## MATTERS DISCUSSED AT THE MEETING INCLUDING LOCAL CONCERNS:

**Update read out by Councillor Hussain** "I visited the site on Monday, after being away for two weeks, to ascertain what the issues were and it was clear from the outset that the contractor had not taken into consideration the safety of pedestrians that needed to use the zebra crossing on Wellington Road.

The following morning I telephoned John Hallahan of RW Services and explained my concerns and instructed him that as a matter of urgency, a temporary footway was required from Westminster Road to the zebra crossing and he advised me that this would take place.

A site meeting has been held this morning Between Amey and John Hallahan and the contractor has been formerly instructed to stop works on site until there is a safe pedestrian walkway around their site.

At present staff on site are currently reinstating a walkway on Wellington Road between the new pedestrian route at the junction with Westminster Road to the zebra crossing outside the Calthorpe Arms. This will need to be protected with barriers on both sides as it passes the building site to ensure pedestrian safety until they reach the existing footway.

They will be meeting again on site at 15:00 to ensure these measures provide a safe route for pedestrians.

Amey - Keith Smith explained that the scheme in West Minister Road /Wellington road wasn't an Amey scheme and his involevement / ameys was to address the safety concerns. He said that work was currently halted at the site whilst the contact made the footway safe for the public to use and to cross
