complies with the City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Council's Corporate Plan to improve the standard of all licensed persons, premises and vehicles in the City.

5. Relevant background/chronology of key events:

A F Blakemore & Son Ltd T/A Blakemore Retail applied on 29th June 2017 to vary the Premises Licence for Spar, 32 Watford Road, Cotteridge, Birmingham, B30 1JA.

A representation has been received from other persons, see Appendix 1.

The application is attached at Appendix 2.

Conditions have been agreed with West Midlands Police and the applicant, which are attached at Appendix 3.

The current Premises Licence is attached at Appendix 4.

Site Location Plans at Appendix 5.

Dear Sir/Madame,

In accordance with the Licensing Act 2003, I am objecting to the application by the Spar to extend the hours they can sell alcohol to 24 hours a day.

I have had to deal with several problems over the last few years, one of which is definitely linked to the sale of alcohol from the Spar during their current trading hours.

In terms of problems that are a direct result of alcohol being sold at the Spar. This issue breaches all 4 licensing objectives:

The illegal disposal of 375 and 200ml Glen spirit bottles in the driveway to the rear of 23 Watford Road

Residents and visitors have accidentally driven over these bottles with several punctures caused over the last 6 months in particular. I have removed 4 builders sacks of these bottles since January this year - a much higher number than last year. On researching the brand, I found out that it was a Spar brand. On discussing this with a member of staff at the Spar they said that they couldn't control what a customer did with the bottle after they'd left the store. A fair point but no reassurance to myself and many others inconvenienced by this anti-social and illegal behaviour. I have included Google Drive links to photographs I took back in March clearly illustrating the danger to vehicles and tenants with the Glen Brand clearly visible on one of the bottles:

A young toddler lives in one of the residential flats above the retail units at Watford Road and I am also concerned that they may be seriously injured by the broken glass.

The behaviour of the drinkers (possibly Spar customers) is also an issue. I and several residents/business tenants regularly challenge men urinating in the driveway and many have become verbally and physically threatening. Although the driveway is gated, this gate is left open during the day and intermittently until 2pm as a takeaway (Chicken.com) in unit 3, 23 Watford Road operates until these hours. I have witnessed a drunken men urinating at 1pm in the afternoon in plain sight of people waiting at a nearby bus stop - it is simply disgusting and threatening to passing people when a man has his member out of his trousers in public.

In terms of wider problems, I have had the following reported to me over the last six months:

1

Female resident and her daughter followed into the premises by men (on two separate occasions).

Male resident followed by a man last week at 2am in the morning (the resident is a doctor working night shifts).

Staff at Chicken.com abused and assaulted by drunken men on at least 2 occasions over the last 12 months.

Spar customers blocking the driveway on numerous occasions and threatening tenants/residents when asked to move. This is despite the road being clearly marked with double yellow lines.

Street fights outside 23 Watford Road that are alcohol-fueled (there are two bus stops where people congregate). These have caused residents problems sleeping as bedrooms are located at the front of the building. With a 24 hour alcohol outlet across the road, this problem could be exacerbated.


I appreciate that I can't directly link the wider problems to the sale of alcohol from the Spar but the picture isn't good. What we don't want are more problem drinkers coming to Cotteridge to buy alcohol between the hours of 11pm to 5am - we have enough undesirables as it is. There is only one other 24 hour off licence within a 1.5 mile radius of the Spar store so the potential catchment area is substantial. The situation was historically bad beforehand with the need to introduce an Alcohol Exclusion Zone in 2005 across a large swathe of Cotteridge.


I am also concerned that the Spar won't be able to implement an effective Challenge 25 policy. After 11pm, they (in my experience) serve goods through a hatch near the till and I see this as an issue. Underage drinking is a major problem in Cotteridge, I understand that West Midlands Police police have done a deal behind closed doors with the applicant to make CCTV available and to only allow customers into the store when a security guard is present. This security of the store to the door and no further is of no reassurance to the wider community of Cotteridge and indeed is an admission of failure if this mitigation is seen as required. There is an anticipation by West Midlands Police of law breaking caused by this licence extension. I am tired of everyone, including the police, having to pick up the pieces - quite literally glass pieces in my case.

To conclude, there is currently a significant minority of problem drinkers that purchase alcohol at the Spar store in Cotteridge. A member of staff has already said that there is nothing they can do to stop the anti-social behaviour caused by this group. Consequently, I have every reason to believe that an extension to the Spar licence will degrade the local area further with consequences for the police and health services and most importantly from my perspective, it will cause further damage to the environment at 23 Watford Road, with increased danger to residents and businesses at 23 Watford Road. I'd actually recommend that the licensing sub-committee go further than just looking at this application for an extension and insist that Spar arrange for the bottles illegally disposed of by their customers to be removed from the land at 23 Watford Road on a regular basis. If they can't control their customer's behaviour then they should clean up the mess caused by their current trading activities.

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Annex 1 – Mandatory Conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either— (a) a holographic mark, or (b) an ultraviolet feature.

(1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. (2) In this condition:- (a) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula $P = D + (D \times V)$, where-(i) P is the permitted price, (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; (b) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979; (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence— (i) the holder of the premises licence, (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence; (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994. (3) Where the permitted price would not be a whole number of pennies, the permitted price shall be taken to be the price rounded up to the nearest penny. (4) Where the permitted price on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax, the permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Embedded Restrictions

Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours. In this condition, permitted hours means: a. On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, 8 am. to 11 pm. b. On Sundays, other than Christmas Day, 10 am. to 10.30 pm. c. On Christmas Day, 12 noon to 3 pm. and 7 pm. to 10.30 pm. d. On Good Friday, 8 am. to 10.30 p.m. The above restrictions do not prohibit: (a) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises, unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel; (b) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered; (c) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club; (d) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces.

Alcohol shall not be sold in an open container or be consumed in the licensed premises.
