1. Purpose of report:

To consider representations that have been made in respect of an application for a Premises Licence which seeks to permit the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption off the premises) to operate from 06:00am until 00:00midnight (Monday to Sunday).

2. Recommendation:

3. Brief Summary of Report:

An application for a Premises Licence was received on 6th November 2018, in respect of Tesco Stores Limited, Linden Road, Birmingham, B30 1PA.

Representations have been received from other persons.

5. Relevant background/chronology of key events:

Tesco Stores Limited applied on 6th November 2018 for the grant of a Premises Licence for Tesco Stores Limited, Linden Road, Birmingham, B30 1PA.

Representations have been received from other persons, including local Ward Councillors, see Appendices 1 - 10.

The application is attached at Appendix 11.

Site Location Plans at Appendix 12.

Re Tesco Stores Linden Rd B30 1PA Alcohol License Application

We wish to object in the strongest possible terms to the granting of this license for the following reasons.

- We live opposite this establishment and are subject to the noise and disturbance already caused by early and late activity on this site and extending opening hours to 0600 – 2400 would make our lives intolerable.
- 2. This shop is already a magnet for crime with not only repeated drive offs but extensive shop lifting resulting in coffee and tuna having to be sold in security boxes and from behind the counter.
- Regular attempts to break in overnight have been reported and both of the above problems are likely to exacerbated by the presence of alcohol on the premises. The last attempt at forced entry was only last week.
- 4. The premises are within the Bournville parish boundary and as such local traditions around the sale of alcohol ought to be protected.
- 5. The area is already well provided with alcohol off- sales with several establishments within a 10 minute walk or 2 minute drive of this location.
- 6. Tesco have made no effort to communicate with its neighbours about this application with many neighbours only realising in the last few days as the notices have been posted in places that are difficult to see, round the side in a poorly lit area and on the sliding front which opens if you stand in front of it to try to read the notice.
- 7. Poor forecourt management means that queues for petrol or access to the shop regularly generate congestion on the road with numerous near misses and difficulty for local residents in getting on and off their drives.

In my view Tesco have proceeded in a manner which is both un-neighbourly and indifferent to their impact on the local community and as such should be rejected in terms of the extended hours and the sale of alcohol.

I strongly object to the current application for a license to sell alcohol by BournvilleTesco Express on the Linden Road, Bournville. Tesco have been very sneaky and posted the notice at the far side of the building, where most people will never see it. Isn't it supposed to be openly displayed?

When this happened before, 11 years ago, many local residents protested, knowing that this would result in more social problems in the area. Do they think those people have moved away or passed on? No, the majority of people in this nearby area are against the granting of a license, as they were before.

Last time, there was a big meeting in the Council House with all of Tesco's legal staff; many local residents were there and we beat them, with the local councillors taking the side of the people. Now Tesco are sneakily trying again, and if no one stands up to them, they may get away with it.

It is those of us living near the garage are the ones who will bear the brunt of the flow of alcohol to local young people. Already we have the litter strewn down our roads and in our gardens from people who bought something at Tesco Express. If an alcohol license is granted, there will a flow of young people coming down our streets drinking alcohol. The steps of the church in our street is a favourite place for young rowdies to gather in the evenings, and now they will gather there again to drink their alcoholic beverages. The residents living next to the church already found it difficult to sell their house in the past because of this problem. With alcohol flowing, the problem will certainly get worse.

Of course, those who buy alcohol to take home do not cause a local disturbance, but I believe there will be price to pay on the local level if a license is granted. People like to live in Bournville because it is a peaceful area, which still retains a gentle spirit and some of the character of the ideals that it was built upon. That doesn't mean that everyone should be a Quaker or teetotal, but I personally believe that allowing the sale of alcohol here will lower the tone of the area, which is famous throughout the country, until it becomes just another housing estate, like any other. It will be sad if Bournville loses its original character, and, from a materialistic viewpoint, it could even affect the price of local houses.

Some have said that the garage is not in Bournville, but check out the garage website. It's 'Birmingham Bournville Tesco Express'. Some might say 'It's not on Bournville Trust land', but it is part of Bournville, just as Beaumont Road is where I live, though our road is not part of the trust.

Recently there has been a sharp upturn in crime and drugs in this area, young people go up and down our roads trying car doors and stealing whatever they can. Bournville Tesco Express is already a place that they head for – so with alcohol on offer, the local problems will be multiplied. Older young people buy alcohol and pass it on to those underage. The effect will surely influence the relatively well behaved young people in the area.

Of course, an alcohol license was granted a few years ago to the newsagents shop on the Maryvale Road, once again, completed against the wishes of many local people. We realise it is unlikely for that license to be revoked, but surely those who need alcohol locally can go there if they want, another alcohol vendor is unnecessary in this area, particularly when you take into account the temperate tradition of the area and the consensus in the area against the selling of alcohol there. There are also ample opportunities for people to buy alcohol from the nearby shops in Cotteridge.

1) The prevention of crime and disorder

- 2) Public Safety
- 3) The prevention of public nuisance
- 4) The protection of children from harm

Further there are plenty of places locally where alcohol is easily available. Most of them are within walking distance or a short drive. I understand some residents would love to have alcohol available almost next door but surely this cannot be done at the expense of what we stand to lose.

We have enjoyed a neighbourhood without any alcohol fueled trouble since this shop opened in 2006. When the store opened, an application to sell alcohol was refused for good reason, and all of the objections raised at that point still stand valid. Nothing has changed to support the granting of this application. In addition, there are 18 other licensed premises for the sale of alcohol off-site within half a mile of this site which shows there is no need for another licensed premises.

