I wish to join the West Midlands police licence review for The Gunmakers Arms, 92-93 Bath Street, Birmingham B4 6HG on the grounds of;

- 1. The prevention of crime and disorder
- 2. Public safety.

Trading Standards involvement in this public house;

On 20th February 2015 I, Trading Standards Officer Martin Williams visited the Gunmakers Arms with officers from West Midlands Police. I inspected the bar and found a number of non-duty paid bottles of spirits on display and evidence that spirits had been decanted from some bottles to others on display on the optics. This is not allowed under the General Food Regulations 2004. I issued a traders notice to Mr Radoslav Halabrin who said he was in charge at the time to advise him to stop this practice.

Downstairs in the cellar amongst other stored bottles there were a small number of plain bottles containing spirits that Mr Halabrin said were left over from a private party. I advised him that he should dispose of them as they could end up being supplied in the bar but with no labelling it was impossible to know what was in them.

On 1st April 2015 we revisited the shop to check if my instructions had been complied with. I found a new unopened 1 Litre bottle of Jack Daniels whisky in the bar with no UK duty stamp and a 1 Litre bottle of Jägermeister without a duty stamp on the optic bank as well as an opened 1 litre bottle of Martel Brandy with no UK duty stamp on the counter. It looked as these latter two bottles had had spirits decanted into from other sources. I seized these three bottles and issued a traders notice to this effect as they were not legal for sale or supply in the UK. I left another traders notice to confirm this as well as the fact that it looked as though decanting was still happening. All the bottles of spirits down in the cellar had been disposed of on this occasion.

I am the DPS of the above public house and write to you to make representations as to why the premises license at the pub should not be revoked.

Firstly I wish to express my condolences regarding Mr P's death as I considered him as a friend aswell as a customer.

On the night in question it is true that Mr P had had too much to drink (he helped himself to a bottle of spirits from behind the bar) but I had no reason to believe his life was in danger. Had I thought this for a second I would have called an ambulance.

I thought the best thing to do was let him "sleep it off" and that when he woke up I would put him in a taxi home.

I have read the police grounds asking for review and consider their report misleading for the following reasons

- 1. On returning to the Pub I did not know Mr P was dead. I together with a fellow customer who had come back to the pub with me tried to wake him up. The ambulance men who arrived in response to my emergency call informed me Mr P had died.
- It is incorrect to state I never made the CCTV available to the Police. Whilst it is true I did
 not know how to rewind it when they asked me to they did not know how to do it either and
 said they would send someone down to look at it but never did
- 3. I attended the inquest into Mr P's death when it became clear that he had a heart defect and I was not criticized by the coroner for my conduct on the night in question. Mr P's family were unaware of his heart condition and I believe he could have died at anytime.

- 4. Whilst I accept Mr P's family were very upset at his death I believe that unfortunately they wanted to blame somebody for it as a result of which they made accusations to the police against me selling illegal spirits. It is correct that when the licensing officers attended the pub on the 13/02/2015 they found bottles of unlabelled spirits. These were bottles of homemade spirits from my home country of Slovakia. I did not sell these sprits but offered them free of charge to my customers to celebrate birthdays and such like.
 - 5. Further it is correct that there were further visits to my premises when bottles were seized and when I pointed out that had I anything to hide I would have removed them. I note the police have not provided any report suggesting the seized bottles contained any illegal substance.
 - 6. The suggestion that I was trying to conceal photos and video evidence from the coroners court is totally misleading. I volunteered this information and provided it to the court.
 - 7. I strongly object to the suggestions that I am hiding issues from the premises license holder and am more concerned with the sale of alcohol. I am more than happy to commence regularly meetings with the landlord if this is considered necessary

I took over the pub approximately 4 years ago and have spent thousands of pounds improving it and it is fair to say I am proud of my achievements.

I believe I run a good pub and that I do indeed promote the licensing objectives.

Both and I work as electricians so we used to have plenty of conversations relating to work etc over the years and finding out about the very tragic death of was indeed a very sad time for me.

As you will obviously be aware the landlord of the gunmakers is now having a license review following the tragic circumstances on that night.

