## 1. Purpose of report:

To consider relevant representations that have been made in respect of an application for a Premises Licence which seeks to permit the Sale of Alcohol (for consumption on the premises) to operate from 12:00midday until 02:00am (Sunday to Friday) and 12:00midday until 03:00am (Saturday).

To permit the provision of Regulated Entertainment consisting of live music, performances of dance and anything of a similar description, to operate indoors only, from 12:00midday until 02:00am (Sunday to Friday) and 12:00midday until 03:00am (Saturday).

To permit the provision of Late Night Refreshment to operate from 11:00pm until 02:00am (Sunday to Friday) and 11:00pm until 03:00am (Saturday).

Premises to remain open to the public from 12:00midday until 02:00am (Sunday to Friday) and 12:00midday until 03:00am (Saturday).

### 2. Recommendation:

To consider the representations that have been made and to determine the application.

### 3. Brief Summary of Report:

An application for a Premises Licence was received on 30<sup>th</sup> October 2017 in respect of Selam East Africa Restaurant, 136 – 150 Soho Hill, Birmingham, B19 1AF.

Representations have been received from two responsible authorities.

## 4. Compliance Issues:

### 4.1 Consistency with relevant Council Policies, Plans or Strategies:

## 5. Relevant background/chronology of key events:

Teklebrhan Hadgu applied on 30<sup>th</sup> October 2017 for the grant of a Premises Licence for Selam East Africa Restaurant, 136 – 150 Soho Hill, Birmingham, B19 1AF.

Representations have been received from West Midlands Police and Environmental Health, as responsible authorities, which are attached at Appendices 1 - 2.

My representation concerns the likely effect of the grant of the licence on the promotion of the following licensing objective

(c) the prevention of public nuisance

#### **Prevention of Public Nuisance**

I have met with the applicant and visited the premises to carry out an assessment and I have some concerns that the application does not reflect the proposed use of the premises. In particular:-

- a) The premises have a planning consent for a restaurant with a limit to the opening hours of 07.00 23.30 not until 03.00 on Saturday as proposed in the application
- b) The application is for includes live music but not recorded music
- the applicant has advised that the only live music will be non-amplified but the application clearly identifies live amplified music
- d) the application requests late night refreshment however the red line on the application excludes the kitchen
- e) the plan attached to the application is not as the applicant is proposing to operate the premises – the area shown as the kitchen and excluded from the red line area is actually proposed as part of the premises used for licensable activity and the kitchen is elsewhere in the building
- f) the application requests regulated entertainment until 02.00/03.00 but in section 17 it is proposed to close the premises at 00.00 on Monday and Tuesday.

The premises has been subject to noise complaints in 2017 both about entertainment noise breakout and noise from patrons outside the premises related to activities similar to those proposed in the application. In respect of the proposed entertainment use I am concerned that there are no steps proposed in section 18 of the application under the heading of the prevention of public nuisance that relate to managing the impact of noise from the premises. Having carried out a site inspection the premises are currently not suitable for the type of use proposed without further work. The absence of any external area for smoking other than the frontage on Soho Hill for smoking poses a significant risk of noise impact from patrons using the premises.

I am concerned that the grant of the licence would potentially result in noise nuisance to neighbouring properties due to noise breakout from the building arising from performance of music and the use of the external areas in conjunction with the licensed activity. There is also the risk of noise and odour from the cooking of food affecting the locality given the current arrangements. This concern is based on the previous site history of noise complaints, the type of event proposed, the absence of any effective operating conditions, the building design and structure, the existing noise environment and the proximity of noise sensitive receptors.

Whilst I believe that this concern can ultimately be dealt with by the use of appropriate conditions I am concerned that given the previous experience of site management and the complaints relating to the premises, the required controls may not be applied before the licensable activity commences and this may lead to nuisance. I am also concerned that the application does not adequately address the proposed premises use as outlined in a) to f) above. I have discussed these concerns and proposed conditions with the applicant.

Given the concerns outlined above and the fact that many of the proposed conditions below require further works to be carried out before the operations commence I would recommend refusal of the application until further details and clarification of the application is provided. Committee should consider any information provided at the Hearing which addresses these concerns. An Officer from Environmental Health will be present to advise further should such be provided.

If however, contrary to my recommendation, the licence is granted the condition(s) I suggest to mitigate this concern are listed as C1 to C11 below.

