

Present: Councillors Robert Alden, Bob Beauchamp and Gareth Moore Officer Lesley Bannister – Community Governance Manager There were approximately 15 residents in attendance.

Election of a Ward Chairman – Councillor Alden was elected by his fellow Councillors as Ward Chairman for 2016/17.

Local News from Councillors

- Councillor Alden updated the forum on local planning issues including the Central square development and recent planning applications.
- Councillors Moore and Beauchamp declared that they were both members of the Planning Committee and therefore would not be taking part in any discussion on planning matters
- Councillor Alden introduced the Ward Litter Plans. The assembled group were asked to comment on and give suggestion for the following three questions:-
 - What were the top five issues for cleaner streets
 - Five suggestion for improved recycling and
 - What support do local businesses want?
- Councillor Alden introduced plans for a proposed pedestrian refuse and road marking at Moor End Lane and Spring Lane. The scheme was discussed at length by Councillors and residents, and the following concerns were raised :
- 1. Residents felt that motorists do not slow down for the crossing so they didn't believe they would slow down for road marking.



- 2. Some residents requested traffic lights Cllr Alden said that wasn't possible on the grounds of suitability and cost.
- 3. Residents were very concerned with the illegal parking by parents in the whole area of St Barnabas School.

At the end of the discussion it was agreed to move to formal consultation.

Resident's issues and concerns

- The junction of Tyburn Road and Kingsbury Road by the Lidl store. Residents complained that motorists were making illegal turns at this junction and suggested that the junction needed more road markings.
- Residents raised concerns over anti-social behaviour on Erdington High Street which the residents felt was alcohol related. Councillors gave the group an update on the public space protection order and on the current licensing issues and policies.
- Residents and councillors discussed the Boundary Commissions response to the issues raised at the last Ward meeting, some of which had been addressed to the Ward's satisfaction. The assembled group agreed they wanted the Commission to consider further proposals, and following a vote, agreed a further motion to the Commission which was to be actioned on their behalf by the Community Governance Manager.