It is for this reason I am writing to you to give a personal reference for Raddi.

Since taking over the pub from it being closed for 2 years Raddi has worked tirelessly to keep the pub going and make improvements while obviously running on a tight budget.

He has made efforts to know people and from my experience he has been a very kind very caring and a very generous man.

Having witnessed numerous gestures of kindness to other elderly customers to the extent of making extra soup on cold days and taking the soup by hand to make sure they were ok after not apearing in the pub for an evening or two..

Even last year on my 50th birthday he turned up at my suprise party making sure he hadn't missed saying hi, even though he had been on a motorcycle event some considerable miles away. He made the effort to come!

The pub itself, he keeps very clean and while it's certainly not everyone's cup of tea again he makes the effort to make everyone welcome.

Due to the location of the guns there are a lot of undesirable people frequently around the area. This makes his work there even more difficult having to keep a close watch on who walks through the door. This being the case he keeps a very nice pub and certainly does not stand for any bad behavior. On the whole I believe that Raddi deserves to keep his licence and continue to run the premises. He is a very genuine very hard working landlord who would be very sadly missed should his licence be removed.

At present I am on holiday in Florida and only just found out about his pending licence review from a message from a work colleague.

I felt the need to put forward a reference for a very genuine landlord.

Myself not being familiar with these proceedings, should a character reference be needed in court, would be more then happy to appear before the court to offer my character reference in person. I will be back in the UK on the 23rd of May.

The Licensee does not tolerate drunken or loutish behaviour and is quick to put an early stop to it in his charming polite manor he refuses to serve anyone he thinks has had too much to drink.

If any customers appear to be fooling around he asks them to stop before someone gets hurt stating the obvious health & safety as it is his livelihood at stake.

Radi is one of the most hard working men I have ever come across he never stops cleaning, the whole pub always has a fresh smell to it including the toilets something one doesn't really find in a Public house these days.

Radi came to the UK about 7 years ago and has never claimed any benefits and only ever wanted to work hard which I hope you would agree is a rare thing these days, he is a very proud man who is humbled by the support he is getting from us regulars and sometimes very tearful, this man is a very caring person who goes to long lengths to ensure his customers are well and cared for.

I myself had not been in to the Gunmakers for over a week due to illness and Radi asked one of my friends to call me to see if I were ok, something which had not entered my own friends mind.

We are all guilty of this sort of thing we take friends for granted and never give it a thought that one may be ill, not Radi he's always thinking where's so and so are they ok why haven't they been in? A typical concerned reaction from this kind man.

Another customer who left his spare key with Radi didn't turn in for a few days, Radi asked a friend of mine another regular to go round to flat with him only to find on the floor they

wanted to call an ambulance but begged them not to and said he would be in the pub later, when didn't turn in Radi and my friend went back to the flat to find that he had moved from the floor, but felt an ambulance should be called as never missed a Friday night out he was obviously ill, this could have been a man left in his flat unattended for months had it not been for Radi insisting they should visit unfortunately passed away a few weeks later in Hospital.

To end my appeal on Radis behalf, by revoking his licence would be putting this kind hard working man out of work and possibly on the dole something which none of us want especially Radi, also we would be losing a great friend and publican, who knows where he could end up?

This is our local a great little cosy place back in time which are fast becoming rare, please give this man the chance he deserves let him retain his licence and job, and let us keep our lovely meeting place.

This premises is a public house located on Bath Street, just outside of Birmingham City Centre's inner ring road. The designated premises supervisor is Mr Radoslav HALABRIN. The DPS has leased the premises from the Premise Licence Holder, a Mr Thomas O'Brien, although Mr O'Brien remains the premise licence holder.

On 10th December 2014, West Midlands Police received a call from the ambulance service at 01:53 hours stating there was a male in cardiac arrest at the premises. Initial reports at the scene stated this was not suspicious. However, as the full investigation proceeded, there were some concerns raised in relation to public safety and the actions of the DPS, Mr Radoslav HALABRIN.