#### Recommended Conditions

- C1 An assessment of the building design and structure and a proposed scheme of noise insulation and attenuation shall be produced by a suitably qualified and experienced noise consultant. This scheme shall be submitted in writing to the Environmental Protection Unit of Birmingham City Council and no regulated entertainment involving amplified music shall take place until the mitigation measures that have been approved in writing by the Environmental Protection Unit of Birmingham City Council have been implemented. The noise mitigation measures shall be thereafter maintained.
- C2 To avoid nuisance being caused to neighbours the DPS, or other nominated person/staff, shall monitor the external areas of the Premises after 23:00 hours, including the smoking area and frontage onto Soho Hill. If necessary, they shall remind customers to be respectful of neighbours and where necessary they shall limit the number of customers going outside to use the smoking area and take appropriate steps to avoid customers who use the car park area or frontage of the premises causing a nuisance.
- C3 All external doors and windows shall be kept closed during regulated entertainment except as necessary for safe and effective access and egress.
- C4 Prior to any regulated entertainment involving amplified music taking place, a Noise Limiting Device (NLD) of a type approved by the Environmental Protection Unit of Birmingham City Council shall be fitted to the serve any area of the premises used for amplified music or sound. The NLD shall be set at a level agreed with the Environmental Protection Section to ensure that the volume of music is controlled to avoid noise nuisance to the occupiers of nearby buildings. The installation of the NLD shall be notified to the Environmental Protection Section prior to use and shall meet the following criteria:
- a) The device shall be fitted in an approved position by a competent person and once fitted shall not be moved from the approved position or tampered with in any manner unless prior approval is given,
- b) The device shall be capable of either:-
  - i) cutting off the mains power to the amplification equipment if the volume exceeds the pre-set level determined by the Environmental Protection Unit and shall not restore power to the amplification equipment until the NLD is reset by the DPS or their nominated person, or

- ii) otherwise maintaining the volume of the music at the pre-set level determined by the Environmental Protection Unit,
- c) where the NLD operates by cutting off the mains power to the amplification equipment, amplification equipment shall be operated through the sockets/power points linked to and controlled by the NLD at all times,
- d) The NLD shall be maintained in full working order and at the approved pre-set volume whilst the amplification equipment is operational,
- e) Any damage or malfunction to the NLD shall be reported to the Environmental Protection Unit as soon as possible and within 24 working hours of the damage occurring or malfunction being noted. The NLD shall not be used in this damaged or malfunctioning state until approval has been given by the Environmental Protection Unit.
- C5 Prior to any regulated entertainment involving amplified music taking place, the fire exit door to the premises shall be fitted with an audible alarm that sounds in a suitable location in the main bar area to warn staff that the doors have been opened when the building is in use. The DPS or their nominated person shall ensure that fire exit doors are only opened appropriately in an emergency and if the alarm activates shall immediately investigate and ensure the doors are closed as soon as possible.
- C6 The DPS shall, within 3 months of the date of issue of this licence, submit in writing a noise management plan to Environmental Protection Unit of Birmingham City Council. The noise management plan shall outline the measures to be adopted to reduce the noise impact of activities associated with the premises including music, deliveries, recycling and refuse collections, smoking areas, customers and car parks. The noise management plan shall be updated regularly and all staff shall be adequately trained in their role in implementing the plan.
- C7 No drinks shall be removed from the premises in open containers.
- C8 All sealed containers of alcoholic drinks offered for sale for consumption off the premises shall be clearly labelled or marked with the name and postcode of the premises.
- C9 No waste or recyclable material, including bottles, shall be moved, removed or placed in areas outside the premises building between the hours of 22.00 and 08.00.
- C10 The supply of late night refreshment shall not commence until details of the extract ventilation and odour control equipment, including details of any noise levels, noise control

and external ducting has been submitted to and approved in writing by the Environmental Protection Unit of Birmingham City Council. The installation and operation of the extract ventilation and odour control systems shall be in accordance with the approved details and thereafter maintained.

C11 – Patrons shall not remove from the premises late night refreshment provided at the premises.

In light of the matters set out above I object to the licence being granted unless suitable information is provided to demonstrate that the concerns will be satisfactorily addressed.

All alcohol and tobacco products sold at the premises shall have the relevant UK duty paid.

☑ Foreign tobacco, which does not comply with relevant UK legislation, shall not be stored and/or sold at the premise.
 ☑ Invoices, or copies of invoices, for all alcohol and tobacco purchases for the sale at the premises, will be retained and kept at the premises, and made available to officers from Trading Standards, the Police or HMRC, upon request

A stock control system will be maintained, to enable the licensee and designated premises supervisor to quickly identify where and when alcoholic and tobacco product have been purchased

An ultra-violet light will be available at the premises and will be used for the purpose of checking the UK Duty Stamps on spirits as soon as practicable after purchase

☑ If any spirits purchased for or on behalf of the business have UK Duty Stamps that do not fluoresce under ultra-violet light, or are otherwise suspicious, the licensee and/or designated premises supervisor shall notify the supplier to Staffordshire County Council Trading Standards and HMRC as soon as possible.

☑ If any tobacco products purchased for or on behalf of the business does not have UK Duty Paid fiscal mark or are otherwise suspicious, the licensee and/or designated premises supervisor shall notify the supplier to Staffordshire County Council Trading Standards and HMRC as soon as possible.

