LAB 11, 26 OXFORD STREET, DIGBETH, BIRMINGHAM B5 5NR- LICENSING ACT 2003 AS AMENDED BY THE VIOLENT CRIME REDUCTION ACT 2006 - APPLICATION FOR EXPEDITED REVIEW OF PREMISES LICENCE: CONSIDERATION OF INTERIM STEPS

A certificate issued by West Midlands Police under Section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003, an application for Review of Licence, a copy of Premises Licence and Location maps were submitted:-

The following persons attended the meeting.

On behalf of West Midlands Police

PC Rohomon – West Midlands Police

On behalf of the Premises Licence Holder

Mr D Craig – Solicitor representing the Premises Licence Holder Mr W Power – Owner of Afta Dark Music Ltd, the Premises Licence Holder

The Chair made introductions and outlined the procedure to be followed.

David Kennedy, Licensing Section, made introductory comments relating to the documents submitted.

On behalf of West Midlands Police PC Rohomon made the following points:

- a) West Midlands Police had made an application for a review of the premises following an incident at the premises on the weekend of 1 and 2 September 2018.
- b) West Midlands Police were alerted to the incident by a 999 call from staff at City Hospital indicating that a 19 year old male had been transported in to the hospital by ambulance suffering from a cardiac arrest. The 999 operator indicated that the patient had come from Lab 11. At about the same time a call from the ambulance service confirmed that they were transporting a male from Lab 11 and querying whether it was a drugs overdose.
- c) The patient was confirmed deceased from a heart attack at 0346 hours on 2 September 2018. This was approximately 1 hour and 20 minutes after the initial calls to the ambulance service.
- d) It was emphasized that the premises had been very co-operative with the Police, supplying the CCTV as soon as asked without question. However the incident had taken place within the premises when the male had appeared to have taken an illegal substance, become ill and passed out. Security was notified and promptly took the victim to the medical room. The patient had deteriorated so quickly that he had to be carried to the room. CCTV suggests that CPR took place and a defibrillator was used.
- e) Early indications following information received from the victim's friend of 8 years, was that they had entered the premises at 2200 hours and the victim had been fine up to 0100 hours when he was last seen. The friend indicated that he had never known the victim to take drugs and there was no peer pressure to do so.
- f) Therefore initial inquiries were that the drug, believed to cocaine, was supplied within the club. It was noted that West Midlands Police were meeting the Premises Licence Holder at premises in the coming week to look at the CCTV and the premises' policies and procedures.
- g) The police were requesting that the licence be suspended as they could not be sure that the premises could be operated in a safe manner. It was acknowledged that the club would be voluntary closed the coming weekend.

Responding to questions from Members of the Sub-Committee PC Rohomon made the following points:-

- a) The premises operated on Friday and Saturday nights. Mr Power added that the premises held other nights for students on a weekly and monthly basis in the week.
- b) The premises had not had any incident similar to this previously and at the time of the incident the premises were not overcrowded and security were able to reach the victim without difficulty.

- c) West Midlands Police had established through evidence gathered so far that the victim was fine early in the evening but was seen to have a totally different personality when found having a possible fit. His friend had been contacted by the Police and they had not been aware he had passed away and the information given about the victim was, in PC Rohomon's experience, genuine. West Midlands Police were confident that the drug was taken inside the premises.
- d) When all the CCTV has been reviewed the police would be able to assess the level of searching done on entry to the premises. A toxicology report would be undertaken which would hopefully identify the drug taken and how it was administered. In addition it would indicate the strength of the drug.

In response to a question from the chair, Mr Kennedy explained that the licence had been held since 2014 and during that time there had been no drug related reviews although the premises had been the subject of a review for another issue.

Mr Craig presented the case on behalf of the Premises Licence Holder and made the following points:-

- a) The Premises Licence Holder had no objections to the suspension of the licence and was fully co-operating with the police as they were keen to establish what had happened.
- b) A meeting had been arranged between the Premises Licence Holder and West Midlands Police next Tuesday where a full review of the CCTV would be undertaken to establish what happened.
- c) Whilst the results of the toxicology report were awaited the premises were unsure as to what action could be taken, although a review of the security arrangement at the premises would be undertaken and whether the same promoter would be used again.
- d) It was confirmed that a new licence was obtained in 2014 to allow an extension to the licensed area rather than seeking a variation to the existing licence.
- e) The premises would not operate for two weekends and it was noted that all at the premises were deeply affected by the incident and would ensure a similar situation did not happen again.
- f) It was noted that there had been previous issues from time to time associated with operating a premises such as this but none relating to drugs. The premises were operated in a positive manner.

