# 1. Purpose of report:

To consider representations that have been made in respect of an application for a Premises Licence which seeks to permit the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption on the premises) to operate from 09:00am until 11:00pm (Monday to Sunday).

Premises to remain open to the public from 09:00am until 11:30pm (Monday to Sunday).

### 2. Recommendation:

To consider the representations that have been made and to determine the application.

# 3. Brief Summary of Report:

An application for a Premises Licence was received on 27<sup>th</sup> January 2022 in respect of Pints N Plates, 142 Garretts Green Lane, Birmingham, B26 2JN.

Representations have been received from other persons.

# 4. Compliance Issues:

# 4.1 Consistency with relevant Council Policies, Plans or Strategies:

The report complies with the City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Council's Corporate Plan to improve the standard of all licensed persons, premises and vehicles in the City.

# 5. Relevant background/chronology of key events:

Durga Prasad applied on 27<sup>th</sup> January 2022 for the grant of a Premises Licence for Pints N Plates, 142 Garretts Green Lane, Birmingham, B26 2JN.

Representations have been received from other persons, See Appendices 1 & 2.

The application is attached at Appendix 3.

Conditions have been agreed with West Midlands Police and the applicant, which are attached at Appendix 4.

Site Location Plans at Appendix 5.

When carrying out its licensing functions, a licensing authority must have regard to Birmingham City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Guidance issued by the Secretary of State under s182 of the Licensing Act 2003. The Licensing Authority is also required to take such steps as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, which are:-

- a. The prevention of crime and disorder;
- b. Public safety;
- c. The prevention of public nuisance; and
- d. The protection of children from harm.

To whom it may concern,

### RE: Pints N Plates, 142 Garretts Green Lane, Birmingham, B26 2JN

I've recently been contacted by residents in Garretts Green and Sheldon with their concerns about the application for an alcohol license at the above address. I subsequently surveyed surrounding residents to ensure these concerns were representative.

The primary concern is that the proposed establishment is directly next door to a children's nursery, which I believe makes it unsuitable for the serving of alcohol, particularly as the application is for consumption on the premises seven days a week from 9am to 11pm.

Many of my constituents also pointed out that there are already plenty of licensed properties nearby, and that the approval of this application would negatively affect the character of the area. There are also concerns that this would lead to an increase in anti-social behaviour and disruption on what is predominantly a residential street.

57% of the residents who responded called for this application to be rejected outright, while a further 35% would only withdraw their objection if the operating hours were limited to the evening.

I would appreciate it if you would take these objections into consideration when deciding on the outcome of this application.

A Challenge 25 policy will be strictly followed by all staff.

Staffs are trained as appropriate in respect of relevant licensing law.

CCTV is installed covering inside and outside the premises.

# b) The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV will be recording at all times the premises are open for any licensable activities and images will be held for a minimum of 31 days and made available immediately on request by any of the Responsible Authorities.

The Premises License Holder will ensure that a trained member of staff will be on duty and be available to download the CCTV to any of the Responsible Authorities.

The Designated Premises Supervisor and their staff will at all times remain aware of their responsibilities for the prevention of crime and disorder on the premises and demonstrate a responsible attitude to the marketing and sale of alcohol Any person who appears drunk /aggressive will not be permitted on the premises.

If for any reason the CCTV hard drive needs to be replaced the previous / old hard drive will be kept on site for a minimum of 31 days and made immediately available to any of the responsible authorities on request.

The CCTV system will be checked prior to licensable activity taking place each day and the identity of the person checking the system will be recorded

All staff other than personal license holders will receive training in the Licencing Act 2003, and the Licencing objectives. No staff will work at the premises until this training has been completed and the required refreshments have been completed. Refresher training should take place every 6 months.

An Incident Book will be maintained at the premises and made available to any of the appropriate authorities on request. A Refusals Book will be maintained at the premises and all refusals to serve alcohol will be recorded in this book. It will be made available to any of the appropriate authorities on request.

The company will operate the Challenge 25 Policy. The only acceptable forms of identification will be a passport, photo driving license, military id card or PASS id card with the hologram logo,

#### c) Public safety

A fire alarm system will be installed to meet BS 5839 Part 1 current standards

An emergency lighting system will be installed to meet BS 5266 current standards

Firefighting equipment will be available in the premises to meet BS 5306 current standards

Floor staff will conduct physical sweep inside the premises to remove hazardous objects/waste as deemed necessary by the management.

The Designated Premises Supervisor is aware of his responsibilities to the staff and customers in respect of public safety and will take all reasonable steps to ensure the maintenance of all provided safety arrangements and equipment in accordance with the requirements of current installations.

### d) The prevention of public nuisance

All deliveries will be received during daytime prior to 7pm to control noise nuisance. In conjunctions with the steps proposed for the prevention of crime and disorder objectives, the Licensees and staff will at all times remain responsible for the prevention of public nuisance in and around the premises.

The Designated Premises Supervisor will arrange to monitor levels from both inside and outside the premises and remedial action will be taken as appropriate.

Doors and windows will be kept closed as deemed necessary by the Designated Premises Supervisor. An incident log will be maintained.

### e) The protection of children from harm

The Designated Premises Supervisor and staff will at all times remain aware of their responsibilities under the objective, including that alcohol shall not be sold to anyone under the age of 18.

Staff on duty will be trained and made aware of a challenge 25 policy and the requirements and the need to demand an acceptable form of age id.

No adult entertainment is permitted at these premises

The premises will operate Challenge 25 policy. Refusals register will be maintained.

# NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this in one of two ways: 1) by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the documents listed below (which do not need to be certified), or 2) by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

# Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the
  holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see
  note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport
  as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national
  of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the
  holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their
  stay in the UK.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay
  indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement
  indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in
  the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National
  Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in
  combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their
  name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
  official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
  Government agency or a previous employer.

- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
  work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
  licensable activity.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic
  Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or
  residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder
  with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not
  subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity
  when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance
  number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 18(3) or 20(2)
  of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2016, to a person who is not a national of a
  European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has
  derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK
  with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or
  reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration
  decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
  who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
  the UK including:-
  - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
  - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
  - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one
    of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
    - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
    - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
    - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
    - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

**Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities.** If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;

- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
  wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
  exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
  wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
  indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
  - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the
  audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains
  licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
  - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
  - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
  - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
  - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.



Upon assessment of this application and its ability to uphold the licensing objectives, I have some additional conditions/alternative wording to propose, to ensure the licensing objectives are promoted, please see below -

- 1. All staff employed at the premises involved in the sale/supply of alcohol will receive documented training of their responsibilities in accordance with the 2003 Licensing act prior to them selling alcohol.