### b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- 1. The CCTV system must be installed and operate internally to cover all areas that licensable activities take place and where alcohol is displayed within any public area.
- 2. The CCTV unit shall be positioned in a secure part of the licensed premise. Access to the system should be allowed immediately to the Police upon request.
- 3. A competent trained person in the use of and operation of the CCTV will be in attendance at the premises at all times that licensable activities take place and be able to fully operate the CCTV system to be able to down load in a recognised format any information requested by the Police.
- The CCTV system clock should be set correctly and maintained (taking account of GMT and BST).
- 5. A facility will be available for the Police to remove from the CCTV system a copy of any material relevant to any ongoing Police investigation.
- 6. All CCTV images will be retained for a period of not less than 31 day
- 7. An incident register of all occurrences and ejections from the premises will be maintained at the premises and all details of public order offences will be recorded.
- 8. All persons involved in the sale of alcohol will receive initial and subsequent 6 monthly refresher training by the Designated Premises Supervisor or an appropriately accredited training provider with regards to the law in relation to the sale of alcohol. This will be recorded in a staff training register and will include, signature of the member of staff, the DPS or an appropriately accredited training provider together with the date.
- 9. At any time when there is no Personal License holder on the premises there must be at least one member of staff on duty inside the premise who has been authorised by the DPS. Any such person should have seen, read and be fully aware of the conditions of the premise licence and take all steps to ensure that such conditions are adhered to whilst they have responsibility for the premise.
- 10. A record should be kept detailing, the name and address relative to the person left in charge of the premise and the times and dates when the authority to cover exists, in writing.
- 11. These should be individual entries covering short periods of time only and should not exceed more than a three week period.

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12. The authorised person should also sign on each occasion that he/she has physically seen inspected and is fully aware of all the conditions attached to the premise licence. The DPS should sign to acknowledge that they agree to the authorised person being in charge of the premise for any times specified. The records of these matters should be kept fully updated at all times.

All Records shall be retained at the premises for a period of no less than 12 months and made available to responsible authorities on request.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

☑ A Chailenge 25 policy will be adopted in order to reduce the potential for underage sales of age restricted products including alcohol. If a customer appears to be under 25 years of age and cannot prove that they are eligible to purchase the age restricted item with a valid UK or Ireland Photocard Driving Licence, a valid Passport or PASS accredited proof of age scheme card, they will be refused service.

☑ Chailenge 25 posters will be displayed at the premises to reinforce this policy. Posters will be placed at; each till, each area alcohol is stocked and at the point of entry into the store. The posters will be displayed prominently and in sight of customers and staff.

☑ A Refusals Register is to be used to record all incidents when a sale is refused. The register is to be kept in the store at all times unless it is requested by authorised officers of responsible authorities. The Refusal/Challenge Register is to be checked and signed off by the Designated Premises Supervisor every two weeks.

☑ All staff working at the premises involved in the sale of age restricted products including alcohol will receive on-going training and will be refreshed at least every 6 months. This will be recorded in a staff training register and will also include a written test of knowledge. The Training records must be made available to authorised officers of responsible authorities on request. Records shall be retained at the premises.

NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the following documents (which do not need to be certified).

### Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport
  as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay
  indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement
  indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in
  the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National
  Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A full birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK which includes the name(s) of at least one of the holder's
  parents or adoptive parents, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's
  permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in
  combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their
  name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
  official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
  Government agency or a previous employer.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
  work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
  licensable activity.

- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A current Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic
  Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or
  residence.
- A current immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder
  with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not
  subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity
  when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National insurance
  number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 17(3) or 18A
   (2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2006, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
  who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
  the UK including:-
  - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
  - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
  - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
  - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
  - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
  - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
  - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

**Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities.** If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature:
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

#### NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

in terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
  wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
  exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
  wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
  indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music; no licence permission is required for:
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
  - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
  - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
  - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
  - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.







On the 4<sup>th</sup> July 2017 West Midlands Police received an application for a premises licence at the Selam Restaurant at 152-154 Soho Hill, Hockley, Birmingham, B19 1AF. The applicant was from Mr Esayas Tesfay. I had concerns about the grant of this licence due to hours requested, the disorders that had taken place during unlicensed activity and also do to the applicant not having the right to work in the United Kingdom. I made representation to this licence and the application was refused. (Appendix - 3 refers).