Responding to questions from Members of the Sub-Committee, Mr Craig and Mr Power made the following points:-

- a) An external promoter was being used for the event on 2 September 2018 and the normal procedures were followed. There was nothing unusual with the cliental attending the event which was similar to other events. Appropriate staffing was in place with medical people. Safety precautions had been in place. Staff had acted quickly to the incident and did all they could. Along with the door supervisors a member of the security team moved through the premises and all members of the team were in radio contact
- b) Identity checks were undertaken with a second pat down search and bag search. There was a no re-entry policy. A drugs dog had not been used but had in the past.
- c) The premises believed that the incident was an isolated case. It was clear from the CCTV footage that the victim's behavior was unusual both mentally and physically. People who tried to gain entry under the influence of alcohol were not allowed to enter the premises.
- d) It was acknowledged that there was a possibility the drugs being in the premises or brought in to the premises given that the victim entered the premises at approximately 0943 hours and at 0126 hours staff were alerted to the victim's behavior.

PC Rohomon and Mr Craig indicated that they did not wish to sum up.

At 1318 hours the Sub-Committee adjourned and the Chairman requested that all present, with the exception of the Members, the Committee Lawyer and the Committee Manager withdraw from the meeting.

At 1340 hours all parties were recalled to the meeting and the decision of the Sub-Committee was announced as follows:-

1/060918 **RESOLVED**:-

That having considered the application made and certificate issued by West Midlands Police under Section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003 for an expedited review of the premises licence held by Afta Dark Music Ltd in respect of Lab 11, 26 Oxford Street, Digbeth, Birmingham, B5 5NR this Sub-Committee determines:

 That the licence be <u>suspended pending a review of the licence</u>, such a review to be held within 28 days of receiving the Chief Officer of Police's application

The Sub-Committee's reasons for imposing this interim step is due to concerns expressed by West Midlands Police in relation to matters which came to light at the premises during the weekend of 2nd September 2018, as outlined in the Chief Officer of Police's certificate and application.

West Midlands Police stated that there had been a fatality of a patron aged 19 years, during the weekend of the 2nd September. At this early stage, it was suspected that the death was likely to have been caused by a drug overdose.

The Sub Committee determined the causes of the serious crime appeared at this stage to originate from either patrons of the premises, or deficient security measures (perhaps at the door), and/or the inability of management to uphold the licensing objectives.

It was the recommendation of the Police that the interim step of suspension should be imposed. The premises licence holder stated that this was not resisted.

The Sub-Committee therefore considered it necessary and reasonable to impose the interim step of suspension to address the immediate problems with the premises, in particular the likelihood of serious crime, and to promote the prevention of crime and disorder objective in the Act.

The Sub Committee noted that West Midlands Police had found the premises to be cooperative and helpful thus far.

In reaching this decision, the Sub-Committee has given due consideration to the City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, the Guidance issued by the Home Office in relation to expedited and summary licence reviews, and the submissions made by the police and the premises licence holder at the hearing.

All parties are advised that the premises licence holder may make representations against the interim steps taken by the Licensing Authority. On receipt of such representations, the Licensing Authority must hold a hearing within 48 hours.

All parties are advised that there is no right of appeal to a Magistrates' Court against the Licensing Authority's decision at this stage.

1. Purpose of report:

Dear Licensing,

West Midlands police have reviewed the application for the above premises and wish to lodge an objection to the granting of this application on the prevention of crime & disorder and public nuisance licensing objectives.

The applicant and has very recently had a very similar application heard in front of the licensing committee which was refused, an extract from their decision is detailed below.

The Sub-Committee gave consideration to whether any measures could be taken to ensure that the licensing objectives were adequately promoted and that therefore the licence might be granted; however Members considered that neither modifying the conditions of the licence nor excluding any of the licensable activities from the scope of the licence would mitigate the concerns raised by those making representations.

