Israyel has been a patient at Nottingham Children's Hospital since 2/11/2015 following an elective admission for corrective surgery of his scoliosis. This was completed in two stages. Following the first stage Israyel had to spend a long period on traction in bed which has resulted in a decrease in muscle bulk and activity tolerance. Israyel has been receiving occupational therapy and physiotherapy input for rehabilitation, and is now mobile short distances with a frame.

Israyel does not require a hospital bed as he is able to transfer in and out of bed independently and doesn't have a medical need for provision of a hospital bed. However, he would benefit from a bed and mattress that is firm and comfortable to enable him to move around easier in bed, due to the extensive spinal surgery he has had.
