Following the conclusion of the presentations, Cllr Choudhry and residents thanked the applicants for their attendance and presentation before they were asked to leave the meeting so that consideration could be given to the requests for funding and the voting process could take place.

Following the conclusion of the voting process, residents and Cllr Choudhry also thanked Claire Hardwick, Community Support & Development for facilitating the Celebrating Communities Fund part of the meeting.

WARD ISSUES

1. Councillor Updates