This area is still a significant concern to West Midlands Police due the amount of alcohol fuelled crime and alcohol fuelled anti-social behaviour which has not diminished since the last application, despite the continual and on-going efforts of the local neighbourhood policing team. The area is complex with many vulnerable residents living near to the premises with either addiction problems, mental health issues or both. It is the view of West Midlands Police that the demand and threat through alcohol related crime and ASB is significant. Another premises is likely to add to these problems / issues and as such whatever that is proposed will be insufficient to meet both the concerns and real life issues identified by West Midlands Police.

I am instructed on behalf of ______ i of . ____ Lozells Road, Birmingham B19 1RJ to object to the grant of a premises licence by The Minimarket on the grounds of crime and disorder.

This application is being made in a difficult area where there are already serious alcohol related problems and we have concerns that this applicant will not promote the licensing objectives.

On the 6th August 2018 the Licensing Sub-Committee refused to grant a premises licence for 235-237 Lozells Road to this applicant due to the concerns expressed by West Midlands Police regarding the applicants proposed management of the premises. The sub-committee were not convinced that the applicant, or his operation, could promote the licensing objectives. Furthermore the sub-committee were not convinced that the applicant fully understood the specific problems facing an alcohol retailer in the Lozells Road area. Members considered that modifying the conditions of the licence would not mitigate the concerns held. This new application seeks only to modify the previous application and should be refused on the grounds of crime and disorder.

a) General - all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 9)

This premises will be professionally supervised at all times by the PLH/DPS, ensuring that the four licensing objectives are fully adhered to.

Staff training will be both comprehensive and reviewed on a regular basis {at least twice per year}, with records being retained at the premises and made available for inspection by all Responsible Authorities at reasonable notice. An appropriate trainer for all staff will deliver the training prior to the premises opening for the sale of alcohol, after which all new members of staff will receive training within 1 month of commencing employment.

The Premises Licence Holder will use a refusals log and incident book, which will be inspected and signed off on a regular basis by the PLH/DPS.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that the CCTV is installed and the WM Police will be given full access to any recorded images. The Licence Holder shall ensure that the CCTV is fitted correctly and that images will be held up to 31 days; these images will be made available upon request to any responsible authority.

The premises licence holder shall ensure the CCTV system is recording whenever the premises is open for licensable activities. CCTV will be used to show the external area of the premises, monitoring proxy attempts for sales.

A refusals log and incident book are to be kept at the premises and completed on any occasion deemed necessary by the PLH/DPS, this will be made available to all Responsible Authorities on request.

A 'Till prompt" {electronic or otherwise} will be used for all sales of alcohol.

All previous Premises Licence Holders of the premises are not to be permitted entry to the premises, or to be involved in any way with the management of the premises.

All VAT receipts for the purchase of alcohol and tobacco are to be retained on file at the premises, and made available for any responsible authority to inspect at reasonable notice.

Signage will be prominently displayed at the premises stating: All customers are kindly requested to leave the premises quietly and show consideration to our neighbours.

Disorderly conduct or aggressive behaviour will not be tolerated.

c) Public safety

In accordance with the Licensing Act 2003, any person who appears drunk or heavily under the influence of alcohol will not be served.

The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that all entrances, exits & passageways remain clear of debris or furniture, for ease of exiting the premises in the case of an emergency.

Staffing will always be a minimum of three staff after 2100 hours and consideration will be given to sending staff on a personal licence holders course after their satisfactory probation period of three months, .

d) The prevention of public nuisance

The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that sufficient signage is displayed requesting customers to have regard for residents when leaving the premises.

The PLH will ensure that staff carry out regular litter picks to the frontage of the property, to ensure all litter/debris is removed.

No single can/bottle sales of beer or cider and no sales of high strength "white cider" products over 6% alcohol by volume.

e) The protection of children from harm

premises supervisor, if applicable.

A "challenge 25" policy will be used for age verification, meaning any person who appears to be under 25 will be asked for approved proof of age when attempting to purchase alcohol.

No alcohol will be on display within the frontage of the premises {to the street}; all alcohol will be displayed within eyesight of the staff serving from the counter.

Staff will be diligent in observing those who attempt to make proxy purchases on behalf of underage persons and alert the DPS should this occur.

Non-alcoholic drinks and confectionary are to be sighted away from the alcohol display areas.


