2.4 Analysis on Initial Assessment

The Council's Waste Strategy 2017 - 2040 identifies the need to re-design and re-organise the public-facing household recycling centres. The current five sites were never designed to achieve high levels of recycling and reuse.

Three of the sites share access with other waste disposal activities operated by a third party contractor. Given the age of the sites, typically commissioned over 40 years ago, significant improvements can be to these sites to give an enhanced service to users.

The Council has recognised the need to upgrade the 5 HRCs and this will be included as a requirement of the forthcoming procurement of waste treatment and disposal services. Potential bidders will be required to submit proposals on how to achieve significantly higher levels of recycling, based on improving the customer experience, including improved traffic management, better signage and communications. Improving access generally and for residents with disabilities will be a key part of those submissions.

The tender evaluation process will also include relevant criteria to ensure that the on-going management of the five sites meets and exceeds minimum legislative requirements and Council policies on equalities.