On the 30<sup>th</sup> October 2017 West Midlands Police received another application for a premises licence for the Selam Restaurant, 152-154 Soho Hill, Hockley, Birmingham, B19 1AF. This application was now being made by Mr Teklebrhan Hadgu who is the business partner of Mr Esayas Tesfay. Due to commitments I was able to assess the application until after the incident that would occur on the 5<sup>th</sup> November 2017 (explained in the next paragraph). After this incident the application raised concerned for West Midlands Police due to the location, the late times they were requesting, because of the unlicensed activities that had taken place, the disorders that had occurred and also because the applicant and his business partners disregard for promoting the licensing objectives due to unlicensed events which caused crime and disorder. Further enquiries by me also confirmed that the location was a former car sales showroom which had now been converted into a restaurant. Checking with Birmingham Council planning I found that the location had recently gone through an application to change the use, this was accepted however the opening times were restricted from 0700hrs to 2330hrs 7 days a week. This time restriction was due to the location of and its proximity to residential properties. Because of the concerns I have about the venue and the operator's representation has been made to this licence being granted. (Appendix - 4 refers).

On the 5<sup>th</sup> November 2017 between 0057hrs and 0507hrs police received 5 calls all about the Selam Restaurant all indicting that there was issues of disorder at the premises. The first call at 0057hrs was from a male stating that he had paid money for a concert but he was being refused entry. The second was at 0454hrs from an unknown person and the police operator could here disorder taking place in the background. This call was then matched with the third call at 0555hrs stating there was disorder at the restaurant. Reports stated there were 20 people fighting in the venue and bottles were being thrown. On police arrival they saw a male (believed to be related to the owner Mr Tesfay) extremely intoxicated, lay on the floor, he had sustained an injury and there was blood on his ear. Staff then informed officers that a Mr Tesfay was the owner and he could be contacted on a mobile number given. Officer's enquiries found that the disorder had been caused by drunken males being ejected from the club and were not happy as they had paid to get in. No complaints were made from any person. The next two calls were all relating to the same disorder informing police the location was under attack by 15 males and it was mayhem at the Salem Club and widows were being smashed. (Incidents ref - 5 to 9 refers).

As a result of the incident on the 5<sup>th</sup> November a male attended the police station on the 18<sup>th</sup> November stating that he had been assaulted by the doorstaff during the disorder at Selam Restaurant. The male stated he was punched in the face which caused him to fall back, hit his head on the ground causing bleeding from his ear. The male was taken to hospital by friends where it was discovered he had fractured his skull in two places. (Crime ref - 1 refers)

On the 6<sup>th</sup> November 2017 enquiries made me aware that a TEN had been submitted by Mr Tesfay for an event dated the 4<sup>th</sup> November to the 5<sup>th</sup> November 2017 from 2300hrs to 0500hrs but checking police systems I could not find this TEN being submitted to the police. I contacted Birmingham City Council Licensing and asked for the details of this application which they forwarded onto me and at the same time I emailed Mr Tesfay asking how he had served the application on the police. On examining the application and the information from Mr Tesfay I saw that the serving of the TEN on the Council and Environmental Health had been completed correctly however serving it on the Police were errors. Mr Tesfay had sent his application to bw-licensing@west-miland.pnn.police.uk instead of bw-licensing@west-midlands.pnn.police.uk. I again emailed Mr Tesfay informing him of the errors, the email he sent the application to did not exist and that his email account would have sent him an error to this effect. I also pointed out in the email that due to no submission of this application to the police he had again carried out unlicensed activity on the dates. Having had previous email correspondence with Mr Tesfay over the months, I know he has both the Birmingham Police licensing email and also my own police email addresses to serve the TEN. I believe it was his intention not to serve it correctly on the police and at the same time making other responsible authorities believe it had. As a result of the unlicensed events I am aware that Mr Tesfay has been interviewed by Birmingham City Council Licensing Enforcement Department where he has admitted carrying out these events for which he has received a caution. (Appendix ref – 5 refers).

On Thursday the 30<sup>th</sup> November 2016 Mr Tesfay, Mr Hadgu along with their licensing consultant Patrick Burke attended Police Headquarters for a discussion around the new application and the Issues the applicants and the Salem Restaurant has caused. Both Mr Tesfay and Mr Hadgu admitted they had carried out unlicensed activity over the months but they needed to do it as they had invested a great deal of money at the location and were not making a profit.

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Dealings with the location have seen various applications for premises licences and TENS either in the name of Mr Esayas Tesfay or Mr Teklebrhan Hadgu, However, Police Licensing can evidence that the applications are of a business interest to both as they have a financial interest in the venue. This evidence is through Companies House, a Facebook page and advertisements through internet searches. Over the past 12 months I am also aware that the have been issues from local residence where they have to endure noise from music and crime and disorder into the early hours. As a result of this, Birmingham Environmental Health is investigating the issues and has also made representation to the current application. Searches earlier this year on Facebook found the venue advertising they were open until 5am on Friday and Saturday nights and then until 2am other days. In November 2017 further searches have found the premises advertising its opening hours are from 12pm through until 3am daily. (Appendix ref - 6 refers). West Midlands Police have grave concerns with not only the Issue of a late night licence for any licensable activity at the premises but also the applicant and his business partner. There has been continuous unlicensed activity take place which has been admitted by the owners but they have continued to open, sell alcohol and live music which has resulted in serious crime and disorder. West midlands Police believe the owners of the Selam Restaurant have total disregard for any of the licensing objectives even though both hold a personal licence. They have put and will continue to put profit over public safety and if a licence is granted there will be further public nuisance, the public will be put at risk from crime and disorder and children may be put at harm. ## 1. Proposal

