1. Purpose of report:

To permit Late Night Refreshment between 11:00pm – 12:00 Midnight (Sunday – Thursday), and 11:00pm – 02:00am (Friday – Saturday).

Other notable special days as per the application form.

Premises to remain open to the public from 08:00am until 12:00midnight (Sunday - Thursday) and 08:00am -02:00am (Friday and Saturday).

I have lived on this road for many years and over that period I have had to live with customers from the sacred heart club constantly leaving the premises at late hours of the night, making noise and disturbing the otherwise quiet road. Also waking myself and my three young children. We have also had to endure people Urinating in my garden, i have found drug paraphernalia, used condoms and many empty beer bottles and glasses. On one occasion when i asked a drunken man to stop urinating in my garden i was racially abused and threatened with violence. My wife and myself are currently receiving medical support for our stress and anxiety which is partly caused by the reasons stated above. We strongly ask that the Sacred Heart Club has their application for an alcohol license REFUSED. Therefore allowing us and the community we live in to move forwards with our lives without having to put up with the issues raised. Could you please reply to this email so i know my objection has been received and officially recognised.

- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
 work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
 licensable activity.

- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the
 holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to
 the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic
 Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or
 residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder
 with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not
 subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity
 when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance
 number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A
 (2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK
 with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or
 reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration
 decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
 who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
 the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and

 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the 0 entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.