Mr HALABRIN stated that the deceased male (who will be referred to as Mr P) was a regular customer at the premises. On 9th December, Mr P had been drinking Cider and shots throughout the evening at the premises, he reached across the bar taking hold of a bottle of Jack Daniels and began downing the spirit straight from the bottle. Mr P then became very intoxicated and verbal, banging his fists on the bar. At approximately 23:30 hours, Mr HALABRIN sat Mr P in a chair where he vomited and urinated. He then went to sleep. When all the customers left and the pub closed, Mr P was still unconscious, in the premises. Mr HALABRIN placed Mr P in the recovery position and left the premises to get himself some food. Mr P was left unattended at this point, and although he was put in the recovery position, there was no call to the police or the ambulance service regarding concern for Mr P's health. On returning from having a meal inside a take away, Mr HALABRIN found Mr P had died. It was at 01:48 hours that an ambulance was finally called.

Police Officers who attended requested to see the CCTV in the premises, to establish events surrounded Mr P's death. Mr HALABRIN could not operate the system and this CCTV was never made available.

Mr P was subsequently found to have a high concentration of alcohol in his blood. Underlying health issues (hardening arteries and valvular heart disease) together with the high level alcohol appear to have led to the death. The Histopathologist has proffered 'Acute ethanolic intoxication' as a contributing factor to the cause of death.

As the investigations into Mr P's death continued, on 13th February 2015, licensing officers from Birmingham Central Police Station visited the Gunmakers Arms. Officers found a number of unlabelled Jack Daniels bottles that contained a clear, strong smelling liquid behind the bar. Mr HALABRIN was advised regarding safety concerns of serving unidentifiable alcohol and issued a Traders Notice.

On 20th February 2015 officers conducted a follow up visit in the company of a Trading Standards officer. Bottles similar to those found on the previous visit were this time found in the back of the cellar. There were no labels, and they contained a clear liquid.

On 1st April, police officers and trading standards re-visited the premises. Trading standards had cause to seize bottles of alcohol that did not comply with legislation.

A Coroners inquest has started for this incident and through this it was discovered that the DPS had taken photos of what had happened, these have eventually been handed to the Police which corroborate the facts as above.

The concerns that have been identified by West Midlands Police are that the DPS had not called for an ambulance when Mr P initially consumed a large amount of alcohol and then went unconscious. This prompt action of responsibility could have prevented Mr P's death. The DPS left Mr P alone and unconscious in the premises, albeit he placed him in the recovery position. If he had such concerns for Mr P by placing him in the recovery position he should have not left him alone, and should have called for medical assistance.

In addition, CCTV was not accessible on the evening or during the initial investigation for officers. This would have provided valuable evidence in the moments leading up to the death of Mr P.

The premises licence holder was completely unaware of the death in his premises until 3 months

afterwards. The lack of communication between the licence holder and DPS causes police deep concerns that the premises is not promoting the licensing objectives effectively, especially in regard to public safety.

Both the Premise Licence Holder and the DPS have clearly shown disregard for the licensing objectives, especially Public Safety and Prevention of Crime and Disorder. The Premise Licence Holder is clearly unaware of what is happening in his premises and the DPS is clearly hiding issues that are happening and more concerned with the sale of alcohol.

West Midlands Police do not believe that to just change the DPS or impose conditions would resolve the issues here, which ultimately led to the death of a male. To change the DPS would only mean that the current DPS would still keep the lease and have control of the premise and then apply for another DPS to run the premises.

As such West Midlands Police are seeking the revocation of this licence, had it not been the delay in getting information West Midlands Police would have sought an application under Sec 53.

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every retail sale or supply of alcohol made under this licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Each individual assigned to carrying out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Agency.

The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol:-

The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

Where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for sale or consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) the responsible person shall ensure that it is available to customers in the following measures:-

- 1. Beer or cider 1/2 pint;
- 2. Gin, rum, vodka or whisky 25ml or 35ml; and
- 3. Still wine in a glass 125ml; and

The responsible person must also ensure that customers are made aware of the availability of the aforementioned measures.

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Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with operating schedule

2a) General conditions consistent with the operating schedule

The provision of regulated entertainment shall take place indoors only.

No adult entertainment permitted at the Premises.