- 1.1. This application seeks a change of use to form a restaurant in Unit 3. The planning history of this site is complex and the existing lawful use of the premises has been disputed. The applicant describes it as having been a coffee shop (A1) and also a B8 use (storage and distribution), but has since agreed with my interpretation of the planning history explained further below.
- 1.2. The wider premises were historically used as a car showroom up until around 2004 when the premises were then changed to a furniture showroom use. An enforcement notice was served in respect of this use under ENF/1017/04/C which required the cessation of the use of the premises for retail purposes. The Notice was served on 21st December 2006 taking effect on 22nd January 2007. An enforcement notice appeal was lodged but returned invalid by PINS as the relevant fee was not paid. The appeal did not proceed and the notice remains on the register.
- 1.3. To date, the enforcement notice has not been enforced. The enforcement file indicates that on the basis of the retail use being reduced to 40% of the floorspace it was decided to not proceed with enforcing the notice. Nonetheless, there is no record of a planning application to regularise the unlawful use. The lawful use is therefore considered to be the car showroom use that proceeded this.
- 1.4. At some point, the building have been sub-divided into smaller units. Unit 1 currently comprises a furniture sales business trading as H.I Furniture factory. Unit 2 is a vacant shop which has been sub-divided, unit 3a is a shop selling baby related products. Unit 4 is the yard area to the side of the premises used for fitting tyres and associated storage. A car wash is also advertised as operating to the rear where units 5-7 are situated. The application premises are currently vacant with a shopfront and a roller shutter entrance.

Page 1 of 7

- 1.5. The submitted plans show the installed shopfront and roller shutters to the frontage. Internally the restaurant would be laid out to provide a total of 86 covers in a large dining area to the rear. The frontage of the restaurant would be a lobby area with a drinks service counter and a pool table. The building would also include a kitchen, storage/cold room, staff room, staff changing, management office and toilets. An external extraction system is proposed to be installed.
- 1.6. I therefore consider that a more accurate description would be the part change of use of car showroom to restaurant with associated alterations to the shopfront and roller shutter and installation of kitchen extraction equipment, and have assessed the application on this basis.
- 1.7. The submitted supporting statement sets out that the premises would propose to open to customers between the hours of 07:00-23:00 hours Mondays Sundays, including Bank Holidays. The development would propose to employ 8 staff.

## Site & Surroundings

- 2.1. The site is located within the Soho Road Neighbourhood Centre boundary as identified in the Shopping and Local Centres SPD, but is outside of the Primary Shopping Area. They are located within the Lozells and Soho Hill Conservation Area.
- 2.2. The premises comprise commercial premises that previously formed part of a car showroom that was later converted into a furniture showroom and then sub-divided into smaller retail units. The application premises are currently vacant.
- 2.3. The surrounding area includes a mix of uses that include shops, services, offices, education and residential uses. Soho House is situated approximately 200 metres to the west in Soho Avenue.

## Planning History

- 3.1. 10/05/2007 2007/01029/PA Change of use from furniture showroom to restaurant Refused. Although the application address relates to 134a-150 Soho Hill, the application red line plan relates to only part of the premises shown as unit 1 and part of unit 2 on the current application plans. The reasons for refusal were that the proposed development was out of centre for which no evidence had been provided to demonstrate that the development could not be located within Soho Road centre, and thereby fails to encourage linked trips and/or safeguard the retail vitality and viability of the existing local centre, contrary to retail policies in the UDP and PPS6, and that insufficient information to demonstrate the adequacy of parking had been provided.
- 16/01/2004 2003/04034/PA Change of use to retall warehouse withdrawn.
- 3.3. 16/01/2004 2003/05755/PA change of use to community centre withdrawn.
- 24/09/2007 2004/1017/ENF Use of former car showroom as a furniture retail
  warehouse Enforcement Notice served required cessation of retail use, however
  ultimately the case was closed.

 04/02/1988 – 10444010 – Erection of replacement car showroom alterations to existing elevations and boundary treatment. Approved subject to conditions.