In addition, I am concerned about the protection of children from harm through early exposure to alcohol drinking as this shop is used by a large amount of young children and teenagers who live locally. It is my concern that the presence of alcohol in easy access inside a busy local store where staff may struggle to uphold the law on legal age for sale of alcohol is likely to put children at risk of harm. We have already seen the impact of another nearby premises which was granted a license to sell alcohol where cans and bottles (often broken) are frequently disguarded in gardens and on the footpaths in the immediate vacinity to the shop. We have also seen groups of young people drinking alcohol purchased from that shop in the nearby park casuing a nuisance to other park users.

The store already suffers frequent atemps at theft from the store whilst closed which not only causes disturbances but also causes residents to be affraid for their safety. Since it opended, the store has suffered a number of breakins and thefts, including the theft of tobacco where theives gained access to the store by use of an angle grinder to cut a section of the outer wall of the store away - not once, but twice. There have also been many thefts from the store whilst it's open including fuel drive-offs and theft of merchandise from the store, both of which put at risk the public safety of other customers and staff. I have serious concerns that the sale of alcohol from this shop would exacerbate the situation.

It also appears that the shop is looking to increase its opening hours from.6am until midnight by means of this application. This is totaly unacceptable as the store is situated on a residential road and bordered on 3 sides by residential properties. The hours of opening were a condition of the planning application when the store first opened, and a subsequent application to extend those opening hours was refused by planning with good reason. Nothing has changed to support the granting of a change to the agreed opening hours.

The store has also failed to comply with a number of other planning conditions, including the prevention of access to the site when the store is closed to prevent crime and disorder - No measures have ever been implemented which means we constantly have vehicles driving onto the forecourt late at inght and in the early hours of the morning and using the parking area and forecourt for various activities including conducting drug sales. The store also recently suffered another attempted theft overnight where a vehicle was driven up to the front doors of the store and an attempt was made to access the store by smashing the doors with sledgehammers or steel bars. There has also been an attempted theft of the externally sited cashpoint machine on a separate occasion. The shop frequently fails to close the cashpoint shutter when the store is closed - which is also another condition attached to the store. There is also a planning condition applied to the store to restrict the delivery times for vehicles delivering to the store - this condition is also frequently ignored and neighbours are often disturbed by lorries parked up with engines and refrigeration compressors running from 6am and earlier whilst waiting for the store to open at 7:30am. The store is also supposed to ensure that the forecourt lights (including totum sign) are turned off when the store is closed to prevent light pollution to nearby houses - The forecourt gantry lights and totum are never turned off and the forecourt light very rarely ever get turned off. When we complain, the response from the store is, "sorry, we don't know how to turn them off" or "sorry the timer is broken" or "we'll report it to the manager but he won't be in for a couple of weeks" - but nothing ever gets actioned.

All of these points above prove that the store is not fit to be granted a license to sell alcohol as there is no evidence that they would act responsibly in doing so.

Granting a license to this store would go against all four of the licensing objectives and I ask that the licensing committee refuse this application.. Kind regards

Tesco Stores Ltd, Linden Road, B30 1PA, premises application number 108703: objection

I have been contacted by a number of local residents in Bournville who oppose the above application, and I am objecting on their behalf as councillor for Bournville and Cotteridge ward. Tesco's previous application in 2007 for a licence at the Express store on Linden Road was strongly opposed by local residents, many of whom objected to the sale of alcohol so close to the borders of the Bournville Village Estate with its Quaker heritage.

The Tesco express on Linden Road is open every day continuously from 7.30 am to 10.30 pm. As a regular customer, I am aware that is an extremely busy store and that it has a serious problem with shop-lifting and with the theft of petrol by drivers who drive off without paying for their fuel. In the past, Tesco has employed a security guard in the store as a deterrent. However, based on my observations, this arrangement has now ceased and there are no security personnel in the store. This means the staff are often dealing with criminal behaviour unassisted. I have witnessed cashiers dashing out to take down the number plates of cars speeding away from the garage forecourt without paying.

Hence in relation to the **prevention of crime and disorder**, my concern is that the introduction of alcohol into the Tesco Express will be a magnet for shop-lifters and will place staff in a vulnerable situation. Only one Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) is listed on the application, yet the store is already open from 7.30 am – 10.30 pm. The hours sought in the application are 6am to midnight. How will Tesco ensure that there is continuous DPS cover during opening hours? Why do the opening hours in the application exceed the current opening hours of the store?

The Tesco express store on Linden Road is in the middle of a residential area. As the grant of an alcohol licence from 6am to midnight could attract more custom to the store in the early morning and late in the evening, I am also objecting to the licence application in relation to the **prevention of public nuisance**. Residents are concerned about the potential increase in traffic on Linden Road and the surrounding roads such as Beaumont Road at unsocial hours, and about the likelihood of customers who have purchased alcohol lingering in the neighbourhood to drink their purchases, causing a disturbance to residents.

I write to express my concern and therefore my objection on behalf of residents in my ward to the above application.

My objections are as follows:

1. With regard to the prevention of crime and disorder

I am aware that the premises has a serious problem with shop-lifting and petrol theft. I have been informed that the previous arrangement of an on-site security guard no longer continues, putting the burden on staff to deal with criminal behaviour. I believe that the granting of an alcohol licence and potential extension of opening hours to the proposed 6am to midnight, will exacerbate this situation and I do not see anything in the application which will tackle this problem

2. Prevention of public disorder

The premises is in a residential area. Residents have expressed their concern to me about the potential increase in traffic on Linden Road and the surrounding roads at unsocial hours. They are also concerned that customers who have purchased alcohol will linger in the neighbourhood to drink their purchases, which will cause significant negative impact on local residents.

3. Other Considerations

Finally, the premises is only a street away from the historic Bournville Village Estate which is a historic noalcohol area – I am concerned that granting this licence would be an attempt to undermine this history and be directly against residents wishes.