The licence holder shall ensure they are a member of the Local Pub watch Scheme

The licence holder shall ensure the staff are trained on Licensing Act 2003 when they are recruited and given training in "Drug Awareness".

2b) Conditions consistent with, and to promote the prevention of crime and disorder

No enforceable conditions identified from the operating schedule.

2c) Conditions consistent with, and to promote, public safety

A maximum occupancy of 200 people will be set.

Children under the age of 16 must be accompanied by an adult at all times.



CONCLUSIONS

Alternatively death may occur at lower blood concentrations as a result of inhalation of vomit during unconsciousness.

Thank you for furnishing me with a copy of the Birmingham City Laboratories' toxicological analysis report on this case.

You will read that this confirms my gross autopsy impression of a very substantial quantity of ethyl alcohol in the body of the decedent around the time of death, significantly above the threshold typically associated with fatalities.

I, therefore, now proffer the following medical cause of death:

- Īπ Acute ethanolic intoxication
- П Coronary artery atheroma. Chronic degenerative mitral valvar disease.

The mode of dying is likely profound cardio-respiratory/central nervous system depression consequent upon the direct toxic effects of imbibed alcohol, contributed to by pre-existing natural physical disease, to wit coronary artery atheroma and chronic degenerative mitral valvar disease. The annual incidence of sudden death in individuals suffering severe single vessel left anterior descending coronary artery stenosis is approximately 11%, attributed to spontaneous ventricular arrhythmias. Alcohol destabilises cardiac myocytes, thereby heightening any predisposition to cardiac dysrhythmia, potentiating this risk.

She informed officers that she had recordings of the deceased's friends telling her that the landlord gives away illegal home made alcohol from behind the bar. She believes that this would account for the large level of 'ethanol' in her brothers blood.

She also believes the landlord has recorded over the CCTV and not kept it as he should. She also states that the landlord left him in the pub unconcious whilst he went out for food. The log also details the sisters belief that her brother wouldn'y have been able to jump over the counter (he had a bad knee) and that Jack Daniels (which the bar manager has stated that the deceased consumed a lot of very quickly) contains no ethanol.

Having obtained the relevant documents from the Coroners officer. I have been able to explain to Miss that the ethanol recorded in the toxicology finding relates to 'alcohol', that the reading was over 400mg (per 100ml of blood) and that the statement describes her brother reaching over the bar and not jumping.

I have accessed the Innkeeper site on the intranet and can find no condition of the licence which suggests anyone is obliged to retain any CCTV from the premises for a specified time. I have informed Miss of this.

The statement from the landlord does describe leaving the deceased on the floor of the pub but it also details the fact that he was still breathing at that point and that the deceased was then placed in the recovery position to avoid complications if he was sick.

I have researched closed logs and reported crimes for the pub over the last twelve months and there is nothing that obviously suggests that anyone else has come to harm by potentially drinking a home brewed product supplied at the pub. Log 2029 10/7/14 relates to a haemophiliac vomiting blood at the premises but there is nothing contained on the log which shows any direct connection.

Given all the circumstances there is no indication that further police investigation into the circumstances of the death is necessary.

However, the information regarding the alleged supply of a home brewed product may be something you wish to pursue.

I have attached documentation regarding the death. The home brew is only mentioned on the e-mails between and PC 7686 HUGHES who was given corroboration of the information supplied by the deceased's sister by a male named





I am PC 0027 Vicki DEMUTH, and am currently stationed at Birmingham Central Police Station as a Licensing Officer.

This statement is in relation to my contact with the Gunmakers Arms PH, 92 Bath Street, Birmingham following the report of a deceased male at the premises on 10th December 2014.

On 5th February 2015 I received an email from Sgt John GARBETT who is based on the Force Homicide team. He had been conducting enquiries into the death of a male on 10/12/14 at the Gunmakers Arms PH. As the death had occurred in a licensed premises, he made the licensing department aware to follow up any possible licensing concerns or breaches..

The email I had received gave mention to 'illegal home made' alcohol that was kept behind the bar and served to customers.