### Consultation/PP Responses

- 4.1. Ward members, Residents Associations and neighbouring occupiers notified. 1 objection received from a neighbouring business on the following grounds:
  - Adverse effect on residents from noise and disturbance and anti-social behaviour
  - The site is currently in use without planning permission as a restaurant.
  - The external façade is out of character with the Lozells and Soho Hill Conservation Area with bright orange decoration and bright lighting in the windows
  - Parking levels are insufficient as there is only space on the forecourt for 4 cars, yet 86 covers are proposed. The City's car parking guidelines states there should be one space per 6 covers although clearly this level of parking cannot be achieved. The applicant has not provided any evidence to support their assertion that 85% of patronage will walk to the site and there is also no designated parking for staff.
  - The applicant's statement that there is parking available on street is not entirely accurate. Parking is restricted on the A41 in the vicinity of the site.
  - The development will adversely affect highway safety as the site offers no turning facilities for vehicles to exit. The site is currently split into 7 units and many of the users park vehicles on the footpath causing a danger to pedestrians and exiting vehicles.
  - The site is detrimental to other commercial properties in the area due to increase in parking on other frontages and security concerns.
  - The applicant has not resolved the issues raised with application 2007/01029/PA with regards to principle of the use in this location and the proposed level of parking.
  - It is our understanding that the site has never been granted consent for A1 or B8 uses as detailed in the applicants design and access statement. It was a car garage, with car repairs, car wash, tyre repair and storage and car spraying operating from units 4-7. As such, units 1-3 seem to be operating without any planning consent.
  - We consider that the sub-division and change of use has created parking
    issues that should be investigated further. The forecourt areas which should
    be used for parking cannot cope with the demand generated, the current
    occupiers are using the parking forecourt to display goods, and unit 2 is
    currently under redevelopment to split into 20+ smaller units which is likely to
    have a further detrimental effect.
- 4.2. Regulatory Services No objections. Comments that the details of proposed extraction are unacceptable as they show a 'chinese hat' type cowel on the extract system. The system should exhaust vertically with no obstruction. A condition is recommended to agree revised details. Also recommends a condition in respect of the proposed hours of use.
- 4.3. Transportation Development Raises concern regarding provision of sufficient parking. Advises that a maximum of 9 spaces should be provided in accordance with the car parking guidelines. Comments regarding existing parking restrictions in the locality. Comments that 2 of the forecourt parking spaces could not be accessed

without overriding the footpath. Considers that the levels of parking are deemed insufficient however the site is served with excellent public transport services. Recommends condition to prevent takeaway sales.

## Policy Context

 Adopted UDP (saved policies), BDP, Shopping and Local Centres SPD, A41 (Soho Road) Framework, Car Parking Guidelines SPD, NPPF.

## Planning Considerations

- 6.1. Policy PG3 of the BDP relates to place making where a positive sense of place through good design is expected. Policy TP21 relates to the network and hierarchy of centres including Soho Road Neighbourhood Centre. The vitality and viability of these centres will be maintained and enhanced. Proposals which make a positive contribution to the diversity of these centres will be encouraged. Policy TP24 further addresses the promotion of diversity of uses within centres. This states that diversity will be encouraged to meet peoples day to day needs, including restaurants, subject to the maintenance of the role of the Primary Shopping Areas as identified in the Shopping and Local Centres SPD.
- 6.2. Paragraphs 8.6 and 8.7 of the UDP are saved policies pending their replacement in the Planning Management DPD. This relates to hot food takeaways and restaurants/cafes. The policy sets out the criteria to be considered in considering such uses including that such uses should normally be confined to shopping or areas of mixed commercial development, the consideration of cumulative impacts on amenity and traffic generation, the impact of evening opening of the amenity of the areas particularly residents, the impact on the vitality and viability of the frontage, the availability of parking, accessibility to public transport and the likelihood of traffic hazards taking place.
- 6.3. The site is located within the boundary of Soho Road Neighbourhood Centre as defined in the Shopping and Local Centres SPD, and is situated outside of the Primary Shopping Area (PSA). As such, there is no policy basis in which to resist the proposed use on the grounds of the loss of the retail role and function in the PSA.
- 6.4. The A41 (Soho Road) Framework identifies the site as part of a wider block of properties between Villa Road and Hamstead Road as the primary development opportunity within the neighbourhood centre. The guidance explains that the site represents one of the few opportunities in the Conservation Area to intervene in a major positive manner to bring about regeneration. The prominent and sensitive location of this site necessitates a development of quality and distinctiveness with creation of a gateway development to Soho Road District Centre. A range of suitable uses are identified including Retail, leisure, residential, offices, health, education and community uses. Whilst the guidance promotes the wider redevelopment of the area, this does not prevent individual sites being developed and should be assessed on their merits.
- 6.5. The Council's car parking guidelines SPD provides guidance on appropriate levels of parking for certain uses, which are expressed as maximum levels. In this case, the site is located within Area 2 being within a centre where the guideline is for 1 car parking space per 9 covers.

