What data has been collected to facilitate the assessment of this policy/proposal? The Birmingham City Council Outdoor Event Organisers Guide (Edition 1 - 2016) references a 'voluntary ban' on the use of sky lanterns at all Council organised events or events that take place on council owned land.

> The Council's Outdoor Event Organisers Guide (Edition 1 -2016) references that the Council shares the views with, Marine Conservation society, Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (RSPCA), Tidy Britain Group and the National Farmers Union, that balloon releases should be given 'great consideration' by the event organiser given the evidence that the harm that they cause to wildlife and the aesthetic damage to the environment.

KIMO, the Local Authorities International Environmental Association has also called for a ban on balloon releases.

West Midlands Fire Service has publicly stated that it does not support the release of sky lanterns

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	and urges the public and event organisers not to use them.
	The Marine Conservation Society has published a position paper challenging the balloon industry's claims of latex biodegradability and citing numerous case studies of injury to marine life as a result of balloon ingestion. They have called for a blanket ban on both balloon releases and sky lantern releases.