On 13th February 2015, I visited the Gunmakers Arms with PC 20325 GREENFIELD. On arrival I spoke to a female who stated the DPS, Radoslav HALABRIN was currently out, but would be back shortly. Whilst waiting for his arrival, I noticed there were approximately 5 clear bottles under the bar counter. They were old Jack Daniels bottles, recognisable by the distinctive square shape. Each bottle was full of a clear liquid, and the outside of the bottle had blue writing scribbled onto it, with various words, including 'MALINA' and 'SLIVKA'. Shortly after this, Mr HALABRIN arrived at the premises. He was very defensive and immediately contacted a solictior on the phone requesting that PC GREENFIELD speak with the solicitor. I explained that I was conducting a visit to follow up reports of 'home brew' alcohol being sold on the premises. I pointed at the bottles under the bar and asked what they were. Mr HALABRIN stated they were slovakian spirits left over from a party. He quickly added that he did not sell the alcohol, but party goers would have a glass of it when leaving as this was a slovakian tradition. I advised Mr HALABRIN that the sale of such alcohol would be against the law, and there would be significant health and safety implications. On this occasion I issued Mr HALABRIN a traders notice with this advice, and was assured by Mr HALABRIN that he would dispose of the alcohol. I also noticed at this point there was a price list on the wall for various

items, which I photographed. I later found by internet research that the items on the list referred to various flavoured spirits. Slivka being a clear coloured plum spirit.

On 20th February I re-visited the Gunmakers Arms in company of Trading Standards Officer Martin Williams. There were no unlabelled bottles in the main bar area. However, on entering the cellar, it was apparent that bottles similar to those found on my previous visit were located at the rear of the cellar. Again there were no labels and they were full of a clear liquid. Martin WILLIAMS conducted tests on the liquid to assess the alcohol by volume level, and found it was 50% abv. Trading Standards issued a further traders notice in relation to decanting alcohol, to which Mr HALABRIN stated he was unaware of this legislation.

On 27th March 2015 I attended the inquest at Coroners Court into the death of the male found at the Gunmakers Arms on 10th December 2014. During this, I was made aware of photographs that had been taken by Mr HALABRIN on the night of the death. The photographs showed the male lookind highly intoxicated. Images also showed shots of alcohol across the bar and a bottle of Jack Daniels Honey sat also on the bar top. Further images show the male unconscious in a chair inside the premises, then unconscious outside on the doorstep of the premises. The cause for concern being that the male was clearly highly intoxicated and unresponsive, but no medical assistance was called at this time. Further concern was highlighted when another image shows that Mr HALABRIN left the male unconscious and unresponsive in the pub, whilst locking the door and going for food, without seeking any form of medical assistance.

On 10th April 2015, I met with the Premises Licence Holder for the Gunmakers Arms, namely Mr Thomas O'BRIEN. I informed him of everything that had happened with regards to the death of the male in the premises and subsequent follow up visits. He stated that he had not been made aware of the death until a couple of months after the incident and that he was shocked that Mr HALABRIN hadn't told him of what had happened. He further added that he was unable to get into the premises as Mr HALABRIN had changed the locks.

From the above dealings I have had with the premises, the licence holder and the DPS, I feel that there is a significant lack of communication between all parties, and also a lack of responsibility for promoting public safety. This leads to serious concern for the management of such premises at this time, and significant changes need to be made in order to successfully promote the licensing objectives.

Gunmakers Arms, 92 -93 Bath Street, Birmingham B4 6HG

That, having reviewed the premises licence held under the Licensing Act 2003 by Mr Thomas Martin O'Brien, in respect of the Gunmakers Arms, 92 -93 Bath Street, Birmingham B4 6HG upon the application of West Midlands Police, this Sub-Committee hereby determines to **REVOKE the LICENCE**, in order to promote the prevention of crime and disorder and public safety objectives in the Act:

The Sub-Committee's reasons for revoking the licence are due to concerns by West Midlands Police as Applicant for the Review and Trading Standards, Birmingham City Council in relation to:-

- The circumstances giving rise to the death of a patron on the 10 December 2014;
 and;
- 2) A number of non-duty paid bottles of spirits on display and evidence that spirits had been decanted from some bottles to others on display on the optics, contrary to the General Food Regulations 2004 on the 20 February 2015 and again on the 1 April 2015, when three bottles of non-duty paid Jack Daniels, Jagermeister, and Martel Brandy were seized from the Premises.

