1. Purpose of report:

To consider relevant representations that have been made in respect of an application for a Premises Licence which seeks to permit the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption both on and off the premises) to operate from 10:00am until 12:00midnight (Monday to Sunday).

The nature of this application is of great concern to me as I feel it is not in the best interest of the local area. This area is a residential area, predominantly populated by families and senior citizens and this application is more in keeping with a city centre night time destination.

I feel that the Digby pub has made no effort to attract local residents, and that this application will further ostracize the local residents, thus relying on customers commuting to and from the pub increasing the risk of accidents related to drink driving.

The current licensing agreement allows for extended drinking on bank holidays, this results in excessive noise long after last orders, with customer remaining at the premises for up to 2 hours after the licensing agreement creating excess noise.

The application for the allowance of recorded music to be played at this venue is questionable as the venue sporadically hosts "disco" style evenings within it's current licensing. These evenings cause great distress to my family and I as the music can be clearly heard from my child's bedroom as we try to settle him for the night. Again the nature of this activity is not in keeping with the local area and therefore forms part of my representation.

As the licence is a replication of the current licence hours and activities, we do not consider further steps will be required to promote the licensing objectives however the operating schedule is outdated and includes obsolete conditions and therefore a new operating schedule is proposed and is set out below which we feel is appropriate and proportionate to promote the licensing objectives.

We also note Stonegate Pub Company Ltd is a well experienced licensed operator with nearly 700 site across the country, and have in place an extensive licensing manual detailing both company policies, appropriate across the whole estate, along with procedures in place at a local level to ensure the premises operates to the highest standard and promote the licensing objectives. These include policies regarding social responsibility and underage sales, which promote responsible drinking and discourage drunkeness, as well as procedures to prevent crime and disorder, and public nuisance. The robust policies and procedures that are in place will continue to operate, if the application is granted.

Considering the above, we believe the New Premises licence application will not undermine the licensing objectives. The applicant believes that the measures in place, will ensure the premises continue to promote the licensing objectives and the measures are adequate and further conditions are not appropriate.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- 1. A CCTV system shall be installed at the premises and maintained in good working order and used at all times when the premises are open for licensable activities.