- 6.6. The NPPF establishes the principle of the presumption in favour of sustainable development. Paragraph 14 states that for decision-making this means approving development proposals that accord with the development plan without delay. The NPPF provides guidance on ensuring the vitality of town centres which is consistent with the guidance in the BDP with regard to diversity. Restaurants are included within the definition of main town centre uses in the Annex.
- 6.7. The lawful use of the site is considered to be a car showroom use which ceased around 2004. Since then, there have been unauthorised retail uses on the site for which enforcement action was pursued but the case subsequently closed. Notwithstanding this, it is clear that the guidance subsequently adopted in the Shopping and Local Centres SPD, the A41 Framework and the BDP now establishes the site to be within the boundary of the Soho Road centre, and as such the use of the site for retail or for restaurant uses would now be considered to accord with these policies. This represents a significant change in circumstances to those at the time of the previous refusal when the site was located outside of the centre at that time. As such, I consider that the proposed use is acceptable in principle.
- 6.8. Whilst I note the concerns and objections raised by the neighbouring business, principally on traffic and parking grounds, I do not consider that there would be such a harmful impact that would warrant refusal in this case. The fall-back position is a car showroom for which there is no prescribed parking standard, although this use would have required parking for staff and visitors. A retail use would require a maximum of 13-18 spaces (depending on the type of retail use). In comparison to this, the proposed restaurant would generate a lower level of parking when measured against the Council's car parking guidelines. The maximum standard for a restaurant would generate a need for 10 car parking spaces.
- 6.9. The forecourt area in front of the premises has enough space for 3-4 cars, which I consider to be satisfactory taking into account the location of the site within an established centre well served by public transport. To access these spaces some alterations are required to the vehicle crossover which currently only serves 2 spaces and there is a street lighting column that restricts access to one of the spaces. I have recommended a condition to agree appropriate works. Whilst I note the concerns about sub-division causing excessive parking, this is not something that would require consent. Given the limited available parking, I recommend that the sale of food for consumption off the premises is prevented by condition as such activity tends to generate errant parking.
- 6.10. There are no other restaurants or other hot food uses in the locality to raise any issues of cumulative impact. I note the comments of Regulatory Services regarding the details of the extraction system and have recommended a condition to agree revised details. I concur that the proposed opening hours are acceptable in this location.
- 6.11. The Conservation officer advises that they have no objections. The premises do not currently make a positive contribution to the Conservation Area, having a functional appearance with modern cladding materials. The shopfront alterations have had negligible effect. The A41 Framework policy promotes the wider redevelopment of the area, which would present an opportunity to significantly enhance the character and appearance of the Conservation Area, but until then I do not consider that it would be appropriate to resist investment into the premises that will generate some economic activity and create local jobs.

#### Conclusion

7.1. The proposed development accords with the relevant policies in the BDP, Shopping and Local Centres SPD and the NPPF regarding the suitability of this location for a proposed restaurant use. Notwithstanding the objections raised, including the concerns regarding traffic and parking. I consider that this will be acceptable.

#### Recommendation

8.1. Approval subject to conditions.

Limits the hours of use
The premises shall only be open for customers between the hours of 07:00-23:30 hours Mondays-Sundays.

My representation concerns the likely effect of the grant of the licence on the promotion of the following licensing objective

(c) the prevention of public nuisance

#### Prevention of Public Nuisance

I have met with the applicant and visited the premises to carry out an assessment and I have some concerns that the application does not reflect the proposed use of the premises. In particular:-

- a) The premises have a planning consent for a restaurant with a limit to the opening hours of 07.00 – 23.30 not until 03.00 on Saturday as proposed in the application
- The application is for includes live music but not recorded music
- the applicant has advised that the only live music will be non-amplified but the application clearly identifies live amplified music
- d) the application requests late night refreshment however the red line on the application excludes the kitchen
- e) the plan attached to the application is not as the applicant is proposing to operate the premises – the area shown as the kitchen and excluded from the red line area is actually proposed as part of the premises used for licensable activity and the kitchen is elsewhere in the building
- the application requests regulated entertainment until 02.00/03.00 but in section 17 it is proposed to close the premises at 00.00 on Monday and Tuesday.

The premises has been subject to noise complaints in 2017 both about entertainment noise breakout and noise from patrons outside the premises related to activities similar to those proposed in the application. In respect of the proposed entertainment use I am concerned that there are no steps proposed in section 18 of the application under the heading of the prevention of public nuisance that relate to managing the impact of noise from the premises. Having carried out a site inspection the premises are currently not suitable for the type of use proposed without further work. The absence of any external area for smoking other than the frontage on Soho Hill for smoking poses a significant risk of noise impact from patrons using the premises.

I am concerned that the grant of the licence would potentially result in noise nuisance to neighbouring properties due to noise breakout from the building arising from performance of music and the use of the external areas in conjunction with the licensed activity. There is also the risk of noise and odour from the cooking of food affecting the locality given the current arrangements. This concern is based on the previous site history of noise complaints, the type of event proposed, the absence of any effective operating conditions, the building design and structure, the existing noise environment and the proximity of noise sensitive receptors.