The Sub-Committee gave consideration as to whether it could modify the conditions of the licence, remove the Designated Premises Supervisor or suspend the licence for a specified period of not more than 3 months, but was not satisfied given the evidence submitted, that the licensing objectives would be properly promoted following any such determination.

The Sub Committee were particularly concerned about the Safety of the Public, given the sad and unfortunate events which took place on the 10 December 2014. These culminated in the death of a patron from the following causes of death, 1) Acute ethanolic intoxication and 2) Coronary artery atheroma/Chronic degenerative mitral valvar disease. The Sub Committee had heard evidence that the patron had consumed an excessive amount of alcohol, directly from a bottle of Jack Daniels Whiskey in one go, in circumstances when there had been a clear management failing in prohibiting any such action from arising in the first place.

The actions of staff on duty on the night in question were then compounded, as a result of failing to ensure that the patron, (who had shortly afterwards become unconscious or fell asleep), had been provided with appropriate medical attention. Having viewed photographs of the events on the night in question, the Sub Committee were not convinced that the patron had been refused further alcohol after having consumed a significant amount of neat spirits. The actions of the DPS demonstrated accompleted ack of concern for his patron, as

well as breaching the Licensing Act 2003, and the Guidance issued by the Home Office under Section 182 of the Act.

According to West Midlands Police, and the DPS, after he had passed out, the patron was initially propped up at a table within the Premises, and left alone to sober up. Shortly afterwards, it was the submission of West Midlands Police that the patron had been sprayed with a great deal of water, in order to bring him about. When this failed, the patron was placed on the floor, and left alone within the premises unaccompanied and unconscious, whilst the DPS closed the premises and went to eat some food. On his return the DPS checked the patron, and discovered he was cold, so placed him by the radiator. As a result of his failing to come around, an ambulance was called and it later transpired that the patron had died from the causes of death referred to above.

In relation to the prevention of Crime and Disorder, the Sub Committee were of the view that there were no compelling reasons to deviate from paragraphs 11.28 and 11.29 of the Guidance issued under Section 182 of Licensing Act 2003. There is certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed premises which should be treated particularly seriously. These include the use of the licensed premises for the sale or storage of smuggled tobacco and alcohol as set out within the representation from Trading Standards. The Sub Committee determines that the crime prevention objective is being undermined, because having issued the DPS with a Seizure Notice on the 20th February 2015, a further seizure of non-duty paid alcohol took place on the 1st April 2015.

The Sub Committee had heard evidence from the Premises Licence Holder during the course of the hearing, and carefully considered the submissions made by both West Midlands Police and Trading Standards that they had sought nothing other than a Revocation of the Licence. Having heard all the submissions from all the representatives, it was clear that the Premises Licence Holder, had no understanding of how to properly promote the Licensing Objectives within the Act. There had been little or no communication between the DPS and the Licence Holder about how the premises were to be managed and run and the consequences to both as a result of breaching the Licensing Act 2003.

The Sub Committee also carefully noted the various representations made on behalf of the DPS, and how the actions of the DPS had restored the fortunes of the Premises in the 4 years he had been in charge, and the impact this had had on the local and wider communities. However, the circumstances giving rise to the Review were considered so significant that these vastly outweighed these representations.

In reaching this decision, the Sub-Committee has given due consideration to the City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, the Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 by the Secretary of State, the application for review, the written representations received and the submissions made at the hearing by the applicant / premises licence holder / and other persons.

All parties are reminded that under the provisions contained within Schedule 5 to the Licensing Act 2003, there is the right of appeal against the decision of the Licensing Authority to the Magistrates' Court, such an appeal to be made within twenty-one days of the date of notification of the decision. The determination of the Sub-Committee does not have effect until the end of the twenty-one day period for appealing against the decision or, if the decision is appealed against, until the appeal is disposed of.

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