Whilst I believe that this concern can ultimately be dealt with by the use of appropriate conditions I am concerned that given the previous experience of site management and the complaints relating to the premises, the required controls may not be applied before the licensable activity commences and this may lead to nuisance. I am also concerned that the application does not adequately address the proposed premises use as outlined in a) to f) above. I have discussed these concerns and proposed conditions with the applicant.

Given the concerns outlined above and the fact that many of the proposed conditions below require further works to be carried out before the operations commence I would recommend refusal of the application until further details and clarification of the application is provided. Committee should consider any information provided at the Hearing which addresses these concerns. An Officer from Environmental Health will be present to advise further should such be provided.

If however, contrary to my recommendation, the licence is granted the condition(s) I suggest to mitigate this concern are listed as C1 to C11 below.

### Recommended Conditions

- C1 An assessment of the building design and structure and a proposed scheme of noise insulation and attenuation shall be produced by a suitably qualified and experienced noise consultant. This scheme shall be submitted in writing to the Environmental Protection Unit of Birmingham City Council and no regulated entertainment involving amplified music shall take place until the mitigation measures that have been approved in writing by the Environmental Protection Unit of Birmingham City Council have been implemented. The noise mitigation measures shall be thereafter maintained.
- C2 To avoid nulsance being caused to neighbours the DPS, or other nominated person/staff, shall monitor the external areas of the Premises after 23:00 hours, including the smoking area and frontage onto Soho Hill. If necessary, they shall remind customers to be respectful of neighbours and where necessary they shall limit the number of customers going outside to use the smoking area and take appropriate steps to avoid customers who use the car park area or frontage of the premises causing a nuisance.
- C3 All external doors and windows shall be kept closed during regulated entertainment except as necessary for safe and effective access and egress.
- C4 Prior to any regulated entertainment involving amplified music taking place, a Noise Limiting Device (NLD) of a type approved by the Environmental Protection Unit of Birmingham City Council shall be fitted to the serve any area of the premises used for amplified music or sound. The NLD shall be set at a level agreed with the Environmental Protection Section to ensure that the volume of music is controlled to avoid noise nuisance to the occupiers of nearby buildings. The installation of the NLD shall be notified to the Environmental Protection Section prior to use and shall meet the following criteria:
- a) The device shall be fitted in an approved position by a competent person and once fitted shall not be moved from the approved position or tampered with in any manner unless prior approval is given,
- b) The device shall be capable of either:-
  - cutting off the mains power to the amplification equipment if the volume exceeds the
    pre-set level determined by the Environmental Protection Unit and shall not restore
    power to the amplification equipment until the NLD is reset by the DPS or their
    nominated person, or

- ii) otherwise maintaining the volume of the music at the pre-set level determined by the Environmental Protection Unit,
- c) where the NLD operates by cutting off the mains power to the amplification equipment, amplification equipment shall be operated through the sockets/power points linked to and controlled by the NLD at all times,
- d) The NLD shall be maintained in full working order and at the approved pre-set volume whilst the amplification equipment is operational,
- e) Any damage or malfunction to the NLD shall be reported to the Environmental Protection Unit as soon as possible and within 24 working hours of the damage occurring or malfunction being noted. The NLD shall not be used in this damaged or malfunctioning state until approval has been given by the Environmental Protection Unit.
- C5 Prior to any regulated entertainment involving amplified music taking place, the fire exit door to the premises shall be fitted with an audible alarm that sounds in a suitable location in the main bar area to warn staff that the doors have been opened when the building is in use. The DPS or their nominated person shall ensure that fire exit doors are only opened appropriately in an emergency and if the alarm activates shall immediately investigate and ensure the doors are closed as soon as possible.
- C6 The DPS shall, within 3 months of the date of issue of this licence, submit in writing a noise management plan to Environmental Protection Unit of Birmingham City Council. The noise management plan shall outline the measures to be adopted to reduce the noise impact of activities associated with the premises including music, deliveries, recycling and refuse collections, smoking areas, customers and car parks. The noise management plan shall be updated regularly and all staff shall be adequately trained in their role in implementing the plan.
- C7 No drinks shall be removed from the premises in open containers.
- C8 All sealed containers of alcoholic drinks offered for sale for consumption off the premises shall be clearly labelled or marked with the name and postcode of the premises.
- C9 No waste or recyclable material, including bottles, shall be moved, removed or placed in areas outside the premises building between the hours of 22.00 and 08.00.
- C10 The supply of late night refreshment shall not commence until details of the extract ventilation and odour control equipment, including details of any noise levels, noise control

and external ducting has been submitted to and approved in writing by the Environmental Protection Unit of Birmingham City Council. The installation and operation of the extract ventilation and odour control systems shall be in accordance with the approved details and thereafter maintained.

C11 – Patrons shall not remove from the premises late night refreshment provided at the premises.

In light of the matters set out above I object to the licence being granted unless suitable information is provided to demonstrate that the concerns will be satisfactorily addressed.
